1 Accounting Policies

Basis of measurement and preparation of accounts

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities effective April 2008.

Turnover policy

Turnover represents the revenue resulting from exchange transactions under which a seller supplies to customers the goods or services that it is in business to provide, exclusive of value added tax.
