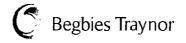

#### PROGRESS DURING THE PERIOD

#### Receipts and Payments

Attached at Appendix 1 is our abstract of receipts and payments for the period from 26 February 2018 to 25 February 2019.

What work has been done in the period of this report, why was that work necessary and what has been the financial benefit (if any) to creditors?

Details of the types of work that generally fall into the headings mentioned below are available on our firm's website – http://www.begbies-traynorgroup.com/work-details

Under the following headings, we have explained the specific work that has been undertaken on this case – not every piece of work has been described, but we have sought to give a proportionate overview that provides sufficient detail to allow creditors to understand what has been done, why it was necessary and what financial benefit (if any) the work has provided to creditors.

The costs incurred in relation to each heading are set out in the attached Time Costs Analysis – there is an analysis for the period of this Progress Report, and an analysis of the time spent on the case since the date of our appointment as Joint Liquidators.

Please note that the details below only relate to the work undertaken in the period of the report – our previous Progress Reports contained details of the work undertaken since our appointment.

#### General case administration and planning

It is necessary to develop and review the strategy in respect of certain key elements, such as asset realisations and investigations, dependent upon the specific circumstances of a case.

Periodic reviews have therefore been carried out, in order to ensure that asset realisations and investigations are progressing satisfactorily, and that statutory requirements of the relevant legislation are complied with.

Generally, it is also necessary to maintain records to demonstrate how the case was administered, and to document the reasons for any decisions that materially affect the case.

Whilst this work has not financially benefitted creditors, it is still a necessary part of the general control of the case.

#### Compliance with the Insolvency Act, Rules and best practice

The Insolvency Act 1986 and the Insolvency Rules 1986, together with subsequent amendments, require Insolvency Practitioners holding office as Liquidators to produce a Progress Report within two months after each anniversary of their appointment, which is filed at Companies House and made available to all creditors and members.

They are also required to ensure that the case is adequately bonded (an insurance to protect the interests of unsecured creditors in the asset realisations on a case)

This category also includes cashiering duties, such as banking funds, maintaining accounting records and invoicing in respect of remuneration and disbursements, which is undertaken by support staff throughout the duration of the case.

We have complied with / carried out these duties during the period of this Progress Report – although this work has not benefitted creditors financially, it was still necessary in accordance with insolvency legislation.

#### Investigations / Realisation of Assets

As outlined in my previous reports, a number of concerns arose following my statutory investigations, and solicitors were instructed to assist in an effort to negotiate a settlement in respect of a potential misfeasance claim against the director.

A "without prejudice" offer in the sum of £6,030 (to be paid in equal instalments over a two year period) was subsequently received, and after obtaining legal advice was accepted.

I have received the initial payment (of £251.25) shortly after the anniversary and I am monitoring the collection of the balancing payments.

Although this work will not financially benefit creditors (as the amount received will only serve to meet the associated costs) it was still required to be undertaken as part of my statutory duties.

Other matters which includes seeking decisions from creditors (via Deemed Consent Procedure and / or Decision Procedures, tax, litigation, pensions and travel

Matters included in this category include the preparation and submission of tax returns for the period after our appointment as Joint Liquidators.

Whilst this work has not financially benefitted creditors, it has still been necessary in order to comply with our statutory requirements in respect of reporting to H M Revenue & Customs.

#### ESTIMATED OUTCOME FOR CREDITORS

The sums owed to creditors at the date of appointment (as detailed in the Director's statement of affairs) together with the dividend prospects, are as follows:

#### Secured creditors

There are no known secured creditors.

#### Preferential creditors

Preferential claims of employees (for arrears of wages & holiday pay) were estimated at £3,000 and we have received claims in the total sum of £2,546

It remains unlikely there will be sufficient funds to pay a dividend to preferential creditors, as the costs incurred (see later) exceed the realisations made.

#### Prescribed Part for unsecured creditors pursuant to Section 176A of the Act

Section 176A of the Act provides that, where a company has created a floating charge on or after 15 September 2003, the Liquidator must make a prescribed part of the company's net property available for the unsecured creditors and not distribute it to the floating charge holder, except in so far as it exceeds the amount required for the satisfaction of unsecured debts.

To the best of my knowledge and belief, there are no other unsatisfied floating charges created or registered on or after 15 September 2003, and this section will not therefore apply in this instance.

#### **Unsecured creditors**

Unsecured creditors were estimated at £185,248 and we have received claims in the total sum of £199,111

A small number of claims received are marginally higher than the Directors' original estimates – the majority of same, however, relates to the PAYE/NIC claim received from H M Revenue & Customs.

As mentioned in the previous annual report, having reviewed the claim from H M Revenue & Customs, it would appear that the difference relates to assessments raised by the creditor for the final trading periods, which could reduce if the outstanding returns were completed.

Based upon realisations to date (and estimated future realisations) it is still anticipated there will be insufficient funds available to enable a dividend to be paid to the unsecured creditors.

#### REMUNERATION & DISBURSEMENTS

#### Pre-appointment costs (i.e. the Statement of Affairs fee)

The costs relating to work undertaken prior to our appointment – in summoning, advertising and holding the creditors' meeting and assisting the directors in preparing the Statement of Affairs – were approved by the creditors at the Section 98 meeting at £3,500 plus VAT (£500 of which was paid to Total Tax Solutions).

Both fees have been paid in full.

#### Post-appointment costs (i.e. the Liquidator's Remuneration)

Our remuneration has been fixed by reference to the time properly given by us (as Liquidators) and the various grades of our staff calculated at the prevailing hourly charge out rates of Begbies Traynor (Central) LLP in attending to matters arising in the winding up as set out in the fees estimate.

The time costs incurred during the reporting period (i.e. from 26 February 2018 to 25 February 2019) amount to £4,983 which represents 23.4 hours at an average rate of £212.95 per hour.

Our time costs for the duration of the Liquidation amount to £29,187 against which we have drawn total remuneration in the sum of £6,000 plus VAT against these costs.

#### "Category One" Disbursements

"Category One" disbursements in the sum of £636.33 (detailed in Appendix 3) have been incurred, against which we have drawn £605.69.

#### "Category Two" Disbursements

In accordance with the resolution obtained in relation to disbursements, the following "Category Two" disbursements (and disbursements which should be treated as "Category Two" disbursements) have been charged to the case since the date of our appointment: -

#### Why have subcontractors been used?

Where specialist advice or assistance has been required outside the scope of the Liquidators, we have engaged subcontractors, as detailed below.

Lithgow Sons & Partners (Agent's fee)

Independent agents have assisted with the collection and auction sale of the Company's chattel assets.

Their costs (of £324.36 plus VAT) have been discharged in full.

TBI Law (Legal fees)

Solicitors have assisted with the Liquidators' investigations and settlement agreement as detailed above.

Costs of £1,281 plus VAT have been incurred to date, against which they have been paid the sum of £500 plus VAT.

Total Tax Solutions (Accountant's fee)

The Company's accountant has assisted with concluding the payroll scheme, and completing / issuing the end-of-year PAYE returns to H M Revenue & Customs.

Their costs (of £300 plus VAT) have been discharged in full.

#### **Time Costs Analysis**

The following further information in relation to our time costs and disbursements is set out in the attached (at Appendix 2):

- Time Costs Analysis for the reporting period (i.e. from 26 February 2018 to 25 February 2019);

## 7. LIQUIDATORS' EXPENSES

No material expenses were incurred during the period of this Progress Report.

Attached (at Appendix 3) is a cumulative statement showing the total expenses incurred since the date of our appointment as Liquidators.

#### Expenses actually incurred compared to those that were anticipated

Creditors will recall that we estimated that the expenses of the Liquidation would total £1,072.

At present the amount of £2,565 has been incurred in relation to expenses, the additional expenditure relates (mostly) to legal fees which were listed as "uncertain" in our earlier report.

# 8. ASSETS THAT REMAIN TO BE REALISED AND WORK THAT REMAINS TO BE DONE

What work remains to be done, why is this necessary and what financial benefit (if any) will it provide to creditors?

#### General case administration and planning

Until this matter is concluded, we will continue to perform periodic reviews, in order to ensure that the statutory requirements of the relevant legislation are complied with.

Continuing records will also be made to demonstrate how the case is being administered, and to document the reasons for any decisions that materially affect the case.

Whilst this work will not benefit creditors financially, it is still a necessary part of the general control of the case.

#### Compliance with the Insolvency Act, Rules and best practice

Pursuant to The Insolvency Act 1986 and the Insolvency Rules 1986, together with subsequent amendments, over the remaining course of the administration of this estate we will:

 ensure that the case is adequately bonded (an insurance to protect the interests of unsecured creditors in the potential asset realisations on a case); and  produce a Progress Report within two months after the anniversary of the date of when the Company entered Liquidation, which is issued / made available to all creditors and members, and filed with the Registrar of Companies

Once this matter is ready to conclude, we will produce a draft Final Report for issuing to all creditors and members, and to be subsequently filed at Companies House.

In the meantime, the cashiering duties (bank reconciliations and maintaining accounting records) will continue to be undertaken by our support staff.

Although this work will not financially benefit creditors, it is still required to be undertaken as part of our statutory duties.

#### Investigations / Realisation of assets

We will continue to monitor incoming payments in accordance with the settlement agreement as detailed earlier.

Although this work will not financially benefit creditors (as the amount received will only serve to meet the associated costs) it will still required to be undertaken as part of our statutory duties.

#### Dealing with all creditors' claims (including employees), correspondence and distributions

Until this matter has concluded, we will continue to log creditor claims, and respond to general correspondence received.

Although this work will not financially benefit creditors (as there is no dividend payable) it will still be required to ensure that their queries are dealt with in a timely manner.

Other matters which includes seeking decisions from creditors (via Deemed Consent Procedure and/or Decision Procedure, tax, litigation, pensions and travel

Until this matter is concluded, we will continue to prepare / submit tax returns for the periods after our appointment as Joint Liquidators.

Whilst this work will not financially benefit creditors, it is still necessary to comply with our statutory requirements in respect of reporting to H M Revenue & Customs.

#### How much will this further work cost?

Clearly there is a cost implication in completing the remaining balance of work above, however, any fees payable for the same are restricted to the balance of funds within the estate.

In any event, we estimate to incur further costs of between £3,000 and £5,000 in concluding this matter.

With the exception of legal fees, we do not expect to incur any further material expenses.

#### OTHER RELEVANT INFORMATION

#### Investigations and reporting on directors conduct

A Liquidator has a duty to enquire into the affairs of an insolvent company to determine its property and liabilities and to identify any actions which could lead to the recovery of funds. In addition, a Liquidator is also required to consider the conduct of the Company's directors and to make an appropriate submission to the Department for Business Energy and Industrial Strategy. We can confirm that we have discharged our duties in these respects.

#### Investigations carried out to date

We have undertaken an initial assessment of the manner in which the business was conducted prior to the Liquidation of the Company and potential recoveries for the estate in this respect.

#### Use of personal information

Please note that in the course of discharging our statutory duties as Liquidators, we may need to access and use personal data, being information from which a living person can be identified. Where this is necessary, we are required to comply with data protection legislation. #### CREDITORS' RIGHTS

#### Right to request further information

Pursuant to Rule 18.9 of the Rules, within 21 days of the receipt of this report a secured creditor, or an unsecured creditor with the concurrence of at least 5% in value of the unsecured creditors, including that creditor, (or an unsecured creditor with less than 5% in value of the unsecured creditors, but with the permission of the court) may request in writing that we provide further information about our remuneration or expenses which have been incurred during the period of this Progress Report.

#### Right to make an application to court

Pursuant to Rule 18.34 of the Rules, any secured creditor or any unsecured creditor with the concurrence of at least 10% in value of the unsecured creditors including that creditor, (or any unsecured creditors with less than 10% in value of the unsecured creditors, but with the permission of the court) may, within 8 weeks of receipt of this Progress Report, make an application to court on the grounds that the remuneration charged or the expenses incurred during the period of this Progress Report are excessive or, the basis fixed for our remuneration is inappropriate.

# 11. CONCLUSION

We will report again in approximately twelve months time or at the conclusion of the Liquidation, whichever is the sooner.

#### **BEGBIES TRAYNOR CHARGING POLICY**

#### INTRODUCTION

This note applies where a licensed insolvency practitioner in the firm is acting as an office holder of an insolvent estate and seeks creditor approval to draw remuneration on the basis of the time properly spent in dealing with the case. It also applies where further information is to be provided to creditors regarding the office holder's fees following the passing of a resolution for the office holder to be remunerated on a time cost basis. Best practice guidance<sup>1</sup> requires that such information should be disclosed to those who are responsible for approving remuneration.

In addition, this note applies where creditor approval is sought to make a separate charge by way of expenses or disbursements to recover the cost of facilities provided by the firm. It also applies where payments are to be made to parties other than the firm, but in relation to which the office holder, the firm or any associate has an interest. Best practice guidance<sup>2</sup> indicates that such charges should be disclosed to those who are responsible for approving the office holder's remuneration, together with an explanation of how those charges are calculated.

#### OFFICE HOLDER'S FEES IN RESPECT OF THE ADMINISTRATION OF SOLVENT ESTATES

The office holder has overall responsibility for the administration of the estate. He/she will delegate tasks to members of staff. Such delegation assists the office holder as it allows him/her to deal with the more complex aspects of the case and ensures that work is being carried out at the appropriate level. There are various levels of staff that are employed by the office holder and these appear below.

The firm operates a time recording system which allows staff working on the case along with the office holder to allocate their time to the case. The time is recorded at the individual's hourly rate in force at that time which is detailed below.

# EXPENSES INCURRED BY OFFICE HOLDERS IN RESPECT OF THE ADMINISTRATION OF SOLVENT ESTATES

Best practice guidance classifies expenses into two broad categories:

- Category 1 disbursements (approval not required) specific expenditure that is directly related to the case and referable to an independent external supplier's invoice. All such items are charged to the case as they are incurred.
- Category 2 disbursements (approval required) items of expenditure that are directly related to the case which include an element of shared or allocated cost and are based on a reasonable method of calculation, but which are not payable to an independent third party.
  - (A) The following items of expenditure are charged to the case (subject to approval):
    - Car mileage is charged at the rate of 45 pence per mile;

Expenses which should be treated as Category 2 disbursements (approval required) – in addition to the two categories referred to above, best practice guidance indicates that where payments are to be made to outside parties in which the office holder or his firm or any associate has an interest, these should be treated as Category 2 disbursements.

#### Services provided by an entity within the Begbies Traynor group

The following items of expenditure which relate to services provided by entities within the Begbies Traynor group, of which the office holder's firm is a member, are also to be charged to the case (subject to approval):

 Asset Recovery, Appraisal and Valuation, Disposal and Consultancy services are provided by Eddisons which is part of Begbies Traynor Group plc

Due to the varied nature of the work carried out, Asset Recovery, Appraisal and Disposal costs are charged on one or more of the following basis.

These costs are paid from asset realisations of the company:

- Eddisons Insurance Services Limited is also part of Begbies Traynor Group plc and provides insurance services on a fixed premium basis.
