REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 28 FEBRUARY 2022

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 28 February 2022. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The charity's principle objective as set out in its Memorandum of Association is to promote the benefit of the inhabitants of Altrincham and the neighbourhood and to promote environmental improvements by associating with the local authorities, voluntary organisations, and inhabitants in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupations, with the object of improving the conditions for the said inhabitants.

Significant activities

In planning activities for the year the trustees have kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

The Trustees have continued to invest more directly in the local area, primarily by funding and supporting G-Force to deliver activities, promote the work of the Oldfield Brow Partnership, and encourage local residents to become more involved in their community. There have been some signs that this approach is working, in that a small number of local residents regularly join Partnership meetings. The Trustees recognise the medium and longer term nature of our ambition for a fully engaged community, but are encouraged by the start.

FUTURE PLANS

SMCA's relationship with the Church on the Brow has shown signs of being fruitful. There has been a change of leadership at the Church, with those now in charge recognising that the Church needs to open itself up to wider community use, not least to help ensure its own survival as a place of worship. SMCA will continue to encourage and support this, either by directly funding improvements to the fabric of the building which will facilitate greater community use, or by providing start-up and/or continuing funding to new or existing groups so that they can establish themselves in the community.

An initiative that has arisen from discussions at the Oldfield Brow Partnership is the creation of a "Pocket Park" on land owned by Trafford MBC opposite the shops on Seamons Road. SMCA has agreed in principal to fully fund this and has already paid for ground clearance and tree reductions to help the vision become reality.

There have been on-going discussions with Friends of the Cow Field about how SMCA can support their ambition to make this important green space more attractive. These discussions will continue; however, the long-running shadow of a possible Trafford Housing Trust development on part of the land is limiting the scope of what we can achieve.

SMCA will step up its efforts to identify suitable individuals willing and able to become Trustees to guide our development into the future.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF SEAMONS MOSS COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Seamons Moss Community Association ('the Company')

I report to the charity trustees on my examination of the accounts of the Company for the year ended 28 February 2022.

Responsibilities and basis of report

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 28 FEBRUARY 2022

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
