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#### 1 Introduction

As you will be aware from my proposals sent to creditors on 16 January 2012, I was appointed Administrator of Absolute Freight Solutions Limited ("the Company") on 23 November 2011 by the Directors of the Company

This report is prepared pursuant to Insolvency Rule 2 110 and is the Administrator's final progress report on the Administration I do not intend to duplicate the detailed background information provided in my proposals and previous reports sent to creditors, although if you require further copies, please contact this office. Please find the Statutory Information at Appendix 1.

The purpose of this report is to provide creditors of the Company an update on the completion of the Administration prior to its dissolution.

#### 2 Purpose and Conclusion of Administration

In my proposals I detailed my intention to perform my functions in relation to the Company with the objective set out in Paragraph 3(1)(c) "to realise property in order to make a distribution to one or more secured or preferential creditors"

As you will recall from my previous progress reports, the Company did not trade in Administration as it did not have a large enough order book to sustain cash flow for a period of trading during an Administration whilst a purchaser was sought. Therefore, trading and the first purpose of Administration were not possible. The book debts were financed by Factor 21 Plc ("F21") and it was considered that these may be more collectable in Administration than Liquidation due to continuity of service by a connected company, which meant the factoring company's debt would be more easily paid. It was not certain that there would be funds for unsecured creditors and so I did not state the second purpose of Administration was achievable. I therefore considered that the third purpose of the Administration could be met.

As stated in my proposals and my previous report, I sold the goodwill, fixtures, fittings and office equipment to Absolute Logistics Limited ("Logistics") which has directors and shareholders in common with the Company. This was disclosed in the last progress report. These assets were valued by an independent valuer, Cuthbert and Kingsley, a member of the National Association of Valuers and Auctioneers. This independent valuation showed that the in-situ valuation for office equipment was £630 and plant and machinery was £100. The monies for these assets have been received in full. There are no further assets to realise.

To enable Logistics to continue to trade and remain in a position to complete the payment for the sale of the business and assets, I issued a License to Occupy to Logistics in respect of the Company's trading premises at Lower Street, Baylham. This license has now lapsed and the Company and Logistics handed the keys back to the landlord when they took possession. There are no further issues to conclude

A Statement of Affairs was signed by the directors and filed at Companies House on 14 March 2012. This was also circulated to creditors in my previous progress report which was sent to creditors on 21 December 2012.

#### 3 Administrator's Receipts and Payments

Attached at Appendix 2 is the Receipts and Payments account for the period 23 November 2012 to 24 April 2013 and since the date of my appointment

A total of £994 70 has been received in respect of the VAT refund from F21's termination charges

Furthermore, a payment of £580 has been made in respect of legal fees incurred in helping terminate the lease and dealings with the landlord

There are no further assets to realise.

#### 4 Administrator's Remuneration

At the initial meeting of creditors held on 1 February 2012, creditors resolved that

- a) the Administrator be authorised to draw his fees of £15,000 and disbursements that relate to the period prior to his appointment,
- b) that the basis of the Administrator's remuneration be fixed by reference to the time properly spent by me and my staff in managing the Administration

To date I have drawn £2,000 of my pre appointment fees.

Attached at Appendices 3 and 4 are Statement of Insolvency Practice 9 time and cost summanes which provide details of the activity costs incurred by staff grade during this period and for the period of my appointment. My time costs for the period 23 November 2012 to 24 April 2013 are £3,485 representing 27 10 hours at an average of £128.60 per hour. My total time costs since my appointment to 24 April 2013 total £25,120, representing 180 hours at an average of £139.56 per hour. I have drawn £3,235.52 of these costs, the remainder are irrecoverable.

I have further incurred expenses in performing my duties to date of £1,704 70, of which £1,679 18 has been drawn. These relate to external report printing and copying costs,

Companies House searches, agent's fees for a valuation of the Company's lease and the collection of the Company's books and records, statutory advertising costs and statutory insurance bond. The remainder is irrecoverable.

In accordance with Rule 2 48A, a secured creditor or an unsecured creditor with the concurrence of at least 5% in value of unsecured creditors may make a request in writing to the Administrator's office for further information regarding remuneration or expenses.

#### 5 Estimated Outcome for Creditors

In my proposals I anticipated that there may be funds available for unsecured creditors should there be a surplus available from the collection of the book debts. As you will recall from my previous report, the book debts are secured by an assignment and charge held by F21, who have been collecting the book debts. After discussions with F21 the recoverable funds are insufficient to repay F21 in full. During my investigations into the Company's affairs, I have found no further assets that may be realised for the benefit of creditors. Due to the level of costs incurred after the date of Administration, there are no funds available for a distribution to any class of creditors.

#### 6 Ending the Administration

Under the Enterprise Act 2002, all Administrations automatically come to an end after one year, unless an extension is granted by Court or with the consent of creditors. As you will recall from my report to creditors dated 14 November 2012 an extension of 6 months was approved by the secured and unsecured creditors of the Company

As the Company holds no further assets and there are insufficient funds in the Administration available for unsecured creditors, I have filed Form 2 35B "Notice of Move from Administration to Dissolution", together with this final report, with the Registrar of Companies. The Administration and my appointment will end on the day that Form 2 35B is registered by the Registrar of Companies.

At the initial creditors' meeting in which my proposals were approved, creditors approved the resolution that I as Administrator, be discharged from liability under Paragraph 98 of Schedule B1 to the Act immediately upon my appointment of Administrator ceasing to have effect

This is the final report you will receive on the Administration
