1 Accounting Policies

Basis of measurement and preparation of accounts

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities effective April 2008.

Turnover policy

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods and services net of VAT

Tangible assets depreciation policy

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life as follows

computer equipment 20% reducing balance

Intangible assets amortisation policy

Acquired goodwill is written off in equal annual instalments over its estimated useful economic life.

Other accounting policies

Going Concern

the company meets its day to day working capital requirements through an overdraft facility which is repayable on demand.

The nature of the company's business is such that there can be considerable unpredictable variation in the timing of cash inflows. The director has prepared projected cash flow information for the period ending 9 months from the date of their approval of these financial statements. on the basis of this cash flow information and discussions with the company's bankers, the director considers that the company will continue to operate within the facility currently agreed and within that which they expect will be agreed when the company's bankers consider renewing the facility for a further year.

However the margin of facilities over requirements is not large and inherently there can be no certainty in relation to these matters. on this basis, the director considers it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis . the financial statements to not include any adjustments that would result from a withdrawal of the overdraft facility by the company bankers.
