NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS

FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2008

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007).

The directors have considered the position of the company. Whilst trade is difficult for it's clients, there are no indication that demand for their services is falling and that provisions required in the financial statements for the period ended 30 September 2008 will reoccur. On this basis, the directors consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis.

1.2 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for services net of VAT and trade discounts.

1.3 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Fixtures, fittings & equipment

25% straight line

Motor vehicles

25% straight line

1.4 Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at cost less provision for diminution in value.

1.5 Revenue recognition

Fee income represents revenue earned under a wide variety of contracts to provide consultancy services. Revenue is recognised as earned when, and to the extent that, the firm obtains the right to consideration in exchange for its performance under these contracts. It is measured at the fair value of the right to consideration, which represents amounts chargeable to clients, including expenses and disbursements but excluding value added tax.
