REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS FOR THE YEAR TO 31 MARCH 2013

The Directors have pleasure in submitting the Report and Accounts for the period

Objects of the charity

- To advance the Christian faith, and
- To relieve sickness and financial hardship and to promote and preserve good health by the provision of funds, goods or services of any kind including through the provision of counselling and support, in Welshpool and the surrounding district and in such other parts of the United Kingdom or the world as the trustees may from time to time think fit

Government

The policy and operating decisions of the charity rest with the Directors who meet regularly to monitor the activities of the Company

Review of Activities

Apart from regular Christian meetings throughout the week, Kingswood Church is open to the public seven days a week, and we have seen a steady increase in people from the community using the church and bookshop for prayer, fellowship, counselling/encouragement. We have available through the bookshop, resources to help and equip churches, schools and Christians to live in and serve their local communities. A local Welsh learners group regularly use the bookshop/café to practice their conversational Welsh. We opened a Trussell Trust affiliated Foodbank in March 2013 to serve local people in short term financial crisis.

In planning the activities the Directors have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on Public benefit

Financial Review

Income for the year was £28,816 and expenditure was £30,431, resulting in a surplus for the year of £8,385 Fund balances at the end of the year totalled £176,666, which included fixed assets at net book value of £142,405

Reserves Policy

The Board of Directors have established a policy whereby free reserves held by the charity should be maintained at a level sufficient to meet its obligations in light of the current level of giving

Risk Statement

The Directors have reviewed the risks to which a small charity operating with few employees is exposed. Appropriate procedures are in place to identify, monitor and review these risks on a regular basis.

Directors' Responsibilities

Charity law requires us as Directors to prepare financial statements for each accounting year which give a true and fair view of the state of the charity and of its income and expenditure for the year

KINGSWOOD CHURCH NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR TO 31 MARCH 2013

1 Accounting Policies

The accounts have been prepared under the historic cost convention, in accordance with applicable accounting standards and follow the Statement of Recommended Practice Accounting by Charities 2005 The following are the accounting policies which have been applied in dealing with material items -

a) Donated and grant income

Donated income and grants receivable are taken into account when received by the charity. Income received in circumstances where a claim for repayment of tax has been or will be made to HM Revenue & Customs is grossed up for the tax recoverable. Any amount of tax reclaimed from HM Revenue & Customs but not yet received is shown within the charity's debtors.

b) Other income and expenditure

Investment income is taken into account when receivable and expenditure, including irrecoverable VAT, when incurred by the charity, regardless of when payment is made. Grants payable are taken into account at the earlier of when they are paid or become constructive obligations. Grants for the support of [overseas] missionaries are accounted for on the basis of support that relates to the financial year.

c) Funds

Unrestricted funds are donations and other income received or generated for the objects of the charity without specified purpose and are available for purposes as directed by the trustees. Restricted funds are amounts received where the donor has specified the purpose for which it should be used.

d) Fixed assets and depreciation

Fixed assets acquired for use by the charity are capitalised and depreciated over their estimated useful life unless they cost less than £1,000 when they are written off on purchase

e) <u>Stock</u>

Stock is valued at the lower of cost or net realisable value

f) Taxatron

The company is a registered charity and is exempt from taxation under the Income & Corporation Taxes Acts
