The trustees are pleased to present their report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2015.

Legal and administrative information is set out on page 1 and forms part of this report.

The financial statements comply with current statutory requirements, the Memorandum and Articles of Association and the Statement of Recommended Practice 2005 and are prepared in accordance with the 2011 Charities Act.

The charity ceased to operate on 31 March 2015.

ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The charity is administered by the Board of Trustees, who meet on a quarterly basis. The Memorandum and Articles of Association are the governing documents of the charity. The day to day operations of the charity are delegated to the Chief Executive Officer and staff team. The Chief Executive Officer currently serves as Company Secretary.

Recruitment and appointment of trustees

A.B.C.D. Cymru regularly review the skills and expertise of Board members, and recruit accordingly.

Objects and principal activities of the charity

The purpose of the charity is to work with communities and agencies to improve access to services for black and minority ethnic children and young people with disabilities and/or chronic illnesses.

According to A.B.C.D. Cymru's Memorandum of Association, the organisation's objects shall be to provide support and advocacy for children and young people with disabilities and chronic illnesses from minority ethnic communities and the families of such children and young people.

Main activities for the year

The charity has continued to develop and clarify its vision, mission, goals, structure, decision-making processes, activities, operational policies and internal systems during the year with a view to ensuring continuous improvement in all activities and services.

Trustees met quarterly during the year and business was conducted following agreed agendas which were circulated in advance along with reports and supporting documents. Minutes and follow-up reports were disseminated promptly after meetings to ensure efficient implementation of decisions.

The Chief Executive resigned in June 2014 following a period of sickness absence. The Board of Trustees subsequently oversaw the day to day running of the Charity, and staff maintained effective communication with the Board between meetings through email, postal correspondence and phone to ensure trustees were regularly informed of developments and consulted on relevant issues between Board meetings.

During the year, terms and conditions of employment, job specifications and remuneration and policies related to employment were reviewed and revised in line with good practice. Performance appraisals were conducted for staff and learning needs were identified, both of which informed the development of individual work programmes and learning and development plans.

The charity continued to review and update its business plan on an annual basis to take account of changes within the external environment and opportunities for extending its remit and furthering its objectives.

Internal policies and procedures were monitored during the year to ensure systems and processes for governance, employment and service delivery were in keeping with good practice and relevant legislation.

Investment powers

The trustees have used general funds of the charity by operating a bank reserve account where temporary funds are held until required.

Development, activities and achievements

The trustees consider the performance of the charity this year to be satisfactory given the funding restraints which the organisation works to.

Risk management and reserves policy

The trustees have continued to monitor major strategic, business and operational risks facing the charity. Systems are in place to assess risks with quarterly reports to the Trustee Board that enable them to take steps to lessen the risks. Trustees receive quarterly management accounts of income and expenditure to inform decision making. The trustees have in place a reserves policy which governs how funds will be set aside for contingencies.

At the beginning of the year it was apparent that the Charity would not receive sufficient funding going forward to be sustainable. As a consequence, the Trustees agreed to wind down the Charity using the reserves to continue until contingencies were identified for the supported families to enable the Charity to cease to operate.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The charity became a limited company with no share capital on 21 May 2007.

On 16 July 2008 a registered charity known as A.B.C.D. ceased trading and the assets and liabilities were transferred to this re-registered charity known as A.B.C.D. Cymru and commenced trading on 17 July 2008.

The operating performance of the charity is set out on pages 7 - 14.

The charity made a net deficit in the period of £65,963 (2014: deficit £30,091). This included paying grants to two charities who undertake work of a similar nature to the Charity. These amounted to £28,979. The unrestricted funds at the year end were £380 of which the designated closure provision fund was £nil. The restricted fund was £nil (2014: £2,824).

Future Developments

The Charity ceased to operate on 31 March 2015.

PUBLIC BENEFIT

We have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commissions' general guidance on public benefit when reviewing our aims and objectives and in planning our future activities. In particular, the trustees consider how planned activities will contribute to the aims and objectives they have set.

Direct work with families

A.B.C.D. Cymru supports the families of approximately 300+ black and minority ethnic disabled children and young people. One-to-one casework is undertaken by specialist development workers to sign-post families to services they require in relation to health, education, social services and other relevant services.

Consultations

A.B.C.D. Cymru have a specialist worker whose role is to respond to local and national consultation processes that affect the lives of the community we serve. We also run focus groups and provide relevant case studies to convey the experience and opinions of our service-users to relevant policy makers in the statutory sector

Specialist service for young people with learning disabilities

We have a dedicated worker who provides services for 14-25 year old young people with learning disabilities. These young people are supported and empowered to access education, training, and work experience, as well as other services relevant to them.

Training and consultancy

A.B.C.D. Cymru offer training and consultancy to agencies in the charitable and public sector on improving their engagement with black and minority ethnic communities, and to increase take-up of services by this group.

Partnership working

We have formed partnerships and worked closely with the following agencies: Welsh Assembly Government, Cardiff County Council, Mencap Cymru, SNAP Cymru, amongst others.

Play events and trips

A.B.C.D. Cymru staff provide access to relevant play and leisure opportunities for a group who report high levels of social exclusion and isolation. As well as linking them to play opportunities available locally through relevant play organisations, we also run specific events and trips for the families during the summer holidays, to empower them to gain confidence to access them independently in the future.

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILITIES

The trustees (who are also directors of A.B.C.D. Cymru for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements, and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

In so far as the trustees are aware:

- there is no relevant audit information of which the charitable company's auditors are unaware; and
- the trustees have taken all steps that they ought to have taken to make themselves aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the auditors are aware of that information.

The trustees are responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the corporate and financial information included on the charitable company's website. 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and with the Charities Statements of Recommended Practice 2005.

Cash flow statement

The company qualifies as a small company under the Companies Act 2006. The trustees have elected to take advantage of the exemption under FRS1 not to prepare a cashflow statement.

Going Concern

During the year a decision was made by the trustees for the charity to cease operations as at 31 March 2015. Therefore, in the opinion of the trustees the charity is not a going concern as at 31 March 2015.

Incoming resources:-

Donations and grants

Income from donations and grants is included in incoming resources when these are receivable, except as follows:

- When donors specify that donations and grants must be used in future accounting periods, the income is deferred until those periods.
- When donors impose conditions which have been fulfilled before the charity becomes entitled to use such income, the income is deferred and not included in incoming resources until the pre-conditions for use have been met.

Resources expended:-

Allocation of resources expended

Resources expended are allocated in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accruals basis inclusive of VAT which cannot be recovered.

Charitable activities

Charitable activity costs are allocated between direct charitable expenditure and support costs on accruals basis, inclusive of any VAT that cannot be recovered.

Governance costs

These include the costs of external scrutiny and costs associated with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Fixed assets

Fixed assets are recorded at cost and depreciated over its useful economic life.

Fund accounting

Funds held by the charity are either:

Unrestricted funds – these funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds – these are funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Liabilities

The financial statements are prepared on an accruals basis thus recognising all liabilities when the charity has committed itself to an expense or contractual obligation.
