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TRUSTEES' REPORT (INCLUDING DIRECTORS' REPORT) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2021

The trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2021.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the financial statements and comply with the charity's governing document, the Companies Act 2006 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (as amended for accounting periods commencing from 1 January 2016).

Objectives and activities

The Object of the Charity is to promote the welfare of older and disabled people living within the town of Tavistock and neighboring parishes.

In furtherance of these Objectives we aim:

To provide welfare services for those with a social or financial need.

To provide activities, social events, advice and information in appropriate locations within the "area of benefit".

To provide community transport for people with physical disabilities or restricted mobility to enable access to the community.

To provide community transport services for those living in isolated areas to enable social inclusion and access to the community.

Achievements and performance

Tavistock Area Support Services continues to be a local flagship supporting the older and disabled residents of Tavistock and the surrounding areas with the Anchorage Centre in Tavistock being the hub of the Charity's activities

The Charity was hugely impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic when the Anchorage Centre, outreach centres and the retail outlets had to close. Everyone pulled together to do whatever they could to assist the Trustees. All the standard monthly costs were suspended or minimized where possible and we began working on a Covid-19 secure protocol. The Trustees attended monthly Board meetings via Zoom with the General Manager in attendance.

The befriending/outreach service, which is externally funded, continued to run a limited Covid-19 secure service and all other staff were furloughed. The befriending service offered telephone contact and a doorstep approach was used for Outreach where restrictions or self-shielding were in place.

The community car transport service taking people to medical appointments operated a limited service with a small number of volunteers, as did the mobility loan scheme. As care home patients were accompanied by a carer they could not travel in a volunteer car so TASS minibuses were used with those clients being charged the car rate rather than the higher minibus rate. We also assisted with transporting people to receive their vaccinations. All leisure trips were cancelled.

The Anchorage Centre provided a facility and assisted Tavistock Locals Help. In line with Government guidelines the Centre was also used by as training venue by Community Links for sessions concerning domestic abuse and counselling for families. All leisure and activity groups ceased until restrictions lifted, though some groups with a wider advisory body were requested not to meet even then by their headquarters.

Rest a While was closed at times throughout the year in accordance with Government guidelines and was much missed by all, particularly its regular visitors. The facility continues to be supported by our Designated Fund and Tavistock Town Council.

The Charity Shop which had recently moved into the old "Spiral Staircase" premises in Market Street was closed in accordance with Government guidelines, resulting in a large decrease in our revenue. It reopened in late August but closed again for long periods twice more. We were pleased to announce in March that Debbie Holland, previously a volunteer, joined the staff as the Shop Co-Ordinator.

In October 2020 we were delighted to welcome Paula Anscomb as our new General Manager. She reinstigated a regular newsletter which is much appreciated by volunteers and clients and has developed a strong rapport with the trustees, staff, volunteers and clients.

Our volunteers continued their support of TASS, though there were fewer options for them to be involved in the Charity's services. They have recently been invited to re-connect events and we look forward to seeing them in their chosen roles.

The service users of TASS are mainly in the vulnerable categories and some experienced isolation and loneliness without their usual support from TASS particularly when the activities and trips were cancelled. When the flexible furlough scheme commenced and staff worked some hours from home it quickly became apparent that our existing Comms system was inadequate; this has now been addressed and staff and volunteers can use the new system to ensure that contact can be maintained without their being in the Centre.

As the main provider of support for older and disabled people living in our area we look forward to recommencing work with other agencies, building links with voluntary, private and statutory providers in the provision of services for older people and those with disabilities in out our locality. Our continued link with Devon County Council through Adult and Community and Transport Co-ordination Services and Livewell, together with the Clinical Commission Group enables us to build on existing services and we intend to develop new initiatives to support people to remain in their own homes and communities. We value partnership work and as a local Charity also work with West Devon CVS – Tavistock Area Wellbeing, Tavistock Dementia Alliance, Tavistock Locals Help, Devon Carers, Yelvercare, the Fire Brigade and the Police as well as other statutory, private and voluntary sector organizations in providing a complete service for older and disabled people living in Tavistock and surrounding areas. We are used as a referral point by Health and Social Services, local GP's, Hospitals, the Mental Health Team and other voluntary sector groups – we are a "Community Hub" making a difference to the lives of others. As part of this partnership TASS is the Voluntary Sector Representative on the Tavistock Community Health & Social Care Teams; a partner organization of the Citizens Advice Bureau; a member of the Devon Community Transport Group.

Funding and support continues from various sources including Private Donors, Legacies, Devon County Council, Westbank Community Health & Care and West Devon CVS. We received Grants in relation to Covid-19 from West Devon Borough Council Business Support in respect of the Anchorage Centre, Rest a While and the Charity Shop, Devon County Council Covid-19 Prompt Action Fund, Devon Community Foundation Coronavirus Response & Recovery Fund. We also receive funds from HMRC's Job Retention Scheme.

We are immensely grateful to our Staff, Volunteers and Clients for their continued support in so many ways and look forward to working with them in the years to come.

Financial review

The Trustees consider that due to the uncertain nature of their grant funding the charity should endeavor to maintain reserves sufficient to cover at least 12 months of anticipate expenditure. Sufficient provision is also required for capital replacements and maintenance of the Anchorage Centre.

Structure, governance and management

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

New Trustees with the required skill set are co-opted after interview and discussion with the members of the Board. Trustees stand for re-election annually at the AGM.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2021

1 Accounting policies

Charity information

Tavistock Area Support Services is a private company limited by guarantee incorporated in England and Wales. The registered office is The Anchorage Centre, Chapel Street, Tavistock, Devon, PL19 8AG, United Kingdom.

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the charity's governing document, the Companies Act 2006 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (as amended for accounting periods commencing from 1 January 2016). The charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The charity has taken advantage of the provisions in the SORP for charities applying FRS 102 Update Bulletin 1 not to prepare a Statement of Cash Flows.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the financial statements, the trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

1.3 Charitable funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of their charitable objectives.

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the financial statements.

1.4 Incoming resources

Income is recognised when the charity is legally entitled to it after any performance conditions have been met, the amounts can be measured reliably, and it is probable that income will be received.

Cash donations are recognised on receipt. Other donations are recognised once the charity has been notified of the donation, unless performance conditions require deferral of the amount. Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deeds of covenant is recognised at the time of the donation.

Legacies are recognised on receipt or otherwise if the charity has been notified of an impending distribution, the amount is known, and receipt is expected. If the amount is not known, the legacy is treated as a contingent asset.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2021

1 Accounting policies

(Continued)

1.5 Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are initially measured at cost and subsequently measured at cost or valuation, net of depreciation and any impairment losses.

Depreciation is recognised so as to write off the cost or valuation of assets less their residual values over their useful lives on the following bases:

Anchorage Centre 1% on cost (excluding land)
Leasehold improvements Straight line over 15 years
Plant and equipment 25% on reducing balance
Fixtures and fittings 25% on reducing balance
Motor vehicles 25% on reducing balance

The gain or loss arising on the disposal of an asset is determined as the difference between the sale proceeds and the carrying value of the asset, and is recognised in net income/(expenditure) for the year.

1.6 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

1.7 Financial instruments

The charity has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments Issues' of FRS 102 to all of its financial instruments.

Financial instruments are recognised in the charity's balance sheet when the charity becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Basic financial assets

Basic financial assets, which include debtors and cash and bank balances, are initially measured at transaction price including transaction costs and are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial assets classified as receivable within one year are not amortised.

Basic financial liabilities

Basic financial liabilities, including creditors and bank loans are initially recognised at transaction price unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial liabilities classified as payable within one year are not amortised.

Debt instruments are subsequently carried at amortised cost, using the effective interest rate method.

Trade creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of operations from suppliers. Amounts payable are classified as current liabilities if payment is due within one year or less. If not, they are presented as non-current liabilities. Trade creditors are recognised initially at transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

In 2014 the Trustees voted unanimously to designate funds to provide a facility within the town centre of Tavistock when the opportunity arose. It was agreed 'Rest A While' would be subsidised for the first 3 years by the designated fund. Furthermore the trustees voted unanimously to continue financially support the project on a rolling one-year basis. Within the year ended 31st March 2021, a net profit of £28,812 was realised in relation to the facility 'Rest A While'. The surplus in the year arises from the fact that Government grant support had exceeded expenditure incurred in the year.

There was also a gain on investment totalling £2,487.

As at 31st March 2021 the designated fund stood at £91,647.
