REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2017

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2017. The trustees who served during the year and up to the date of this report and the company's principal address are set out on page 1.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

North West Legal Support Trust is a company limited by guarantee governed by the Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 19 March 2009. It is registered as a charity with the Charity Commission.

Organisational structure

The charity operates through the Trustees who meet on a regular basis. There are no employed staff or volunteers.

Recruitment and training of trustees

Trustees are recruited from within the legal profession and receive such training as is appropriate for a Charity of this size and type.

Reserves policy and risk management

The Trustees look to make grants on a regular basis and do not expect to hold significant sums for any length of time. A small balance will be maintained at all times and grants will only be made to those organisations which present as properly managed and administered. All meetings of the Trustees are properly minuted and cheques require two signatories.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Charitable objects

The Trust's objects, as laid out in the Trust Deed, are the provision of financial and other support to persons or organisations that provide, or organise or facilitate the provision of, legal advice or assistance (by way of representation or otherwise) which is free of charge, including such financial support as is envisaged by section 194 of the Legal Services Act 2007 (as amended or re-enacted from time to time), directly or indirectly to people who are in need of such assistance by reason of youth, age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage; and the promotion of such other purposes aimed at improving access to justice being exclusively charitable according to the law of England and Wales as the Trustees may from time to time determine. In shaping the trust's objects and keeping them updated for the year the trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit, including the guidance 'public benefit: running a charity (PB2)'.

Achievements and performance

The North West Legal Support Trust has now completed its eighth full year of operation and has continued to base its operations and fund raising throughout the North West.

As in previous years the main activity of the Trust has been to organise legal walks supported by all the organisations that provide legal advice whether in the professional sector, the voluntary sector and also including the Judiciary. All have participated in the walks which have been organised in Manchester, Liverpool, Carlisle and Preston so that a large part of the Region has been involved in our activities.

The main fundraising has been from those who have participated in the Walks in addition there have been quizzes, bake offs and other events which have raised funds.

In the year under review donations totalling £36,755 (2016 - £39,903) have been made to law centres, citizens advice bureau, and other organisations offering free legal advice within the region.

The Trustees once again wish to acknowledge the support received from the Access to Justice Foundation (ATJF) which has been of enormous help and also our thanks to all those individuals and organisations that have supported our work.

Incoming resources totalled £27,769 (2016 - £27,317).

In the future the Charity intends to continue with its policy of organising legal walks as its main fundraising event but also to endeavour to raise further funds from the legal profession.

Financial Review and going concern

At the end of the financial period in question the Charity held cash of £4,422 which is the level of reserves that the Trustees regard as appropriate to ensure that the Charity has sufficient funds to meet any current expenditure and to be in a position to make a grant if an urgent request for assistance was received. The trustees general policy is to hold funds only for so long as it takes to arrange the publication of a donations round, receive applications and to adjudicate on such applications after having received any further information requested.

The income received by the Charity is seasonal, the main funds being received in May, September and October and therefore the main grants rounds are usually in the middle and at the end of a calendar year.

During the period in question there was a duplication of payments due to the Charity from the ATJF which were then properly distributed by the charity in the form of grants. It was then discovered that the amount received was paid in error which has put the reserves at an overdrawn position at the year end. It was agreed that no repayment would be made but that the overpayment would be deducted from monies that would become due to the Charity from the ATJF in the next accounting period. This in fact enabled the Charity to make increased grants in the current financial year but which will be balanced by correspondingly fewer grants in the next financial period.

This error has had no impact on the Charities ability to trade as a going concern because of the agreement with ATJF and the knowledge that future income streams would redress the position in a short timescale.

The Charity adopts a policy of making as many grants as possible whilst retaining sufficient funds to meet its current and foreseeable liabilities.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2017

1. Accounting Policies

Company information

North West Legal Support Trust is a private company limited by guarantee and not having a share capital, it is incorporated in England and Wales. The registered office is c/o Gateley PLC, Ship Canal House, 98 King Street, Manchester, M2 4WU.

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key source estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

(a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements are prepared in pound sterling and all figures are rounded to the nearest whole pound.

North West Legal Support Trust meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note(s).

This is the first period the entity has prepared accounts in accordance with FRS 102 and the transition date is 1 September 2015.

(b) Reconciliation with previous Generally Accepted Accounting Practice In preparing the accounts, the trustees have considered whether in applying the accounting policies required by FRS 102 and the Charities SORP FRS 102 the restatement of comparative items were reviewed but no restatements were required.

(c) Preparation of the accounts on a going concern basis

The Trust reported a cash outflow of £11,758 for the year. The trustees are of the view that despite the general fund being overdrawn at the period end the charity is a going concern. The trustees have agreed with the third party who duplicated a remittance to them creating this overdrawn situation that the amount would not be repaid but would be matched against future monies received to them.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

(d) Incoming resources

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

(e) Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is classified under the following activity headings:

- Costs of generating voluntary income comprises those costs incurred by the charity in raising income.
- Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.
- Governance costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Irrecoverable VAT is charged as a cost against the activity for which the expenditure was incurred.

(f) Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available to spend on activities that further any of the purposes of charity. Designated funds are unrestricted funds of the charity which the trustees have decided at their discretion to set aside to use for a specific purpose. Restricted funds are donations which the donor has specified are to be solely used for particular areas of the Trust's work or for donations to specific third parties.

(g) Debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due after any trade discount offered. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2017

(h) Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and cash in hand includes cash and short term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

(i) Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing for any trade discounts due.

(j) Financial instruments

The trust only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value.

(k) Restatement of prior year

The comparative amounts at 31 August 2016 have been restated to reflect a £4,000 donation received and £4,000 governance cost not previously recognised. There is no change to the net expenditure or net assets as previously reported.
