Strategic report

The directors present the audited Financial Statements of Crate Enterprises Limited for the year ended 31 March 2014.

Principal activity and review of the business

The group's principal activity is as a technology and digital media business specialising in content, tools, service provision, product comparison, knowledge management and agency services, to consumers and to businesses, for finance and other verticals.

Risks and uncertainties

The Company is exposed to risks and uncertainties relating to economic, operational and regulatory risks that are inherent in the environment in which the company will operate. The risks and uncertainties described below are not the only ones the company may face. Additional risks and uncertainties not presently known to the company or that the company's management currently deems minor or insignificant may also impair its business operations.

Economic:

- Dependence on financial service partners for product provision in the online product comparison market
- Dependence on network partners for distribution of some of the group's technical services

Operational:

- Loss of key staff within the management, development, editorial, marketing and support functions would impact the business, whilst replacements are identified and employed
- Technical failures related to the delivery of service

Regulatory:

• Further enhancements to the existing regulatory framework and reporting guidelines

Key performance indicators

The group's key performance indicators are considered to be aggregate product clicks from visitors across its distribution network, and customers' engagement with the knowledge management platform on the group's own sites and on its distribution network, and growth in the agency business. With regard to the group's key performance indicators, performance in the financial year and position at the end of the financial year is considered to be satisfactory, with further significant progress made on developing the technology and functionality underlying the knowledge management platform, and in expanding the business to business distribution network in the finance vertical.

Future developments

The group will continue to pursue a strategy of focused growth, leveraging its digital expertise for the benefit of its own consumers and for its expanding network of distribution partners.

Going concern

The directors are confident that, based on current forecasts and improving trading conditions, the group has sufficient cash resources to finance its operations until at least 31 March 2016 without requiring additional funds.

The Balance Sheet and related note 13 refer to longer term obligations to The Motley Fool Limited. The original due date for repayment of these obligations was 1 October 2012.

At 20 March 2015 The Motley Foot Limited had entered into agreement to restructure the debt as a preferred loan note with repayment date of 30 september 2017.

1. Accounting policies

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards. The principal accounting policies are set out below.

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis, on which further comment is made in the Strategic Report. Based on forecasts there are sufficient cash resources to finance the group in its operations until at least 31 March 2016.

The long-term debt obligations are summarised in note 13 to these accounts, and reference is made to these in the Directors' Report. As at 20 March 2015 an agreement was entered into to restructure the debt as a preferred loan note with a repayment date of 30 September 2017. In the absence of the restructured loan, The Motley Fool Limited have given assurances that they have no intention of recalling the loan for at least a year from the signing of these accounts.

Basis of consolidation

The consolidated financial statements incorporate the financial statements of the company and all group undertakings. These are adjusted, where appropriate to conform to group accounting policies. As a consolidated profit and loss account is published, a separate profit and loss account for the parent company is omitted from the group financial statements by virtue of Section 408 of the Companies Act 2006.

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at acquired value or cost. Such costs include costs directly attributable to making the asset capable of operating as intended.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation, less estimated residual value based on prices prevailing at the date of acquisition or revaluation, of each asset evenly over its expected useful life, as follows:

Computer equipment - 33% per annum
Furniture and fittings - 20% per annum
Office equipment - 20% per annum

Leasehold improvements - Over the length of the term of the lease

The carrying values of tangible fixed assets are reviewed for impairment when events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable.

Intangible assets

Purchased goodwill arising from the acquisition of the minority shareholding in LoveEating.com is calculated as the difference between the fair value of the purchase consideration and the fair value of the identifiable assets and liabilities at the date of acquisition. Goodwill is capitalised and classified as an asset on the balance sheet and amortised on a straight line basis over its estimated useful life of 3 years. Goodwill is reviewed for impairment when necessary if circumstances indicate that its carrying value may not be recoverable.

Strategic and material acquisitions of domain names are capitalised and amortised over the estimated useful life of 3 years.

Accounting policies (continued)

Deferred taxation

The payment of taxation is deferred or accelerated because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for accounting and taxation purposes. Full provision for deferred taxation is made under the liability method, without discounting, on all timing differences that have arisen, but not reversed by the balance sheet date, unless such provision is not permitted by Financial Reporting Standard 19.

Leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term.

Pension scheme

The company runs a defined contribution pension scheme, which all employees are entitled to join. The company normally directly contributes to the pension scheme, and any contributions made by the company are charged in the profit and loss account as they become payable.

2. Turnover

Advertising revenues are initially recognised based on the expected delivery of online advertising activity to be served on the company's website; any shortfall against expected delivery is quantified and deferred until it is actually served. Product, partnership and syndication revenues are recognised in accordance with the underlying contracts and periods of delivery of contracted products and services.

Turnover consists entirely of sales made in the United Kingdom, stated net of value added tax.
