11 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention

The directors have reviewed the projected cash flows of the company and its existing contractual arrangements with Celine SA and other members of the LVMH Group

After making enquiries, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

1.2 Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), which have been applied consistently (except as otherwise stated) throughout the year and the preceding period

13 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods and services net of VAT and trade discounts

14 Research and development

Research expenditure is written off to the profit and loss account in the year in which it is incurred Development expenditure is written off in the same way unless the director are satisfied as to the technical, commercial and financial viability of individual projects. In this situation, the expenditure is deferred and amortised over the period during which the company is expected to benefit

15 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows

16 Leasing

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term

17 Pensions

1.8 Taxation

Current tax, including UK corporation tax and foreign tax, is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions have occured at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more, tax, with the following exception

- deferred tax assests are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not there will be suitable tax profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date

18 Foreign currency translation

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to profit and loss account.

In June 2010, the Chancellor of the Exchequer announced that the main rate of UK corporation tax would reduce from 28% to 27% with effect from April 2011. This change was susbstantively enacted in July 2010 and therefore the effect of the change on the deferred tax balance as at 31st December 2010 has been included in these workings.

On 23rd March 2011 the Chancellor announced an additional 1% reduction in the main rate of UK corporation tax to 26% with effect from 1 April 2011. This has not been reflected in the figures above as it is not substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. The Chancellor proposed further changes to reduce the rate by one percent per annum to 23% by 1st April 2014, but again these changes have not yet been substantivley enacted and therefore are not included in the figures above.
