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TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2021

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2021. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims for the public benefit

The principal object of the League was to support the patients and staff of the Colchester NHS Acute hospitals and the North East Essex Primary Care Trust.

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities.

This is achieved by :-

- (i) providing, whenever appropriate equipment and amenities thus ensuring that the patients are treated with the latest and most sophisticated equipment available.
- (ii) the League also provides services to patients to make their stay or visit to hospital as comfortable as possible.

Significant activities

The main activities of the charity have been fundraising, managing the hospital shops and receiving legacies and donations. The charity has continued to support the work of the hospital and the Primary Care services, assist hospital staff, relieve and support sick patients and recruit volunteers.

Grantmaking

The Board considered all requests for grants. The Board requires all requests to have the relevant Trust directorate approval. Requests in excess of £10,000 were normally considered by the Trustees for an appeal.

Volunteers

The League is greatly indebted to its team of volunteers who gave so generously their time. Without this commitment the League would not have been able to meet its objectives.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

During the past year the League has donated £56,176 in accordance with its Aims and Objectives. Within this figure are amounts of £30,959 for a MRI compatible anaesthetic machine and £18,000 towards a Butterfly volunteer Co-Ordinator.

In addition to the financial support afforded by the League help was also provided with volunteers acting as hospital guides, fund raising and working in the Leagues outlets around the hospital.

Fundraising activities

The main source of the League was its retail operation which provided the majority of its income. Funds raised from collection boxes amounted to £1,095.

No direct approaches for funds to the public in the form of telephone calls or street confrontations (Chugging) took place.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

At 31st March 2021, the bank balance held by the League was £10,423.

Once all creditors and any final expenses have been paid, the bank balance will be transferred to the Colchester Hospital Charity and the bank account closed.

FUTURE PLANS

The Trustees are now in the process of merging with the hospital charity, and this will be completed once the final accounts are complete and the Limited Company has been dissolved.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The management of the League is the responsibility of the Board who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the Objects and Rules, September 2002.

The League is governed by the League's Board of directors who as Trustees are responsible for the decision making. The Board meets at least six times a year.

The League endeavoured to recruit Trustees from the local community with the appropriate skills to further the objectives of the organisation. The League operated a policy of non-discrimination. All potential Trustees were considered in accordance with this policy.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

CESSATION OF TRADING

This was a very disappointing year for the League. In the early part of the year up to July 2020, the shops were all closed due to Coronavirus and when they did re-open, there were very few visitors to the hospital because visiting patients was very restricted on account of the virus.

It became apparent fairly quickly that we were struggling to compete with the other retailers on the site. M&S, Costa Coffee and WH Smith. This was in the main part due to the position of our shop in relation to the other retailers. The entrances to their shops are in the main entrance thoroughfare to the hospital whereas ours was outside. As such, most visitors did not have to pass our shop and the staff had to come outside the hospital to come to the shop.

The Trustees had always recognised that this would be a problem and had tried, unsuccessfully, to get premises within the hospital building. However, we thought that as we had served the hospital staff for so many years, their loyalty to the League would enable us to succeed. Unfortunately, this was not the case although some staff, especially the ambulance personnel, did continue to give us support.

The Trustees were then faced with the difficult question of how long we could continue to trade at a loss. We wrote to the staff in early September 2020 advising them that a consultation process was starting, and that the outcome of the consultation process may result in redundancies. We asked the staff to put forward any suggestions or proposals that would assist in avoiding or reducing the number of potential redundancies. We had two staff meetings in September, but no substantial proposals came forward. The Trustees decided that we could no longer continue to trade at a loss and would close all the shops with effect from 31 October 2020. A further meeting was held with each individual member if staff.

Subsequently all the staff were made redundant and were paid their redundancy payment, holiday pay and pay in lieu of notice.

This was a very sad ending to the League of Friends shops at Colchester Hospital after having supported the hospital, its patients and staff for over 60 years.

The Trustees would like to place on record their thanks to the staff and all the volunteers for their fantastic support over the years. It would not have been possible to have contributed so much to the hospital for over 60 years without the dedication of both staff and volunteers.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value, as modified by the revaluation of certain assets.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures and fittings

- 25% on cost

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation

The charity is an exempt charity within the meaning of sch 3 of the Charities Act 2011 and is considered to pass the tests set out in Paragraph 1 Schedule 6 Finance Act 2010 and therefore it meets the definition of a charitable company for UK corporation tax purposes.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Financial instruments

The company enters into basic financial instrument transactions, as appropriate and as and when required, that result in the recognition of financial assets and liabilities within the financial statements such as trade and other accounts receivable and payable, bank loans and hire purchase contracts.

Irrecoverable vat

Irrecoverable VAT is charged against the category of resources expended for which it was incurred.
