During this period PZ Conservation CIC has overseen internships for graduate book conservators, which have been generously sponsored by the Heritage Lottery Fund's "Skills for the Future" programme. An application was made to extend this project in February 2012 and this has been accepted by the HLF. We were also able to sponsor a shorter, three month internship from our own resources.

One fifth of all interns' time is devoted to supporting local heritage organizations and outreach activities. Visits to the conservation studio have been made from pupils at Cape Cornwall School, members of Cornwall Museums Group, curators and exhibitors from The Exchange and Newlyn Galleries, PRINT Exhibition, volunteers from the Exchange and Newlyn Galleries and volunteers from the Morrab Library

Working closely with the Cornwall Museum Development Officers and Cornwall Archives Network we were able to provide three days of preservation training to groups of volunteers and staff of local heritage organizations and plan for future training events. The interns have also undertaken practical conservation projects for Bodmin Town Museum and the Treglown bequest to Helston Museum and provide condition reports to Porthcurno Telegraph Museum Archive.

Other outreach activities included participating in a book making project for the Exchange Gallery as part of the "Night at the Museum" national event, running a week long project space on bookmaking as part of the gallery's PRINT Exhibition, delivering a lecture on book conservation at the Penzance Literary Festival and demonstrations at Cornwall Record Office at their open day. One of our interns presented a paper at the "Care and Conservation of Manuscripts Conference" in Copenhagen and a poster about her internship for the Institute of Conservation's website. PZ Conservation CIC participated the Heritage Lottery Fund and Radcliffe Trust meeting on funding needs in the heritage sector. In December 2011, director Elizabeth Neville was appointed a trustee of the Institute of Conservation.
