## Objectives and aims

A TIME Limited was established in June 2008 to assist those suffering from infertility problems, particularly those who are in financial need, through the provision of assistance to receive medical treatment

- A) The provision of information, advice and support, in particular through the provision of a support group
- B) The provision of a helpline
- C) The provision of a periodic magazine
- D) The provision of a website and other resources for information, guidance and educational materials
- E) Referring beneficiaries to relevant medical assistance and advice"

## Significant activities

The major sources of income during the year were donations from individuals and various institutions and these funds were directed towards the charitable activities which are detailed below

## Grantmaking

Grants are made at the discretion of the trustees and in accordance with the principal objectives of the charity. All cases are assessed by the trustees and are treated with strict confidentiality.

## ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

#### Charitable activities

The charity's focus this past year has been to initiate activities that will benefit and contribute to the charity's objectives

This has been accomplished in a number of ways during the year,

- Our professional helpline, available 24 hours, offering advice support and assistance to couples suffering from infertility
- The library has provided literature to individuals with an interest to clarify and research the treatments available or offered to them
- Successful regular support groups and event programmes, featuring speakers and opportunities for the couples to meet others in similar situations and form friendship during difficult and lonely times

## Helpline

Our confidential helpline which is manned 24 hours a day by our dedicated team of volunteers receives calls throughout the year and successfully advises, supports and assists couples who are coping with infertility not only in the UK but internationally. Our volunteers enjoy direct access to qualified doctors in both the UK and America whom they consult on a regular basis. In addition they are also in regular contact with trusted rabbinical authorities who offer their advice and guidance on this sensitive yet important topic. As a result of this support mechanism we have seen numerous successful outcomes.

## Miscarriage

Suffering a miscarriage is an extremely heartbreaking experience. We have a beautifully designed PLP (Pregnancy Loss Package) which is sent to the grieving couple, to help them heal. It includes advice, support and encouragement as well as an uplifting CD and a small box of chocolates. The charity also helps couples deal with burial issues should they arise, G-d forbid, in addition to religious prayers recited on the couple's behalf

## Library

Our library was visited frequently. The purchase of up to date literature containing information on the latest advances in treatment was welcomed by all members. We also expanded our vast selection of CDs and DVDs containing medical information and uplifting and supportive lectures rom both medical professionals and recognised rabbinical authorities and distributed a quarterly magazine from an equivalent organisation based in America which shares our name. This magazine offers a wide range of resources and advice for couples who find themselves struggling with fertility issues.

## Small Grants

With the extremely high costs involved in infertility treatment, we offered to ease some of the burden with small grants, for example paying towards transportation to clinics. In addition we also provided supervisors to attend clinics—where necessary as required by Jewish Law

## Support Groups and Events Programmes

This year we organised a well-known keynote speaker at one of our events which was timed to coincide with the Pesach holiday, one of the most difficult periods of the Jewish calendar for couples who are unable to conceive, particularly because it is a family time when the children are the focus of the festival. The speaker who himself is familiar with the activities of the charity was received very well and provided a much needed source of comfort and support

We feel that this year has been a productive and successful year and we look forward to continuing and expanding our activities to the ultimate benefit of our members

## 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities

#### Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy

## Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life

Plant and machinery etc

- 33% on reducing balance and 15% on reducing balance

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes
