Report of the trustees

For the year ended 31 August 2015

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2015.

Legal and administration information set out on page 1 forms part of this report. The financial statements comply with current statutory requirement, the Trust Deed and the Statement of Recommended Practice - Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Objects

The principal objects of the charity are to enhance the development and education of children under statutory school age by encouraging parents to understand and provide for the needs of their children through community groups.

The Nursery aims to provide a safe, secure and stimulating environment, and works within a framework which ensures equality of opportunity for all children and families.

Organisation structure

Overall management of the charity is the responsibility of the trustees who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the constitution. Day to day project activity is managed and carried out by staff.

Review of activities

The numbers of children attending in this year has been good. We had 34 children at the end of the school year. 16 children left with 14 going to the School and 2 moving away from the area. We had 18 children left to then start with us in September.

We had 5 members of staff and 1 bank member at the start of the year with 2 leaving and then our bank member of staff joined our team. So we ended the school year with 4 members of staff.

We have enjoyed looking at colours, numbers, a range of festivals and celebrations, life cycles including watching some caterpillars turn into butterflies and then setting them free and many more themes. We have enjoyed our visits into school which helps with the transition into school.

Future developments

The key activities for the forthcoming year at Abacus focus on our ability to continue to offer a nursery provision. The main focus of the committee will be to secure the required funding and agreements that will enable us to hopefully begin the process of replacing our existing building.

The trustees aim to maintain reserves at a level that would cover redundancy payments in the event of closure. 1. Accounting policies

- a) The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities and follow the recommendations in Statement of Recommended Practice - Accounting and Reporting by Charities (Revised in 2005).
- b) Voluntary income is received by way of donations and gifts and is recognised in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Intangible income is recognised as an incoming resource where the provider of the service has incurred a financial cost. Volunteer time is not included in the financial statements.
- c) Grants including grants for the purchase of fixed assets are recognised in full in the statement of financial activities in the year in which they are received or the year in which they are receivable, whichever is the earlier, unless they relate to a specified future period, in which case they are deferred.
- d) Unrestricted funds are donations and other income received or generated for the charitable purposes.
- e) Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor. Expenditure which meets these criteria is charged to the fund.
