1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The full financial statements, from which these abbreviated accounts have been extracted, have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (Effective April 2008).

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6 Limitation liability agreement

On 18 March 2015 the members approved the resolution for the company to enter into a Limitation Liability Agreement with its Auditors. This agreement is limited to the period of one year from the date of approval by the members.

A summary of the principal terms is that the agreement limits the amount of any liability owed to the Company by the Auditor in respect of negligence, default, breach of duty or trust, occurring in the course of the audit of these accounts of which the auditor may be guilty. The agreement will not limit the amount of Auditor liability for fraud or dishonesty by the auditor or any other liability that cannot be excluded or restricted by applicable laws or regulations. The maximum amount of the Auditor's Liability to the company shall not exceed £1,000,000. In accordance with section 537 of the Companies Act 2006 this agreement does not limit the Auditor's liability to less than that which would be fair and reasonable as so determined in accordance with that section. The Auditor in this case refers to RWB CA Limited and its directors, employees, consultants and any other person for whom RWB CA Limited is vicariously liable.

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
