These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Section 1A (Small Entities) of Financial Reporting Standard 102

Turnover policy

Turnover is recognised at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable for goods provided in thenormal course of business, and is shown net of VAT.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation policy
