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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2016

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2016. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (the FRSSE) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objects

The charity's objects are to promote any charitable purpose for the benefit of the community in Craven and Harrogate local government districts, by the advancement of education, the protection and preservation of health and the relief of poverty, sickness and distress.

Objectives, Strategies and Activities for the Year

Citizens Advice Craven and Harrogate Districts aims to provide free, confidential, impartial and independent advice and information for the benefit of the local community, to exercise a responsible influence on the development of social policies and services and to ensure individuals do not suffer through a lack of knowledge or an inability to express their needs effectively.

In addition to the continuing provision of high quality advisory services to the local community the primary objectives for the year were to extend the means of service provision to include telephone advice, and to establish a specialist debt advisory service staffed by appropriately qualified personnel.

To obtain the necessary funding to provide the additional services applications were made to various local and national providers of community finance. Advertisements were placed in the local press for advisory staff both as paid employees and volunteers, induction and training being provided to the extent that necessary knowledge and skills were not pre-existing.

Public benefit

The trustees have paid due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit in deciding the activities undertaken by the local Citizens Advice during the year. The trustees are satisfied that the information provided in the report and accounts meets the public benefit reporting requirements.

The principal activity of Citizens Advice Craven and Harrogate Districts remained the provision of free, confidential, independent and impartial advice, information and counsel for members of the public. This is provided through 2 offices in the borough of Harrogate at Ripon and Harrogate and one in the district of Craven at Skipton as well as outreach services at Settle, Bentham and Ingleton. In addition to generalist advice the following specialist advisory services were provided:

- i) Specialist Advice for Mental Health Users
- ii) Specialist Welfare Benefit and Debt provision
- iii) Housing advice at Court
- iv) Right to Know Project
- v) Craven Volunteer Advice Network

Advisory services were provided through face-to-face consultations, telephone advice lines, email and various outreach services in the Craven District.

Contribution of Volunteers

The charity receives help and support in the form of voluntary assistance in advising the public and administering the charity.

75 volunteers contributed approximately 40,000 hours of work to the bureau during the year. We estimate the value of this help at £723,000 in respect of the current year.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The services continued in the three main locations of Skipton, Harrogate and Ripon. There were also outreach services in Settle, Bentham and Ingleton, home visiting services in all the offices and specialist representation in court in Harrogate and in the Employment Tribunal in Leeds.

The serviced saw 5024 new clients on average 2.4 times.

Major changes were the notice received to leave the Ripon office which took place on 31st March. This was due to the unsafe nature of the building. Also we received notice of a reduction in our funding from Harrogate Borough Council from £114,000 per annum to £70,000 per annum for the next three years.

Investment Activities

The charity does not currently hold material investments.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

Incoming resources in the year were £444,539 (2014/2015 £ 501,804). Of this £213,562 (2014/2015 £285,685) related to project restricted activities.

A deficit of £50,274 was made in the current year (2014/2015 Surplus £107,621.). At 31 March 2016 total reserves were £441,452 of which £232,175 represented unrestricted funds (2014/2015 £216,472).

Principal funding sources

The Directors extend their gratitude to Craven District Council and Harrogate Borough Council and North Yorkshire County Council who continued to support the core operating capacity of the charity. Additionally project-specific funding was received from North Yorkshire County Council for mental health advice and disability information and from MASDAP via Citizens Advice for debt advice.

The charity did not have any borrowings from either providers of funding or other sources at the balance sheet date.

Investment policy

As required in its Memorandum in furtherance of its objects, and for no other purposes, the Company has the power to invest the monies of the Company not immediately required for its purposes in or upon such investments, securities or property as may be thought fit, subject nevertheless to such conditions and such consents as may for the time being be imposed or required by law.

Reserves policy

Citizens Advice Anywhere is required to ensure that free monies are available in each financial year to meet any reasonable foreseeable contingency. The local Citizens Advice will maintain a projection of income for at least 3 years ahead and will ensure that this continues to be derived from as wide a variety of sources possible They will take all necessary steps to ensure that at no time within this period would it be possible for the cessation of one or more funding streams to present so serious a challenge to the future of the organisation that it could not be managed so as to continue to provide a best value advice service.

In reviewing the potential costs that could arise should a significant reduction in income be incurred the Trustees have determined that 'free' reserves of approximately £200,000 should be maintained which is equal to 6 months normal operating expenditure.

The reasons for holding particular reserves are outlined in note 14.

Designated funds

Redundancy reserve - these reserves have been designated by the trustees for the purposes of covering redundancy costs totalling £70,000.

Taxation - the charity is currently exempt from corporation tax.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Funds in deficit

No funds were in deficit at the balance sheet date.

FUTURE PLANS

Citizens Advice Craven and Harrogate Districts aims to continually improve access to its service, and intends to extend its service to an even wider number of the community through increased provision of telephone advice and additional outreach locations.

The trustees aim to spend within their revenue funding and this will necessitate a restructure of the posts funded from the core.

The Trustees are aware that their funding from North Yorkshire County Council will have to be tendered for as part of Citizens Advice North Yorkshire and York in 2016 for April 2017. During the course of 2016 - 17 they will endeavour to make contingency plans for any changes in funding.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

Craven and Harrogate Districts Citizens Advice Bureau is a registered charity and a company limited by guarantee. Craven and Harrogate Districts Citizens Advice Bureau is also known and referred to as Citizens Advice Craven and Harrogate Districts. The maximum liability of each member is limited to £1. At 31 March 2016 the company had 6 members (2016). Citizens Advice Anywhere is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Craven and Harrogate Districts Citizens Advice Bureau was incorporated as a company limited by guarantee on 1st October 2009. The charity commenced operations on 1st October at which date the assets and liabilities of the unincorporated Harrogate Citizens Advice Bureau were acquired.

The company changed its name to Craven and Harrogate Districts Citizens Advice Bureau on 26th September 2014 and on 1st October 2014 it merged with Ripon Citizens Advice Bureau and Craven Citizens Advice Bureau and at this date acquired their assets and liabilities.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Trustees, who are also Directors of the Company, are elected from the local community An Elections Committee, made up of Trustees, the Company Secretary and chaired by the Chair is established to oversee the elections process for Board appointments. A separate process agreed by the Trustee Board is followed for the election of the Chair.

Induction and training of new trustees

Newly appointed Trustees are provided with a comprehensive induction to Citizens Advice Anywhere through the provision of training courses and mentoring by established trustees.

Orgainsational Structure

Citizens Advice Anywhere is governed by its Trustee Board which is responsible for setting the strategic direction of the organisation and the policy of the charity. The Trustees carry the ultimate responsibility for the conduct of Citizens Advice Craven and Harrogate Districts and for ensuring that the charity satisfies its legal and contractual obligations. Trustees meet as a minimum quarterly and delegate the day-to-day operation of the organisation to senior management. The Trustee Board is independent from management. A register of members' interests is maintained at the registered office, and is available to the public.

Related parties

Citizens Advice Craven and Harrogate Districts is a member of Citizens Advice, the operating name of the National Association of Citizens Advice Bureaux, which provides a framework for standards of advice and casework management as well as monitoring progress against these standards. Operating policies are independently determined by the Trustee Board of Citizens Advice Craven and Harrogate Districts in order to fulfil its charitable objects and comply with the national membership requirements.

The charity also co-operates and liaises with a number of other advisory services, local charities and social services departments on behalf of clients. Where one of the trustees holds the position of trustee/director of another charity they may be involved in discussions regarding that other charity but not in the ultimate decision-making process.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Major risks

Citizens Advice Craven and Harrogate Districts has worked on a Corporate Risk Management exercise. A risk management strategy and risk register were agreed by the Trustee Board. The Trustees recognise that any major risks to which to which the charity is exposed need to be reviewed and systems put in place to mitigate those risks. To that end Citizens Advice Anywhere is continually monitoring and managing its risk, reviewing the corporate risk register and ensuring action plans are in place to mitigate its key risks.

Included in external risks is that of the loss of funding. The effects of this have been minimised by the procedures in place, which have resulted in funding being secured from a variety of sources. The charity continues to seek to diversify its funding sources. Internal risks are minimised by the implementation of procedures for authorisation of all transactions and projects and to ensure consistent quality of delivery for all operational aspects of the charitable company. These procedures are periodically reviewed to ensure that they still meet the needs of the charity.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRSSE) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (the FRSSE) (effective 1 January 2015)', the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015) and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold property - in accordance with the property
Fixtures and fittings - 25% on cost

Computer equipment - 33% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Premises
