The Directors who are the charity trustees for the purposes of the Charities Act 1993 have pleasure in presenting their report in compliance with both the Act and the Companies Act 2006, together with the financial statements prepared under the latter Act, for the Year Ended 31 December 2009

Organisation and Management

Guildford Town Centre Chaplaincy ('GTCC') is a registered charity and a company limited by guarantee. It is governed by its memorandum and articles of association as issued on 7 July 2008. The names of the Trustees, including those serving during the period, are set out on this page along with other useful information.

The Trustees have delegated the Trust's day to day management to the Town Centre Chaplain, Treasurer and Street Angels Co-ordinator. Updated written reports and financial statements are prepared and presented to the board at each meeting.

All Trustees appointed are interested parties to the project and in the main represent Churches supporting the project. Other potential Trustees names are brought before a formal meeting of the current Trustees for consideration and if agreed by the meeting are asked to become a Trustee.

Mr Paul Chamberlain has been appointed as Independent Examiner.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT (continued) For the Year Ended 31 December 2009

Purpose and Mission

The charitable purpose for which GTCC has been established is to help those in need during certain periods of time in the town centre and to advance Christian support by means of a chaplain based within Guildford Town Centre.

Principal Activities

GTCC activities focus on two objectives

Street Angels

This is the recruitment of volunteers who will then operate within the Guildford town centre on a Friday and Saturday night to help those in need. This has been successfully operating throughout the year on a Friday and from July on a Saturday also

Town Centre Chaplaincy

A chaplain has been appointed on a part time basis from 1 January 2010 moving to a full time basis from 1 April 2010 and will operate within the Guildford town centre.

It is considered that both these objectives are for the benefit of the public and that the Trustees have therefore complied with the duty in Section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 to have due regard to the Charity Commission guidance published in this respect.

Review of Activities and Achievements

GTCC came into existence during July of 2008 and started to raise funds from Churches within Guildford to achieve its objectives which were to recruit volunteers to have a visible presence in Guildford Town Centre on both Friday and Saturday nights to help those who may need assistance for numerous reasons. The visible presence on a Friday night has continued throughout the year. In early 2009 further recruitment took place and following a second commissioning service a visible presence on a Saturday night commenced on 20 June. During the year some 6,000 people have been contacted and in many cases helped. It has also been recognised by the authorities that the presence of volunteers on the streets has in fact reduced crime within the Town Centre on a year on year basis.

The Trustees having seen the success of the work to date with the volunteers felt it was correct to move on to the second phase of the purpose and mission of the charity. Advertising of the post of Chaplain took place and following a good response and detailed interviews a chaplain was appointed. The chaplain will take up the post on a part time basis from 1 January 2010 moving to full time from 1 April 2010.

Financial Review

GTCC income for the year amounted to £47,279 of which £30,652 has been expended on the recruitment and organisation of the street angels and the appointment of a Chaplain to commence part time from 1 January 2010

This leaves a balance of £35,758 carried forward to the current year of which £7,591 has been specifically given for the costs of the town chaplain.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT(continued) For the Year Ended 31 December 2009

Reserves Level Policy

The Trustees having considered a number of issues feel the ultimate aim of the charity is to accumulate sufficient reserves to cover the costs of operation for one year.

Risk Management

The Board reviews regularly the risks associated with the operations currently being carried out and feel the systems in place are operating successfully at present.

Directors' Responsibilities

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements as 'Companies Act' accounts for each financial year to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of its income surplus/deficit for the period. In preparing the financial statements the directors are required to:

To select the most suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently

Make judgements and estimates that they consider reasonable and prudent

Disclose and explain any departure from Companies Act accounting principles

Prepare the financial statements on a 'going concern' basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue to operate.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and also required by charity law, ensuring their proper application and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

So far as the directors are aware, we have each taken steps that we ought to have taken in order to make ourselves aware that the accounts reflect the correct financial position.

Independent Examiner's Report to the members of the Guildford Town Centre Chaplaincy For the year ended 31 December 2009

I report on the accounts of the company for the year ended 31 December 2009, which are set out on pages 6 to 9.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The trustees (who are also the directors of the company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The Trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 43(2) of the Charities Act 1993 (the 1993 Act) and that an independent examination is needed. I am qualified to undertake the examination by being a qualified member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the Companies Act 2006 as 'Companies Act' accounts on the historical cost convention in accordance with applicable Accounting and Financial Reporting Standards and the Charities SORP 2005, having regard to the substance of transactions and arrangements in accordance with generally accepted principles or practice.

1.2 Fund Accounting

General Funds are unrestricted, which as such are available for use or retention at the discretion of the directors, in accordance with the Trust's Objectives

Restricted Funds are funds subject to specific restrictive conditions imposed by the donors

1.3 Incoming Resources

All income is accounted for on a receivable basis

1.4 Resources Expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. Where incurred in order to further the charitable objects directly they are accounted for as a charitable activity. Project support cost will be allocated as appropriate.
