Memorandum of Association of Attitude is Everything

#### 1 NAME

The name of the Company is Attitude is Everything ("the Charity")

#### 2 REGISTERED OFFICE

The registered office of the Charity is to be in England and Wales

#### 3 OBJECTS

The objects of the Charity are

- To advance the education of the public in the subject of improving Deaf and disabled people's access to music, whether they be audience, staff or artists
- To relieve the needs of disabled people by working with the music industry to raise awareness of disability issues and remove physical and attitudinal barriers that may exist in the sector
- 3 3 The promotion of equality and diversity for the public benefit by
- 3 3 1 the elimination of discrimination on the grounds of race, gender, disability, sexual orientation or religion,
- advancing education and raising awareness in equality and diversity, in particular in relation to the issues that Deaf and disabled people face within the music industry,
- 3 3 3 promoting activities to foster understanding between people from the music industry and Deaf and disabled people from diverse backgrounds,
- 3 3 4 conducting or commissioning research on disability equality and diversity issues and publishing the results to the public,
- 3 3 5 cultivating a sentiment in favour of disability equality and diversity
- In the interests of social welfare to provide or assist in the provision of facilities for recreation or other leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life of Deaf and disabled people ("the Objects")

#### 4 POWERS

The Charity has the following powers, which may be exercised only in promoting the Objects

- 4 1 To promote or carry out research
- 4 2 To provide advice
- 4 3 To publish or distribute information
- 4 4 To co-operate with other bodies
- 4.5 To support, administer or set up other charities
- 4 6 To raise funds (but not by means of taxable trading)
- To borrow money and give security for loans (but only in accordance with the restrictions imposed by the Charities Act 1993)
- 4 8 To acquire or hire property of any kind
- To let or dispose of property of any kind (but only in accordance with the restrictions imposed by the Charities Act 1993)
- 4 10 To make grants or loans of money and to give guarantees
- 4 11 To set aside funds for special purposes or as reserves against future expenditure
- 4 12 To deposit or invest funds in any manner (but to invest only after obtaining advice from a financial expert and having regard to the suitability of investments and the need for diversification)
- 4 13 To delegate the management of investments to a financial expert, but only on terms that
- 4 13 1 the investment policy is set down in writing for the financial expert by the Trustees
- 4 13 2 every transaction is reported promptly to the Trustees
- 4 13 3 the performance of the investments is reviewed regularly with the Trustees
- 4 13 4 the Trustees are entitled to cancel the delegation arrangement at any time
- 4 13 5 the investment policy and the delegation arrangement are reviewed at least once a year
- 4 13 6 all payments due to the financial expert are on a scale or at a level which is agreed in advance and are notified promptly to the Trustees on receipt
- 4 13 7 the financial expert must not do anything outside the powers of the Trustees
- To arrange for investments or other property of the Charity to be held in the name of a nominee (being a corporate body registered or having an established place of business in England and Wales) under the control of the Trustees or of a financial expert acting under their instructions and to pay any reasonable fee required
- 4 15 To insure the property of the Charity against any foreseeable risk and take out other insurance

policies to protect the Charity when required

- To insure the Trustees against the costs of a successful defence to a criminal prosecution brought against them as charity trustees or against personal liability incurred in respect of any act or omission which is or is alleged to be a breach of trust or breach of duty, unless the Trustee concerned knew that, or was reckless whether, the act or omission was a breach of trust or breach of duty

- 4 18 To enter into contracts to provide services to or on behalf of other bodies
- 4 19 To establish subsidiary companies to assist or act as agents for the Charity
- 4 20 To pay the costs of forming the Charity
- 4 21 To do anything else within the law which promotes or helps to promote the Objects

#### 5 BENEFITS TO MEMBERS AND TRUSTEES

- The property and funds of the Charity must be used only for promoting the Objects and do not belong to the members of the Charity but
- 5 1 1 members who are not Trustees may be employed by or enter into contracts with the Charity and receive reasonable payment for goods or services supplied
- 5 1 2 members (including Trustees) may be paid interest at a reasonable rate on money lent to the Charity
- 5 1 3 members (including Trustees) may be paid a reasonable rent or hiring fee for property let or hired to the Charity
- 5 1 4 individual members who are not Trustees but who are beneficiaries may receive charitable benefits in that capacity
- A Trustee must not receive any payment of money or other material benefit (whether directly or indirectly) from the Charity except

- 5 2 2 reimbursement of reasonable out-of-pocket expenses (including hotel and travel actually incurred in running the Charity
- an indemnity in respect of any liabilities properly incurred in running the Charity (including the costs of a successful defence to criminal proceedings)
- 5 2 4 payment to any company in which a Trustee has no more than a 1 per cent shareholding
- 5 2 5 in exceptional cases, other payments or benefits (but only with the written approval of the Commission in advance)
- Any Trustee (or any firm or company of which a Trustee is a member or employee) may enter into a contract with the Charity to supply goods or services in return for a payment or other material benefit but only if

- the nature and level of the remuneration is no more than is reasonable in relation to the value of the goods or services and is set in accordance with the procedure in clause 5.4
- 5 3 3 no more than one half of the Trustees are subject to such a contract in any financial year
- Whenever a Trustee has a personal interest in a matter to be discussed at a meeting of the Trustees or a committee the Trustee concerned must
- 5 4 1 declare an interest at or before discussion begins on the matter
- 5 4 2 withdraw from the meeting for that item unless expressly invited to remain in order to provide information
- 5 4 3 not be counted in the quorum for that part of the meeting
- 5 4 4 withdraw during the vote and have no vote on the matter
- 5 4 5 This clause may not be amended without the prior written consent of the Commission

#### 6 LIMITED LIABILITY

The liability of members is limited

#### 7 **GUARANTEE**

Every member promises, if the Charity is dissolved while he, she or it remains a member or within 12 months afterwards, to pay up to £1 towards the costs of dissolution and the liabilities incurred by the Charity while the contributor was a member

#### 8 DISSOLUTION

#### ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF ATTITUDE IS EVERYTHING

#### 1 MEMBERSHIP

- 1.1 The number of members with which the company proposes to be registered is unlimited
- 1 2 The Charity must maintain a register of members
- 1 3 Membership of the Charity is open to any individual or organisation interested in promoting the Objects who
- 1 3 1 applies to the Charity in the form required by the Trustees
- 1 3 2 is approved by the Trustees and
- 1 3 3 signs the Register of members or consents in writing to become a member either personally or (in the case of a member organisation) through an authorised representative
- The Trustees may establish different classes of membership and prescribe their respective privileges and duties and set the amounts of any subscriptions
- 1.5 Membership is terminated if the member concerned
- 1 5 1 gives written notice of resignation to the Charity
- 1 5 2 dies or (in the case of an organisation) ceases to exist
- 1 5 3 is six months in arrears in paying the relevant subscription (if any) (but in such a case the member may be reinstated on payment of the amount due) or
- 1 5 4 is removed from membership by resolution of the Trustees on the ground that in their reasonable opinion the member's continued membership is harmful to the Charity (but only after notifying the member in writing and considering the matter in the light of any written representations which the member concerned puts forward within 14 clear days after receiving notice)

#### 2 GENERAL MEETINGS

- 2 1 Members are entitled to attend general meetings either personally or (in the case of a member organisation) by an authorised representative General meetings are called on at least clear 21 days written notice specifying the business to be discussed

- 2.9 Any general meeting which is not an AGM is an EGM
- 2 10 An EGM may be called at any time by the Trustees and must be called within 28 days on a written request from at least three members

#### 3 THE TRUSTEES

- 3 1 The Trustees as charity trustees have control of the Charity and its property and funds
- The Trustees when complete consist of at least three and not more than twelve individuals, at least 10% of whom must be Deaf or disabled
- 3 3 The subscribers to the Memorandum are the first Trustees of the Charity
- Every Trustee must sign a declaration of willingness to act as a charity trustee of the Charity before he or she is eligible to vote at any meeting of the Trustees
- One third (or the number nearest one third) of the Trustees must retire at each AGM, those longest in office retiring first and the choice between any of equal service being made by drawing lots

- to appoint (and remove) any member (who may be a Trustee) to act as Secretary to the Charity in accordance with the Act

- to delegate any of their functions to committees consisting of two or more individuals appointed by them (but at least one member of every committee must be a Trustee and all proceedings of committees must be reported promptly to the Trustees)

- Accounting records relating to the Charity must be made available for inspection by any Trustee at any reasonable time during normal office hours and may be made available for inspection by

members who are not Trustees if the Trustees so decide

A copy of the Charity's latest available statement of account must be supplied on request to any Trustee or member, or to any other person who makes a written request and pays the Charity's reasonable costs, within two months

- 7 3 Any notice given in accordance with these Articles is to be treated for all purposes as having been received

- 7 3 3 three clear days after being sent by second class or overseas post to that address
