# 1 Accounting policies

## 1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

### 1.2 Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), which have been applied consistently (except as otherwise stated).

#### 1.3 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods and services net of VAT and trade discounts.

#### 1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Land and buildings Leasehold

2 - 6 years straight line

Plant and machinery

2 - 6 years straight line

Fixtures, fittings & equipment

2 - 6 years straight line

# 1.5 Leasing

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term.

#### 1.6 Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at cost less provision for diminution in value.

### 1.7 Revenue recognition

Turnover represents revenue earned under contracts to provide services. Revenue is recognised as earned when, and to the extent that, the company obtains the right to consideration in exchange for its performance under these contracts. It is measured at the fair value of the right to consideration, which represents amounts chargeable to clients, including expenses and disbursements but excluding value added tax.

Revenue is generally recognised as contract activity progresses so that for incomplete contracts it reflects the partial performance of the contractual obligations. For such contracts the amount of revenue reflects the accrual of the right to consideration by reference to the value of work performed. Revenue not billed to clients is included in debtors and payments on account in excess of the relevant amount of revenue are included in creditors.

Fee income that is contingent on events outside the control of the company is recognised when the contingent event occurs.

# 1.8 Foreign currency translation

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to profit and loss account.

#### 1.9 Group accounts

The financial statements present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not about its group. The company has not prepared group accounts as it is exempt from the requirement to do so by section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 as it is a subsidiary undertaking of Stink Limited, a company incorporated in England and Wales, and is included in the consolidated accounts of that company.

#### 1.10 Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided at appropriate rates on all timing differences using the liability method only to the extent that, in the opinion of the director, there is a reasonable probability that a liability or asset will crystallise in the foreseeable future.

#### 4 Ultimate parent company

The immediate controlling company is Stink Limited, a company incorporated in England and Wales. The ultimate controlling company is Stillking Films Holdings Limited, a company incorporated in Jersey. The smallest group in which the accounts are consolidated are those of Stink Limited, and the largest group in which the accounts are consolidated are those of the ultimate controlling company.

## 5 Related party relationships and transactions

The company has taken advantage of the exemption available in FRS 8 "Related party disclosures" whereby it has not disclosed transactions with any wholly owned subsidiary undertaking.

During the year, the company was invoiced £154,803 (2012: £69,747) by Stink Limited, the company's immediate controlling party. At the balance sheet date, the company owed £118,692 (2012: £69,747).

During the year the company invoiced £155,937 to Stink France, at the year end £6,051 (2012: £nil) was still outstanding as a debtor.

During the year, the company was invoiced £921 by Stink GMbH, a fellow subsidiary of Stink Limited. There were no amounts outstanding at the year end.

During the year the company paid a profit share of £31,250 to Mark Pytlik, a director of Stink Digital US.

No amounts have been provided for or written off during the year in respect of these balances.
