Governance and management

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and registered charity. It is operated under the rules of its memorandum and articles of association dated 29/1/2009. It has no share capital and the liability of each member in the event of winding-up is limited to £10.

Aims and objectives

To advance for the education of young people by the provision of training and work experience in Radio Presentation and Journalism with a view to enhancing their conditions of life, and to work towards a career in the media

Risk analysis

Our two main risks are financial, in that as a non-commercial organisation (we are not allowed to generate advertising revenue, for example, under OfCOM's current community broadcasting rules) we rely upon grants and awards from 'giving' bodies and funders, which in turn means seeking a steady supply of funds from them to keep the station operating, and in attracting sufficient volunteers (particularly for adult supervision) to enable the full schedule of young people's broadcasting to continue

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit

We provide a unique opportunity for self-development and training for young people aged 8 years old upwards in a markedly socio-economically deprived area, via the medium of FM community radio broadcasting. This allows them to develop life skills and personal skills for learning, training and eventual employability. For older children and young adults we also provide work placements for direct generic employment skills (not just in radio broadcasting). This is achieved through the vehicle of a community, non-profit-making FM broadcasting radio station (Takeover 106 9FM)

Summary of the main achievements during the period

- Community broadcasting FM station on air 24/7,
- Over 80 hours of live community broadcasting by young people,
- Over 50 young people engaged in radio production and presentation,
- Over 20 work placements/work experiences for young people and young adults

The charity's policy on reserves

The charity has no specific policy with regard to the level of reserves but we plan to accumulate a contingency fund during this financial year of £2000

Exemptions

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemptions available to small companies, including the audit exemption (see statement on balance sheet)

Responsibilities of the trustees

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity at the end of the year and of the surplus or deficiency for the year then ended

Basis of the preparation of the accounts
