Structure, governance and management

The Charity is a company limited by guarantee with company registration number 07272710, it is also a registered charity with charity registration number 1138412. A memorandum and Articles govern the charity

The organisation has a clearly defined structure, which enables members to actively participate in the running of the organisation as members of elected Management Committee This governing body has responsibility for policy and overall management. The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks

The Charity's objectives are the prevention or relief of poverty through the promotion of high quality microfinance institutions in Sub-Saharan Africa and Asia

Operational Set up

The main priority for the period ended 31 May 2011 was to ensure that i) the Charity legal and corporate framework would be well established and its vision and mission fully understood and approved by its board and staff, ii) by end Q2-2011, the Charity would be ready to receive funding from sponsors through various channels (direct bank payments, online payments, text message, gift aid, CAF) and iii) the Charity's operational focus in its countries of operations would be limited to two greenfields (see below)

The first two greenfields are i) AMIL in the slums of Mumbai, India and ii) AMZ in the rural countryside of the Central and Western provinces of Zambia. The Charity had Allen & Overy review its proposed funding and investment policy with regard to the greenfields in general. The review was positive and concluded that any equity investment in the greenfields could be undertaken as a Programme Related Investment (PRI). We expect the first such PRI to be concluded in the course of next financial year. This will require the Charity to i) include in the annual accounts an explanation of its approach to PRI and a statement of how this approach has been applied, ii) report the PRI in the balance sheet at the amount invested (cost) less impairment and, in the case of loans, any amounts repaid.

Achievements and performance

The trustees consider that the performance of the charity this year has been most satisfactory

Financial review

The Statement Of Financial Acticities shows an income for the year of £58,770 76 and total expenditure of £36,923 12. The net assets of the charity as at 31 May 2011 was £21,847 64.

Given that the Charity was incorporated in June 2010 and registered by the UK Charity Commission in October 2010, its expenses for the year ended 31 May 2011 were related to ensuring a successful operational set-up. The charity is now established and will focus on securing new donations and launching its first live projects.
