Report of the trustees

For the year ended 31 December 2012

The trustees present their report and the unaudited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2012

Reference and administrative information set out on page 1 forms part of this report. The financial statements comply with current statutory requirements, the memorandum and articles of association and the Statement of Recommended Practice - Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005)

Structure, governance & management

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 8 September 2010 and registered as a charity on 15 August 2011

The company was established under a memorandum of association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its articles of association

Objectives and activities

The objects of the charity are to preserve and protect good health for the public benefit and to advance the education of the public in particular by

- a) promoting safe pregnancy and childbirth for women and newborns, and
- b) promoting safe motherhood

Public benefit

The trustees have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning its future activities in particular, the trustees consider how planned activities will contribute to the aims and objectives that have been set

Achievements and performance in the delivery of public benefit

Supported various public speaking, advocacy and education events, by supplying information, materials and speakers, including

- International Women's Day
- Dreams for my Daughter exhibition in South Bank Centre
- Provided Advocacy and Fundraising materials and support through our website and JustGiving
- Maintained office to facilitate meetings and activities, and support members of public with
 campaigning and educational activities raising awareness of maternal health and the work we do to improve it
- Supported member and National Alliance advocacy and campaigning for Safe Motherhood in their local context

Report of the trustees

For the year ended 31 December 2012

Financial review

White Ribbon Alliance had income of £92,089 for the 12 months ended 31 December 2012, excluding support provided 'in-kind' by The White Ribbon Alliance for Safe Motherhood of the USA. Of this, £8,708 related to individual donations, £4,683 related to Gift Aid, £18,623 related to rental income, £54,161 related to support from the sister charity in the USA, and £5,907 related to donated professional services

The donated services from The White Ribbon Alliance for Safe Motherhood of the USA were £339,072 representing staffing and other support provided by the US charity. The costs are also recognised in the total expenditure for the year.

The charity assumed the lease of its office at Portobello Road in July 2011. The charity has two licensees and receives rental income from them

The accounts show reserves of £49,450 all of which are unrestricted

Plans for the future

The trustees will seek to better support the objects through fundraising activities and the implementation of operational policies and an effective management structure

Statement of responsibilities of the trustees

The trustees are (who are also directors of The White Ribbon Alliance for Safe Motherhood for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the annual report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (UK Generally Accepted Accounting Practice)

Company law requires the trustees are to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income or expenditure, of the charitable company for the year. In preparing these financial statements the trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP.
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- state whether applicable UK accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements, and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation

The trustees are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The trustees are responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the corporate and financial information included on the charity's website. Legislation in the UK governing the preparation and dissemination of financial statements may differ from legislation in other jurisdictions.

Report of the trustees

For the year ended 31 December 2012

Members of the charity guarantee to contribute an amount not exceeding £1 to the assets of the charity in the event of winding up. The total number of such guarantees at 31 December 2012 was 8 (2011.8) The trustees are members of the charity but this entitles them only to voting rights. The trustees have no beneficial interest in the charity

Independent examiner

Sayer Vincent was re-appointed as the charitable company's independent examiner during the year and have expressed their willingness to continue in that capacity

Notes to the financial statements

For the year ended 31 December 2012

1. Accounting policies

- a) The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 2006. They follow the recommendations in the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005).
- b) Voluntary income is received by way of donations and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable
- c) Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources received or generated for the charitable purposes. They are available for use at the trustees' discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity.
- d) Other incoming resources are amounts provided by the sister charity
- e) Costs of generating funds relate to the costs incurred by the charitable company in inducing third parties to make voluntary contributions to it, as well as the cost of any activities with a fundraising purpose
 - Where information about the aims, objectives and projects of the charity is provided to potential beneficiaries, the costs associated with this publicity are allocated to charitable expenditure
- f) Resources expended are recognised in the period in which they are incurred. Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure. All expenditure are recognised on an accrual basis. Resources expended include attributable VAT which cannot be recovered.
 - Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes those costs that can be allocated directly and those costs (e.g. support costs) of an indirect nature necessary to support them
- g) Governance costs are the costs associated with the governance arrangements of the charity. These costs are associated with constitutional and statutory requirements and include any costs associated with the strategic management of the charity's activities.
