Charitable objects

- a) To help educate young people in the Clitheroe area through their leisure time activities so as to develop their physical, mental and spiritual capacities that they may grow to full maturity as individuals and members of society
- b) To establish, maintain and manage a youth resource venue in Clitheroe (Juice Bar) For the purpose of carrying out the above Object, but not otherwise, 4Youth shall have the following powers -
- (1) To develop and maintain a Young People's venue in the Clitheroe area in line with the wishes and needs of local young people
- (2) To provide access to a range of social activities and support services as recognized by local need
- (3) To promote healthy lifestyles including healthy eating, and promote the benefits of locally produced and organic foods
- (4) To actively recruit a team of volunteers and nurture their development within the organization including induction, training and regular support
- (5) To raise funds and to invite and receive contributions from any person or persons or organisations whatsoever by way of subscription, donation or otherwise
- (6) To take and accept gifts of property, whether subject to any special trust or not, for the Object of 4Youth

To undertake and execute any Charitable Trust

(7) To do all such things as are necessary for the attainment of the above Object

Organisational structure

The community group consists of three members who meet on a monthly basis Consisting of a Chairman, Secretary & Trustee

Review of activities and achievements

2007/2008 saw the eagerly anticipated opening of the Juice Bar to the young people of the Ribble Valley This was a monumentus occasion for all the young people, volunteers and staff who have worked so hard to renovate the juice bar over the last 2 years

Upon opening the Juice Bar became immediately popular with local young people seeing attendances of between 100 and 400 young people per day allowing us to extend our opening hours from 4 30pm to 6pm each evening

Due to the popularity of the Juice Bar more interior space was required and a group of young people worked over the xmas break to remove 2 partition walls to create more room for young people in the Juice Bar

As well as our regular daily opening times our work has expanded to include working in partnership with other agencies in the area

Working with Ribblesdale we have been running 2 projects working with young people at risk of exclusion from school and also to develop an IT facility at the Juice Bar

Working with Brook advisory we have been running a once weekly session with their peer educators providing relationship and sexual health advice to young people. This has proven extremely popular

Whilst encouraging young people to become more involved in the Juice Bar a number of young people have been involved in volunteering. One young person Chris Brownless has now become a paid member of staff and Saturday will be the first day the Juice Bar is fully staffed by young people.

Targets and Aspirations for 2008/2009

The next step is for the Juice Bar to increase the involvement of young people by implementing a specific volunteering project. We hope to recruit a further 30 young people over the next 12 months to begin to take control of the evening activities at the Juice Bar.

Over the next 12 months we would like to generate enough income to open 2 nights a week until 10pm. This would be dependant on either donation or till takings improving

We strive to increase our trading turnover to £40,000 over the 2008/2009 academic year. This will allow us to cover our overheads on the building and to pay for one full time member of staff.

1. Accounting policies

1.1. Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and follow the recommendations in 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' Statement of Recommended Practice' issued in October 2000

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in FRS1 from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement because it is a small charity

1.2. Incoming resources

Voluntary income is received by way of donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. Gifts donated for resale are included as income when they are sold. Donated assets are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified and a third party is bearing the cost. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

Grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, are recognised in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are receivable

Income from the charity shop is included in the year in which it is receivable

Income from investments is included in the year in which it is receivable

1.3. Resources expended

Resources expended are recognised in the year in which they are incurred

Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity and include project management

1.4. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows
