Trustees' Report for the year ended 30 June 2015

The Trustees, who are also the directors of the Charity for the purpose of the Companies Act 2006, present their annual report and accounts for the period ended 30 June 2015.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005), 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities'.

Structure, governance and management

The charity is a charitable company limited by guarantee and was incorporated on 21 October 2008. The trustees appoint a management committee to run and administer the day to day objects of the charity.

The trustees who served during the period are detailed on page 1.

Objectives and activities

The Charity is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. Its objects are for benefit of the public and are as follows:

- 1. The prevention and relief of poverty
- 2. The advancement of health and saving lives
- 3. The relief of those in need by reason of youth, age, ill- health, disability or financial hardship, or other disadvantage
- 4. To advance the Christian faith in accordance with the Liberation Theology

Our activities are detailed in the performance and achievement section.

Financial Review

The statement of financial activities for the period is set out on page 5 of the financial statements. The trustees are optimistic that the following years will generate similar net incoming resources.

Achievements and Performance

The charity focus during the year has been on the delivery of excellent service to the guests at the drop-ins; which are run from the Fulham Methodist Church and St Stephens Church in Shepherds Bush, in London.

At the core of the offering is a hot-meal, in a warm and inviting environment, with a community willing to welcome anyone who is homeless or vulnerably housed.

The charity has continued to develop other important offerings for the guests, such as;

- (I) Entertainment at the drop-in; film club, or arts and crafts (when available from donations)
- (II) The distribution of clothes, and other product donations (e.g., toothpaste etc.) from the corporate and individual supporters
- (III) Signposting to other agencies, e.g., by welcoming a monthly medical bus to the drop-ins. The charity has continued to see increased demands for the services and is now seeing c. 80 people per drop-in (vs. c. 50 / night in FY 13/14). This is unfortunately proof of the growing need for support to those who are homeless in our Capital.

The trustees actively review the major risks faced by the Charity and confirm that they have

Reserves policy

The policy of the trustees is to continue to maintain unrestricted reserves at a reasonable level to fulfill the objects of the Charity. The trustees have decided that the Charity should have minimum reserves of six months worth of expenditure.

As at 30 June 2015 readily accessible free reserves of the charity were £14,695 as shown in Balance Sheet.

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of accounts

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and best practice as laid down in the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities".

1.2 Incoming recources

Voluntary income and donations are included in incoming resources when they are receivable.

1.3 Tangible fixed assets for use by charity and depreciation
