Review of the business

The principal activity of the company is to arrange for the transportation by ship of coal, petcoke and liquified natural gas (LNG). The company arranges for the carriage of such products by contracting with ship owners or disponent owners.

On 12 April 2013, the company entered into two 20 year time charter agreements for the use of large LNG carriers with Milestone LNG Transport SA and Great Shale LNG Transport SA, two shipping companies jointly owned by SK Shipping Co and Marubeni Corporation. The expected start date of the commencement of operations is in 2017.

According to the Time Charter Agreement signed on 31 March 2014 between Total Gas & Power Chartering Limited and Yemen LNG Company Limited, one Yemen LNG vessel (Seri Balhaf) was sub chartered to the company from 1 April 2014 until 14 November 2014.

Future developments

It is the intention of the directors that the above business of the company will continue for the foreseeable future.

Principal risks and uncertainties

The principal risks and uncertainties of the company relate to the quality of the vessels which it contracts to use and the ongoing performance of its counterparties.

The charter agreements entered into by the company subject it to counterparty risks. The ability of our counterparties to perform their obligations under each contract will depend on a number of factors that are beyond our control and may include, among other things, general economic conditions and charter rates. Should a counterparty fail to honour its obligations the company could sustain significant losses which could have a material adverse effect on the performance of the business.

The chartering of an ocean-going vessel carries inherent risks. These risks include the possibility of marine accident, piracy, environmental accidents and business interruptions caused by mechanical failure, human error, war, terrorism, political action in various countries, labour strikes, or adverse weather conditions. Any of these circumstances or events could impact the finances of the company. The involvement of a vessel chartered by the company in an incident may result in the company facing claims under applicable international environmental conventions, laws and regulations, notwithstanding that the ship owner and or vessel operator would in principle primarily be liable. The company seeks to conduct its activities in such a manner so that there is little or minimal risks.

The directors present their annual report on the affairs of the company, together with the financial statements, for the year ended 31 December 2014.

Results and dividends

The profit after taxation amounted to \$1,023,000 for the year ended 31 December 2014 (2013 - \$650,000). The directors do not propose a dividend in respect of the financial year (2013 - nil).

As of 1 January 2014 the functional and presentational currency of the Company switched from Pound Sterling to US Dollar as a result of its predominantly US Dollar denominated transactions. 2014 financial results are thus presented in US Dollar and a re-statement of 2013 results has been prepared by the company.

Going Concern

The directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements.

Notes to the financial statements

at 31 December 2014

1. Accounting policies

A summary of the principal accounting policies, all of which have been applied consistently throughout the period, are set out below.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

As a result of the change of functional and presentational currency, a re-statement of previous years has been prepared by the company – see below in *Foreign Currency* section.

The company's financial statements are presented in US Dollar, which is also the Company's functional currency.

Going Concern

The directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements.

Revenue recognition

Revenue represents sales made by the company in the normal course of business and is shown net of VAT.

Cash flow statement

In accordance with paragraph 5 (a) of FRS1 (Revised) the company has not prepared a cash flow statement because it is a wholly owned subsidiary of a company whose consolidated financial statements include the company and are publicly available (see note 15).

Taxation

Corporation tax is provided on taxable profits at the average standard rate of corporation tax.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to receive more, tax. Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted at the balance sheet date.

Foreign currency

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate of exchange at the date of the transaction or, if hedged, at the forward contract rate. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the balance sheet date are reported at the rates of exchange prevailing at that date or, if appropriate, at the forward contract rate. All exchange differences are included in the profit and loss account.

As of 1 January 2014 the functional currency of the Company switched from Pound Sterling to US Dollar as a result of its predominantly US Dollar denominated transactions.

The UK sterling balances at 1 January 2014 were converted to US Dollar using the following foreign exchange rate: 1 USD = 0.6045 GBP. Comparatives for 2013 have also been presented in the new presentation currency of US Dollar. The comparatives apply the average US Dollar to UK sterling foreign exchange rate for 2013 of 1 USD = 0.6395 to the profit and loss account and the closing US Dollar to UK sterling rate of 1 USD = 0.6045 GBP to the balance sheet. The resulting difference on translation is presented in the statement of total recognised gains and losses.

2. Turnover

Turnover comprises the amounts derived from the provision of goods and services which fall within the company's ordinary activities, and is stated net of VAT. All turnover arises from continuing activities and is attributable to the income from arranging transportation by ship of coal, petcoke and liquefied natural gas.

3. Auditors remuneration

Audit fees of \$25,000 (2013 - \$23,000) are borne by another group company, Total Gas & Power Limited, and disclosed in that company's financial statements. No non-audit services were provided by the auditors.

4. Employee costs

The company has no employees.
