Review of activities and achievements

Throughout the year 4Youth (Clitheroe) has continued to run the successful 'Juice Bar' venue for young people on a 7 day a week basis. This has involved working with over 3000 young people the majority of which have made multiple visits over the year accessing a fun and supportive environment, learning new skills and accessing a range of support on issues such as housing, unemployment and volunteering

This year sees the completion of our V volunteering project. We are happy to report the project has been a huge success and has enabled the Juice Bar to develop opportunities for over 80 young volunteers over 2 years many of which completed 100 hours of volunteer time

4Youth has continued to support a young apprentice through his apprenticeship in catering and are pleased to announce that Robert has successfully completed his course this year and is now looking for full time work within the catering industry. We wish him all the best in the future

Over the year we have developed the opportunity for young people to use the Juice Bar for work experience, either through school or college or to gain experience to enter into employment. Over the year a total of 8 young people enjoyed time learning new skills working at the Juice Bar.

The future

The Juice Bar has enjoyed a successful year and hopes to improve availability of support to young people over the next year to cover more evenings and weekend hours, expanding the number of positions available to young volunteers

Over the coming year and with the changing national financial uncertainty we expect to see and manage the organisations transition through what is no doubt going to be a tough time for all members of the community

The Juice Bar will continue to play an essential and pivotal part in the day to day lives of young people in the Ribble Valley and will continue to support them to reach their full potential
