Financial review

The charity's policy on reserves

The charity has no specific policy with regard to the level of reserves but we plan to accumulate a contingency fund during this financial year of £2,000.

Risk analysis

The main risks are short term funding and the continuity of funding. The directors are aware of the cash flow issues and work hard to maintain the running of the Radio through continued fundraising and short term loans from directors and others.

The recruitment of adult volunteers to support the activities of the children is also a risk.

Exemptions

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemptions available to small companies, including the audit exemption (see statement on balance sheet).

Responsibilities of the trustees

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity at the end of the year and of the surplus or deficiency for the year then ended.

In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to: select suitable accounting policies, as described on page 7, and then apply them on a consistent basis, making judgements and estimates that are prudent and reasonable. The members of the Committee must also prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.
