# Introduction

## **Mission Statement**

Derek Prince Ministries exists to develop disciples of Jesus Christ, through the Bible teaching of Derek Prince

Our vision is to reach the peoples of the world in a language they can understand, with the Bible teaching of Derek Prince, using every type of media and all forms of distribution, regardless of the economic means of the recipients

### **Derek Prince**

Derek Prince (1915-2003) was born in India of British parents. He was educated as a scholar of Greek and Latin at Eton College and Cambridge University, where he held a Fellowship in Ancient and Modern Philosophy at King's College. He also studied Hebrew and Aramaic, both at Cambridge University and the Hebrew University in Jerusalem. In addition, he spoke a number of other modern languages.

While serving with the British army in World War II, he began to study the Bible and experienced a life-changing encounter with Jesus Christ. Out of this encounter he formed two conclusions first, that Jesus Christ is alive, second, that the Bible is a true, relevant, up-to-date book. These conclusions altered the whole course of his life. After that time he devoted the rest of his life to studying and teaching the Bible.

He is the author of over 60 books, over 450 audio and 150 video teaching messages, many of which have been translated and published in more than 100 languages

Derek's main gift was explaining the Bible and its teaching, in a clear and simple way. His non-denominational, non-sectarian approach has made his teaching equally relevant and helpful to people from all racial and religious backgrounds.

Derek Prince poured himself out to reach the unreached, and teach the untaught – to see God's people grow to maturity in the Word. Through our work in the UK and around the world, we endeavour to seek new ways of fulfilling Derek's original calling to be a teacher of the Scriptures, in truth and faith and love, which are in Christ Jesus - for many

## **Derek Prince Ministries Today**

Derek Prince passed away in 2003, but the ministry continues to expand on a worldwide basis, currently comprising of 11 national offices that provide teaching materials and raise funds for DPM outreaches

Outreach offices are also located in many other countries including Armenia, Austria, Belgium, Bosnia, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cuba, Czech Republic, Egypt, Estonia, Fiji, Hungary, India, Indonesia, Israel, Italy, Kazakhstan, Kuwait, Macedonia, Malaysia, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Papua New Guinea, Poland, Romania, Russia, Samoa, Serbia and Montenegro, Singapore, Slovakia, Slovenia, Solomon Islands, Ukraine, Vanuatu

# Structure, Governance and Management

## Constitution

Derek Prince Ministries (UK) was established as a charity in 1988 and as a charitable company in 2008. The four current trustees are the directors of the company.

# **Appointment of New Trustees**

The existing Board of Trustees are responsible for the appointment of any new trustees, and no outside parties are involved in this process. It is sought to maintain that a broad range of skills and expertise are represented on the board. Once a prospective trustee is identified, they will normally be invited to serve in the capacity of a board advisor for 12 months, to further assess their suitability for the role, and to allow them to become acquainted with the trustee function. Upon completion of this, an invitation to join the board will usually follow.

## **Organisational Structure**

Board meetings are usually held at least three times per year. The Trustees delegate the day to day running of the charity to UK/Middle East Director, Neil Cornick, with whom regular communication takes place in between the board meetings. Detailed monthly financial management reports are prepared and reviewed by the UK finance team. These reports are circulated to the trustees on a regular basis and are reviewed and discussed during board meetings.

### **Related Parties**

Derek Prince Ministries (UK) is part of an international association of DPM National Offices and Globally Funded Outreach Offices called the Fellowship of National Offices (FNO)

The purposes of the FNO are to

- Strengthen relationship/support
- Increase effectiveness through corporate prayer and interaction
- Facilitate the support and oversight of globally funded outreaches
- Provide a vehicle to hold one another accountable for the integrity of the ministry worldwide

The members of the FNO, who are the leaders of the worldwide National and Outreach Offices, meet annually together to review past performance, decide upon globally funded outreaches and to formulate strategy and policy for the ministry worldwide

The FNO membership is currently comprised of Neil Cornick (UK), Rene de Groot (France), Alex Genovese (Australia), Ruedi Hafliger (Switzerland), Sverre Kristoffersen (Norway), Dick Leggatt (USA), Ross Paterson (China Outreach & UK Trustee), David Selby (International Director & UK Trustee), Warren Smith (New Zealand), Isabel Surgeon (South Africa), Daniel Tracy (Germany), Ivar van der Sterre (Netherlands) and Robert Yeo (Canada)

Representative national office board members are also invited to this meeting

# International Council

The leadership of the FNO is the International Council (IC) and this was appointed by Derek Prince in 1992 to provide leadership to the worldwide ministry of Derek Prince Ministries. Members of the IC are selected from the leadership of National and Outreach Offices worldwide.

The current members of the IC are David Selby, Ross Paterson, Warren Smith, Alex Genovese and Neil Cornick

### **Risk Review**

The Trustees have, during the year, identified potential risks to the organisation. The major risks to which the charity is exposed, such as operational, reputational and financial have been reviewed and systems have been put in place to manage those risks.

# **Financial Review**

# Financial Results

The Trustees can report a slight decrease in overall income. Total incoming resources for the year ending 31 March 2012 were £663,320 (2011 £681,910) and after deducting resources expended of £668,086 (2011 £597,592) this left a small deficit of £4,766 (2011 £84,318)

### **Balance Sheet**

The net assets of the charity at 31 March 2012 were £1,953,261 (2011 £1,958,027)

# **Reserves Policy**

The charity is largely funded by donations from individuals, and therefore its income is vulnerable to economic factors outside its control. The Trustees therefore feel it is important to establish a prudent reserves policy of between six months and twelve months expenditure to be covered by free reserves. At 31 March 2012 the charity's unrestricted reserves (not represented by fixed assets) stood at £320,417 (2011 £398,529) which covers six months (2011 eight months) of expenditure.

# **Objectives and Activities**

# Objects of the Charity

The objects of Derek Prince Ministries (UK) as set out in the founding Deed of Trust are the advancement of the Christian religion throughout the world by whatever legally charitable means the Trustees shall in their discretion think fit Specifically

- To sponsor Bible teaching by means of audio tapes, video tapes, records, films, literature and by public speaking
  including radio and television broadcasting
- · To support existing charities which are carrying out the objects of the charity

Our goal in essence, is to place Derek Prince's Bible teaching in the hands of those who want them. We make this available in as many different media formats that are needed, and in the particular language that is required within our allocated territory.

Outreach projects are focused on the translation, production and distribution of books, and audio/video Bible teaching There are also many radio and television broadcasts of Derek Prince messages, a Bible study courses and resources made available through electronic media, including the internet

# **Public Benefit**

The Trustees have given due consideration to Charity Commission published guidance on the operation of the Public Benefit requirement

DPM (UK) uses printed word, radio, internet and other forms of electronic media to change lives for the good in spiritual, moral and practical ways which demonstrate the Christian faith. The publications promote the Gospel and reinforce Christian values. The benefits are clear, identifiable and related to the aim of advancing the Christian religion.

There is no express geographical restriction to the opportunity to benefit and our governing document does not contain any religious restrictions on who may benefit from the services of DPM (UK)

Occasionally we encounter situations of very real practical need, and we seek to alleviate suffering and hardship. For example, since 2001 DPM (UK) has funded around 30-40 orphans and widows in Ethiopia, paying for their education, basic needs and food.

DPM (UK) also has a programme that provides free Bible teaching to prison inmates on a monthly basis

The charity sets the price of publications and audios, so that they are affordable by most people. For those unable to pay,

there are a range of resources that can be obtained free of charge such as Teaching Legacy, Invest in People and teaching downloadable through the website

### **Fund Raising**

Four times each year the UK office sends out a direct mail appeal to raise funds for the globally funded DPM outreaches. The globally funded outreaches are agreed at the annual FNO meetings, and each national office commits to raising funds for these specified outreaches during the following calendar year.

Details of the appeal are sent to those individuals and groups on our mailing list. As well as being given the opportunity to contribute to these projects should they so wish, they are also kept informed of progress, new opportunities and prayer points. Their financial giving enables us to distribute funds to the appropriate DPM office responsible for the particular project.

### Outreach

### **UK Outreach**

The UK office runs an internet and mail order facility to make the wide range of Derek Prince resources available to our constituency. This primarily takes the form of providing books, audios and videos of Derek's teaching

We seek to cultivate relationships with individuals, churches and other Christian organisations aiming to bring the teaching of Derek Prince to a new audience Opportunities are taken when they arise to air the material on radio, television and the internet From time to time, magazine advertising is also used

A wider awareness of the ministry is created through our attendance at selected conferences and exhibitions

We issue a publication, The Teaching Legacy of Derek Prince, free of charge to our mailing list. This Bible based teaching is a source of encouragement and a follow-up book or audio message for further study, is made available on a voluntary contribution basis.

Our UK Invest in People newsletter is usually produced twice a year. This is our main tool for sharing the news of how lives are being impacted through the work of DPM, and for giving progress reports on previous appeals.

*Prison Ministry* - The Inside Outreach programme in the UK makes a healthy diet of free Bible teaching available to prisoners on a monthly basis. We also assist chaplains in their ministry by giving them the DPM materials they would like to use with inmates, or to place in their prison libraries.

Young Leaders FIT Programme - We believe it is essential to invest in the next generation of church leaders. This free two year programme has been developed to lead 18-30 year olds, who desire to grow in their faith, through a series of foundational Bible teaching. The programme has been rebranded as FIT - Foundations and Identity through Teaching. We have also partnered with a large church denomination to make this resource available to their key young leaders. There is no charge for the participants of this programme.

### Africa Outreach

DPM South Africa is responsible for all the countries south of Zambia, namely Angola, Botswana, Lesotho, Madagascar, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, Tanzania Uganda, Zimbabwe, Zambia, Swaziland and Kenya, the most recent addition There is some overlap as French DVDs are given to Missionary Exposure Training pastors from Congo and DRC who come to Pretoria for training

Derek's programmes are currently broadcast on God TV Four new satellite TV stations have approached DPM-SA for broadcast material, namely Love World, Channel G, Adonai and Manna Coverage is for Africa, Europe, Middle and Far East, Australia, USA and Canada and South America

DPM-SA currently broadcast on 14 radio stations in five countries in Southern Africa, with 24-hour radio broadcasts via the satellite and internet since 1995. Impact Radio www impact-radio co za and TWR (Trans World Radio) broadcast on satellite. Derek's programmes are also now broadcast on FEBA Radio in Harare, Zimbabwe.

The CD and DVD library has now been launched and the first eight of the 42 new DVD and CD album titles with new

covers have now been released

The voice dubbing of Derek's Foundational teaching is proceeding and 10 hours of teaching have just been voice dubbed into Swahili for East and Central Africa. It is hoped that the 14 languages which have been voice dubbed will be used on radio, TV and in Bible Colleges.

Bible Colleges in South Africa are training students from countries in Africa making it easier for the office to get Derek's Graduate Gift Packs to them to take back to their countries. Bible College libraries are receiving packs of books or Foundational DVDs in the relevant languages. The Graduate Gift Packs are being prepared and sent to Zambia, Zimbabwe, Kenya, Malawi and SA. The first Swahili DVDs for graduates from Tanzania, Bemba DVDs for Zambia and Shona DVDs for Zimbabwe have been given to graduates who will be taking them back to their countries.

Several years ago, our office in France began to be involved, and they have now established contact with leaders in more than 20 nations in Africa where French is a primary language

### China Outreach

The outreach of DPM into China began in 1984 Ross Paterson, a fluent Mandarin speaker who had worked in Taiwan for 10 years, believed God told him to "take Derek Prince's teaching to China". Ross approached Derek, who readily gave his permission and his blessing. Today the office is based in Singapore.

Ross negotiated with the Far East Broadcasting Company (FEBC) in Hong Kong to broadcast a daily 15-minute Mandarin radio programme into China. The English radio programme "Today with Derek Prince" was translated into Chinese and given the title "Living Sacrifice". To make the teaching more acceptable to the Chinese (then still highly suspicious of foreigners). Derek was given the name Ye Guang-Ming, meaning Clear Light. Living Sacrifice was also translated into Cantonese and other Chinese minority languages. The programme ran for two years, and became so popular in China that the radio listeners requested more. A four-year programme (edited from Derek's audiocassette teachings) called "The Workman God Approves" followed. Mongolian radio broadcasts commenced in 1987 based on the translated Foundation Series text. Other materials have also been used since then such as "Today with Derek Prince". DPM-China has now been broadcasting. Derek's teaching into China for over twenty years and the programmes are also available on their website.

A major project was launched in 1995 to print and distribute one million copies of the "Foundation Series" in Chinese by the year 2000 With God's help, that goal was reached in late 1999 By the end of 2005, about 4.5 million copies of other Derek Prince titles were printed. During 2007 the main focus was on the "Focus on Foundations" pack, which included Foundation Series, Self-Study Bible Course and Faith to Live By. By the end of October 2007 around 470,000 copies of the pack were printed and distributed to various Chinese church networks.

In addition to requesting books, Chinese believers and pastors are also asking for audio teachings and are downloading Bible study materials from our Chinese website. The site, www.ygmweb.org also gets about 1,000 hits every day from Chinese believers and seekers who visit the website to download Derek's Bible teaching messages in MP3 audio.

Responding to requests for Derek's teaching on CD and VCD, tens of thousands of audio and video CDs are produced each month as well as Derek's teaching on DVD

# Russia Outreach (including former Soviet Union)

The name of Derek Prince is very well known by Christians all across the nations of the former USSR. We have teams of people based in seven strategic centres and the ministry of DPM is focussed in a number of areas.

Literature – Many new titles have been printed and distributed during the current year and further reprinting of material is underway, to respond to the ongoing demand

Ministry Conferences - We conduct conferences in churches throughout Russia and the former Soviet Union

Correspondence Bible School - This course provides essential training for over 2,000 students and church leaders throughout this region. The Foundation Series book is the basic study text for this three year course.

# Eastern Europe Outreach

The DPM outreach to Eastern Europe is based from our office in the Netherlands. An outreach that stretches back nearly

twenty years, it is amazing to see how the Lord has kept His hand on the work of DPM in this region. Although in some of these nations times have been tough due to strong opposition, the publishing of Derek's teaching continues in Albania, Bulgaria, Romania, Czech Republic, Poland, Croatia, Serbia, Macedonia, Bosnia, Slovenia and Slovakia

## Ethiopia Outreach

Outreach in the Horn of Africa has taken place for many years with several Derek Prince books being published and reprinted in the Amharic language. During the current year, material in Tigrigna has also been printed in response to demand from Eritrean believers.

### Indian Subcontinent Outreach

The books of Derek Prince are a source of inspiration and edification to thousands in several countries on the Indian subcontinent. The main focus for our work in this region is in India, Nepal and Pakistan. Derek Prince's books are being printed in English, Tamil, Telugu, Kannada, Malayalam, Hindi, Marathi, Bengali, Punjabi, Oriya, Gujarati, Pusto, Dhari and Nepali languages. These books are sold through a network of 130 bookstores across India.

## **Israel Outreach**

In 2003, Derek Prince Israel began under the leadership of George and Betty Jackson from the US, who have an office in Jerusalem. This area of ministry involves the translation and printing of Derek's books into Hebrew for wide distribution in Israel. Material is also made available through a Hebrew language website — www.dpi.co.il — as well as in English at www.dpisrael.com.

### Middle East Outreach

DPM's Middle East outreach covers the area of North Africa and the Middle East. We have produced and are seeking to develop material in all the major languages of the region. Our strategy includes both the production of material within the target nations, as well as printing literature in Europe and USA to make available to immigrant communities.

In recent years we have seen a great increase in the demand for our materials in this region, particularly in the Arabic language. With the popularity of satellite television across the region, alongside the challenge of distributing Christian material in nations where believers suffer persecution for their faith, our strategic goal has been to develop lip syncronised video messages for broadcast on satellite TV with the potential to impact many millions of lives.

The Arab Spring has had an impact on our work, and limited our activity to some extent. However, towards the end of the year a new initiative was to establish an office in the Gulf region to serve both local and expatriate churches.

Derek Prince materials are currently available in Arabic, Kurdish and Turkish and our Arabic website is www.dpm name

# **West Africa**

Recognising the huge church growth in West Africa, particularly Nigeria and Ghana, we are exploring ways to provide affordable Derek Prince Bible teaching in English to these nations

### **Widows and Orphans**

Bible teaching material is the primary focus of our work around the world. However, from time to time areas of practical need are brought to our attention through co-workers in the field. In some instances we are able to relieve poverty and suffering and this is usually targeted towards widows and orphans. An example during the current year was the funding of nearly 100 'water donkeys' in Ethiopia.

### Other Funds

Smaller restricted funds held by the UK office are comprised of -

# **Latin America Outreach**

Co-ordinated by our US office, our Hispanic outreach aims to translate and publish more of Derek's books in Spanish for the Latin American church. To date, only about half of his 50 titles have been published in Spanish.

We have an outreach office located in Cuba, where despite the political pressures that persist, our dedicated staff continue to publish Derek's materials inside the country. The demand for Derek Prince Portuguese books in Brazil has been significant in the last few years with nearly half a million books distributed through publishers.

### **South East Asia**

Out of our New Zealand office, we work into several nations, with significant activity in Myanmar, Indonesia and Malaysia

### **Broadcasting**

Radio - Derek Prince's Bible-teaching radio programme, Today with Derek Prince, is broadcast worldwide, in several languages including English, three Chinese languages, Croatian, Mongolian, Russian, Samoan, Spanish and Tongan In the UK it is available every weekday on UCB (see www ucb co uk for details)

Satellite Television - Derek Prince messages can be seen on several satellite TV stations such as GOD TV, Loveworld and Revelation TV

# **Garden Project**

Funds have been donated to assist us with the improvement of the grounds at our UK base in Baldock

### **Global Outreach**

The Global Outreach fund is used to provide teaching materials to people from outside of our main outreach areas, that lack the financial resources to be able to purchase them from us

## Caucasus

Our work in the Caucasus region includes Iran, Armenia, Georgia and Azerbaijan

# **Designated Funds**

### Where Most Needed

This is a fund established to accumulate donations where the donor has not specified which worldwide outreach they would like their gift to be used by the charity. The fund is available for the charity to direct to the DPM outreach most in need of finance.

### **Teaching Letter**

This fund covers the production and distribution of our Derek Prince Teaching Legacy communication, which is made available without charge

# Outreach opportunity

This was a fund established following a charity channel swim to provide funds that could be used at the charities discretion

# Plans for future periods

It is the desire of the Trustees to continue to increase the impact and awareness of the ministry. Although Derek Prince passed away in 2003, many people today are still being helped and spiritually strengthened through his legacy of Bible teaching resources.

In his lifetime Derek Prince produced more material than has currently been published. We are working with our US office to edit and produce new Derek Prince books from this material. As well as providing new sales revenue, this will also help generate fresh interest in the ministry.

Our challenge is to make the teaching available and accessible to the next generation and we want to utilise opportunities presented by new technology. We intend to redesign our websites to better facilitate mobile devices and increase our presence through social media. We will produce more ebooks, audio books and make use of new media formats.

We aim to recruit volunteer advocates for the ministry who will raise the profile of DPM (UK) in their own church and networks. We will prepare a resource pack of materials including slideshow and an overview video that will help advocates present and promote our work.

In a challenging economic climate we need to raise funds creatively and in ways most convenient for donors. In the coming year we will provide the opportunity to give from mobile devices and improve the giving area of our website, both in terms of content and functionality.

# REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT AUDITORS TO THE MEMBERS OF DEREK PRINCE MINISTRIES (UK)

We have audited the financial statements of Derek Prince Ministries (UK) for the year ended 31 March 2012 which comprise the Statement of Financial Activities, the Balance Sheet and the related notes. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice applicable to Smaller Entities)

This report is made solely to the charitable company's trustees, as a body, in accordance with Chapter 3 of Part 16 of the Companies Act 2006. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the charitable company's trustees those matters we are required to state to them in an auditor's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the charity and its trustees as a body, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed

# Respective responsibilities of trustees and auditor

As explained more fully in the Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities set out on page 9, the trustees (who are also the directors of the charitable company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements and for being satisfied that they give a true and fair view

Our responsibility is to audit and express an opinion on the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland) Those standards require us to comply with the Auditing Practices Board's Ethical Standards for Auditors

## Scope of the audit of the financial statements

An audit involves obtaining evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements sufficient to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or error. # NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2012

## 1 BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

### 1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006, Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards (Generally Accepted Accounting Practice) and Accounting and Reporting by Charities Statement of Recommended Accounting Practice (revised 2005), which has been applied consistently

The charity's activities, together with the factors likely to affect its future development, performance and position are set out in the trustees' report. The trustees believe that the charity is well placed to manage its risks successfully. The trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing these financial statements.

### 1 2 Resources Expended

Resources expended are accounted for on an accruals basis and is split between cost of generating funds, charitable activities and governance as follows

- Costs of generating funds are costs directly attributable to fund raising
- · Activities for generating funds are renting Kingsfield to third party and charity staff
- Charitable activities includes expenditure associated with the services the charity provides and includes both direct costs and support costs relating to those activities
- Governance costs includes external audit, legal advice for trustees and costs associated with constitutional and statutory requirements

Wherever applicable costs have been allocated directly to projects, including the staff time costs directly generated by the projects. Additionally projects are charged at a rate of 30% of donations by way of a contribution to the support provided

Support costs are allocated to charitable activities, split using head count, man hours, staff cost, floor space or a specific percentage, as appropriate

# 1 3 Voluntary Income - Donations, legacies, gifts and grants

Incoming resources are recognised on a receivable basis when there is entitlement, certainty of the receipt and the amounts can be measured with sufficient reliability

Legacy income is accrued for on a receivable basis when the following conditions have been met the final estate accounts have been approved, the legacy is capable of the measurement and there is no reversionary interest

# 1 4 Fixed Assets & Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated at a rate to write off the cost of tangible fixed assets on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives. Items of equipment with a purchase price of £500 or less are not capitalised. The rates applied per annum are as follows.

The exclusion from providing depreciation on freehold properties is a departure from the statutory rules for fixed assets with a finite useful life. The trustees are of the opinion that this is required by Sections 394-399 of the Companies Act 2006 to enable the financial statements to show a true and fair view. For this and future periods freehold buildings are not depreciated, it is the charity's policy to maintain freehold buildings in a continuous state of sound repair and, accordingly, the trustees are of the opinion that the useful economic lives of these assets are so long and residual values are so high that the depreciation charge to the statement of financial activities would be insignificant.

### 1 5 Teaching Resource Income

Sales of books, audios and videos are shown in the accounts net of value added tax. Sales are recognised upon dispatch of resources to the customer

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2012

### 16 Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Provision is made for obsolete and slow moving items

### 17 Operating Leases

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged on a straight-line basis over the terms of the lease

### 18 Funds

Restricted funds are funds whose use is legally restricted to specific uses whether by trust deed or letter received with the original gift

Designated funds are funds whose use is not legally restricted but whose purpose has been designated by the trustees. The trustees are entitled to use the funds in whichever way they see fit

The General fund covers all items that do not fall into the above categories

### 19 Pension costs

The charity contributes to individual employees' defined contribution schemes. All contributions are included in the statement of financial activities.

# 1.10 Foreign Currencies

Costs expressed in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at rates of exchange ruling on the date on which transactions occur Monetary assets and liabilities are translated at the rate ruling at the balance sheet date

Differences arising on the translation of such items are dealt with in the statement of financial activities

# 1 11 Corporation Tax

All of the charity's income is applied for charitable purposes and therefore the charity is exempt from corporation tax
