The directors present their strategic report for the year ended 31 October 2014.

STRATEGIC REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2014

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

Sales turnover in the year under review was £23,794,755 compared with £32,178,989 last year. Sales turnover reflected the continued demand for the company's products and services. Net profit was £95,968 compared with the previous year £35,343 reflecting market conditions experienced during the financial year. Performance has grown year on year since incorporation and continues to grow at a steady rate.

Potential risks within the payroll industry would be determined by any laws or legislation changes within the UK PAYE structure. These could consist of certain allowable 'taxable expenses' being removed as a deductible or a fundamental change to how the PAYE system works in the contractor market.

To ensure that the company is always compliant we use employment lawyers who continually update and advise on our employment contracts on a quarterly basis. The company also uses tax and trust lawyers who advise and assist on any complex matters that may arise.

When reviewing our business practices we have a consideration on environmental factors and impacts. This process includes, but is not limited to:

A handful of detailed examples from 2014

Our business is required to host several secure websites and cloud based data stores. These online facilities provide both our current and new customers access to receive and upload business related information and facilitate our main interface to conduct internal administration (24 hours, seven days per week). We understand that hosting environments require a web server which consumes electricity thus having an impact on the environment. Following planned reviews of our utilisation of web technologies we continue to use only the services of 1 and 1 which is BEF (Clean Energy) certified and an EPA Green Power Partner, UKFast which is 100% carbon neutral and Hostgator which actually generates more green electricity than it uses. The use of highly efficient power supplies prevents the generation of unnecessary CO2 emissions.

One factor that many established business struggle to enforce is a paper-less environment. We are pleased to be able to confirm that in 2014/15 we have switched from paper based to electronic customer notification. To achieve this we have constructed an interactive online customer portal in which our customers are able to view pertinent information in relation to the services and products they purchase from our business (thus eliminating the need to print and post). Some additional points:

- o Significant efforts have been made to move all internal procedures into a digital library, thus removing the need to print.
- o Where paper is used we only load our printers with recycled paper and password prevent printing in full colour.

Our office has been equipped with LED lighting, automated on/off triggers and a policy to support natural lighting. In 2015 we will move to an office which has significantly higher levels of natural light.

In 2014 we opened dialogue with a local business to recycle all confidential shredding. This relationship continues and has a positive effect on our carbon footprint.

A final example of where we have taken into consideration our corporate responsibility in relation to waste is our negotiation and subsequent utilisation of second hand workstations, pedestal and office chairs. This will have had a positive effect on the environment.

By being at the forefront of technology utilisation and having the usual restrains of a small to medium size business we do find that attention to ecological matters can in most cases be a bi-product of other factors (such as cost, implementation effectiveness, customer centricity efforts etc...). Despite this we do remain focused on ensuring our business is as 'clean' and 'environmentally friendly' as is feasibly possible.
