Structure, governance and management

Governing document

Action Foundation is a company limited by guarantee, governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. The charitable company was incorporated on 27th June 2009 with registration number is 6946097. It is registered as a charity with the Charity Commission, number 1132051. There are currently four members, each of whom agree to contribute £1 in the event of the charitable company winding up.

Appointment and retirement of directors

The number and skills of directors is regularly reviewed and any gaps identified. Existing members then approach suitable candidates who are invited to attend meetings, initially as observers, before being formally invited to join the board following discussion and references. Directors shall hold office for a term of four years but shall be eligible to hold office for further terms of four years indefinitely.

Organisation

The charitable company is organised so that the directors meet regularly to review its affairs and set objectives. There is a part-time chief executive to manage day to day activities. There is a close relationship for advice and structures with City Church, Newcastle who also provide some of our funding, office space and facilities.

Risk management

The directors have agreed to examine, on an annual basis, the major risks faced by the charitable company. These risks include financial, operational and regulatory. Systems are in place to minimise these risks, including preparation of regular financial reports, maintenance of insurance and management reviews. These systems are reviewed periodically to ensure the needs of the charitable company are being met.

Objectives and activities

The charitable company's objects are

- The prevention and/or relief of poverty by the provision of advice and assistance to the public including to refugees, asylum seekers, migrant workers and their dependents particularly by the provision of education and training with a view to facilitating job creation and work opportunities for such persons and by the provision of housing and accommodation for persons in need of such provision and the improvement of housing and living conditions for such persons,
- 2 The advancement of education (including mental, physical, social and health education) by the provision of schooling, training and advisory services,
- 3 The relief of those in need by reason of their youth, age, ill health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage, particularly by supporting or assisting persons suffering or recovering from substance abuse, eating disorders, prostitution or persons in similar situations who are in need of charitable support, and
- 4 The promotion of human rights particularly by the support of those suffering from human rights abuses and/or issues of injustice perpetrated by individuals, groups or governments on the grounds of race, religion, colour, sex, sexual orientation, disability, political views/activities, ethnicity or medical or other condition

The main activities undertaken in relation to these objects are

- Action Housing providing free accommodation and support to destitute asylum seekers
- Action Language providing free English Language classes to asylum seekers, refugees and other migrants that cannot reasonably access classes elsewhere

We are also actively exploring the possibility of starting a project that befriends and supports the elderly

In setting our objectives and planning our activities, the directors have given careful consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit. All of the directors are unpaid volunteers to ensure that all available funds are used to support our service users

Achievements and performance

For much of this year the CEO has been focussed on changing our charitable status from being part of Open Door (North East) to becoming our own charity called Action Foundation. This took longer than anticipated but was completed in October 2009 when a marketing exercise to communicate the changes and rebranding was successfully conducted. With the aim of achieving clarity, this report and the attached financial statements reflect the results of all our activities in the year.

Action Housing had a good year of being able to move more people on to other statutory supported accommodation than in previous years due to more intensive casework to explore our residents' other options. During the year we housed 18 single adults from eleven different nations, (13 men and 5 women). It was particularly gratifying to support one particular lady from DRC who after three years of staying in one of our houses finally managed to get refugee status in Canada where she moved in March to join her husband and children. One of our residents managed to overturn a decision that refused him Social Services support with the help of an organisation called 'The Medical Foundation for the Care of Victims of Torture'. This was a test case that potentially affects many other decisions made by social services to deny care to asylum seekers and according to the General Manager of The Medical Foundation, would have not be possible were it not for our support

The English School (Action Language) continues to thrive with over 30 learners regularly attending each class twice a week with approximately 15 volunteers regularly involved. We were reminded of the value of providing such a supportive and friendly environment in which to learn English when one of our learners, who could not or would not speak at all when she first arrived, performed a role play in English in front of the whole class. This turn-around is amazing, and it is in no small part down to the patient and friendly way so many of our volunteers care for our learners simply by encouraging them as they take small steps of progress in both confidence and communication. Recently we asked our learners to fill in a questionnaire to assess the outcomes of our service 71% feel better able to access other services as a result of the classes and 79% feel that they were beginning to belong more to the community as a result of attending the classes.

We have also started a social enterprise this year teaching English to Refugee's that are trying to gain employment in the NHS on behalf of an organisation called 'Refugee Health Care Professionals' This contract has been very helpful in generating unrestricted income to support our charitable activities and together with some consultancy work done by Julian Prior (CEO) for the Centre for Social Justice in London approximately 11% of our income was generated through social enterprise

However, this year has also been very challenging. We have had to evict one of our residents for repeated antisocial behaviour and for some of our residents the endless uncertainty of their legal status in the UK is starting to take it's toll on their mental health. We have been working closely with mental health services to support our residents, however, there is a limit to what they can do as the solution to many of their problems is resolving their uncertain legal status in the UK. Julian Prior has had numerous meetings with UKBA and the shadow Immigration Minister, Damien Green to lobby for changes to the asylum system that make for a more humane and just system and whilst being receptive to some of his proposals (previously published in 'Asylum Matters – Restoring Trust in the UK. Asylum System' by The Centre for Social Justice) it remains to be seen how the forthcoming general election will impact on the treatment of asylum seekers.

Financial review

Financially it has also been a tough year. Our income dropped in the last financial year compared to the previous year, but our expenditure has increased significantly. This is due mainly to the growth of the services provided by the organisation, costs and disruption caused in changing charitable status, the reduction of time spent by the CEO working for the charity and the difficult global economic conditions. This deficit was possible due to the healthy reserves previously accumulated, however, this year our financial goal is to redress the imbalance of income/expenditure experienced last year and develop our social enterprise to increase unrestricted funds to develop the charity's services. This will be achieved by increasing the amount of time that the CEO spends raising funds and developing the charity's services.

We are currently funded through a combination of charitable trust grants (71%), donations (18%) and some fee income we receive from consultancy work and from our new social enterprise (11%)

To support our fundraising efforts from charitable trusts and grant funding bodies we have started working with Felton Fundraising, a fundraising organisation specialising in small charitable social care organisations. They started working for us in September 2009 and have been adding some real value to our fundraising efforts.

During the year we have received grants from the following organisations, Lankelly Chase, The Alvor Trust, The Joseph Rank Trust, City Church Newcastle, Your Homes Newcastle, The Barbour Trust, The Joicey Trust, The Sir James Knott Charitable Trust, The Triangle 1949 Trust, The R W Mann Trust, The Souter Charitable Trust and The Hadrian Trust We are extremely grateful for their support

Our CEO, Julian Prior also cycled the Hadrian's Way Coast to Coast together with several others to raise sponsorship for Action Foundation in May 2009 and raised £2,562 77

Statement of the directors' responsibilities in relation to the financial statements

The directors are responsible for preparing the annual report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial period. Under that law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). - prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the charitable company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

1. Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) In preparing the financial statements the charitable company follows best practice as laid down in the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (SORP 2005)

1.2 Incoming resources

Income generated by the charitable company is accounted for on an accruals basis. Voluntary income is accounted for as received by the company

1.3 Value added tax

Value added tax is not recoverable by the charitable company, and as such is included in the relevant costs in the Statement of Financial Activities

1.4 Classification of expenditure

Funds raising costs represent amounts paid to an independent fundraising concern to assist in raising unrestricted funds for core activities

Costs of charitable activities include all staff costs incurred in the period in providing services together with the incidental costs of service provision

Governance costs relate to legal costs in forming the company and the costs of preparing statutory reports and holding annual meetings

1.5 Restricted funds

Restricted funds are to be used for specified purposes as laid down by the donor Expenditure which meets these criteria is identified to the fund
