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TRUSTEES' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2010

The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 December 2010

The company was established under a memorandum of association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its articles of association. Under those articles, the trustees are required to retire by rotation.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts, in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective June 2003) and follow the recommendations in Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (SORP) published in 2005

Structure, governance and management

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006

The company's memorandum and articles of association are the primary governing documents of the charity

New trustees are recruited at the invitation of the current trustees and are appointed as trustees when such appointment has been approved by all the existing trustees. No limit is placed upon the period of trusteeship once a trustee has been appointed.

Newly appointed trustees are provided with a thorough introduction to the workings of the charity, and are provided with all necessary information which will enable them to properly fulfil their role as trustees

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks

Objectives and activities

The objectives of the charity, in accordance with its memorandum of association, is to promote community participation in healthy recreation through football and other sports for the benefit of the public across Coventry and Warwickshire. In the furtherance of this object the directors, as the charity trustees, have complied with the duty in Section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 to have due regard to the Charity Commission's published general and relevant sub-sector guidance concerning the operation of the Public Benefit requirement under the Act

TRUSTEES' REPORT (CONTINUED)

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2010

The significant activities for achieving objectives are,

- to increase the opportunity for residents of Coventry and Warwickshire to participate in football and other sports, for a more physically active lifestyle
- to actively promote opportunities for disadvantaged and marginalised communities to participate in positive activities, regardless of age, gender, race, infirmity, disablement, poverty or social and economic circumstances
- to promote participation in healthy activities, through providing facilities for the playing of football and other sports, whilst improving health awareness through a variety of mediums
- to advance the education and learning of children, young people and adults by promoting accredited training and personal developments opportunities
- working in partnership with key local, regional and national organisations to allow the company to achieve its charitable objectives and the listed activities

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the charity should undertake

Achievements and performance

The trustees believe the main achievements during the year can be broken down into the following themes Sports delivery - 40 after school clubs, 50 Saturday morning clubs, 12 curriculum schools over the school year and 60 holiday courses during children's school holidays have been provided

Education - a literacy for life campaign was run at 2 schools targeting children under 5 years old who are underachieving in literacy

Social inclusion - On Target is an estate based project run on Friday and Saturday evenings to deter younger people from anti-social behaviour

Disability - 30 hours per week are spent with children requiring special education needs in Coventry and Warwickshire across 4 age groups

Health - 3 schools have taken part in regular sporting activity on a weekly basis to target obesity in Year 5 children

In all, some 10,000 children were engaged in activities across Coventry and Warwickshire in 2010

Financial review

The net income for the year amounted to £43,671 all of which is attributable to general reserves

It is the policy of the charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The trustees considers that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the charity's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.

Plans for the future

The charity plans continuing the activities as outlined above in the forthcoming years, subject to satisfactory funding arrangements

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT

TO THE TRUSTEES OF SKY BLUES IN THE COMMUNITY

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2010, which are set out on pages 4 to 14

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The trustees, who are also the directors of Sky Blues In The Community for the purposes of company law, are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 43(2) of the Charities Act 1993, the 1993 Act, and that an independent examination is needed. The charity's gross income exceeded £250,000 and I am qualified to undertake the examination being a qualified member of ICAEW.

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 2006

1.2 Incoming resources

Incoming resources are accounted for on an accruals basis and shown in the Statement of Financial Activities represent amounts receivable in relation to donations, coaching fees, contributions, subscriptions and grants

1.3 Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on the accruals basis. In particular, the costs of charitable activities represents all costs of the charity less those apportioned to governance costs.

1 4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows

Plant and machinery

25% straight line

Fixtures, fittings & equipment

25% straight line

15 Pensions

The charity makes pension contributions for certain employees. Contributions are charged in the accounts as they become payable

16 Fund structure

The charity has a restricted income fund to account for situations where a donor requires that funding must be spent on a particular programme or purpose. All other funds are unrestricted income funds

17 Donated services

The charity does not include donated services and facilities in the Statement of Financial Activities as the charity is unable to reasonably quantify or measure the value of these services. See note 15 for explanation of the type of services and facilities donated

In addition, the charity receives subsidised match day tickets from the football club which are recharged to the charity at £20,000 (2009 £20,000) for the year.
