5 EXCEPTIONAL WRITE OFFS

The following note was included under Contingent Liabilities in the financial statements for the year to 31 August 2011

"During the financial year and subsequent to the year end it has become apparent to the management committee that due to the shortcomings in the FFE funding module of the nursery management software initially purchased by the company, the contemporaneous recording of sales invoices and the related receipts from parents and/or carers has proven to be inaccurate. Accordingly an exercise has had to be undertaken to re-process this information from first principles including the retrospective reconciliation of invoices raised back to the daily registers

Instances have now been identified of potentially significant underpayments within the financial year in respect of unpaid invoices and the committee are actively seeking to reconcile those balances that existed at 31 August 2011, which are included in debtors, with amounts received since the year end Part of that exercise will then involve identifying amounts which remain unpaid and subsequent efforts to recover those amounts

It is anticipated that some of these amounts will not be able to be recovered but it is not possible at this time to estimate the quantum of such potential bad debts and accordingly no provision has been included in these financial statements in this regard

A new computer management system has now been installed and the management committee are confident that this problem will not recur in the future

The reconciliation work referred to above was completed by 31st August 2012 and as a result it was necessary to write off an amount of £10,168 to sales in the year to 31st August 2012 in respect of credit notes not posted as well as £4,696 in respect of bad debts

Had these adjustments not been necessary, the reported results for the year ended 31st August 2012 would have been improved by £14,864

It was not possible to accurately attribute this amount between the years ended 31st August 2012 and 31st August 2011 so no prior year adjustment was made in the last years accounts but the committee feel that a significant majority of the overall write off accrued in relation to the periods ending 31st August 2011 and before

This information is included to clarify the fact that the comparative figures may not be truly comparable with the current years results

General Descriptions of the Company's Activities and Impact

Following our vision, we continued to provide flexible affordable childcare for nursery children at our nursery in liver and we opened our new setting at the Evreham Community Centre which enabled the centre to offer childcare for adult education courses. Working with Bucks County Council the new setting also enabled us to increase provision for 2 year olds in the area and to provide much needed places for babies in the area. We also provided breakfast and after school clubs and holiday play schemes for primary school children in the livers, relocating our play schemes to the Evreham Centre to offer children more opportunities in the larger environment which in turn provided much needed revenue to support the continued operation of the Youth Centre for which we received no further funding

Tiny Toes Childcare at the Evreham Community Centre opened for operation in September 2013. The nursery accommodation required considerable renovations that were funded by a grant from Bucks County Council and were completed in January 2013. We opened our baby room shortly afterwards enabling us to offer childcare to our youngest residents.

In August 2013 we moved our Play Schemes to the Youth Centre at the Evreham and they have continued to go from strength to strength. We were able to provide some funded places through the generosity of LAF Funding. We worked closely with local schools to identify children who were in receipt of school meals to be able to offer funded places. We continued to operate the Youth Centre on Friday nights each week and have seen numbers of young people attending the centre grow throughout the year.

We continued to work with Brunel University and with the support of a Digital Media and Engineering student made considerable improvements to our website and social media platforms to help us communicate with parents better as where parents and early years settings work closely together children do better
