The company continued to work on Our Place in Donnington Telford, Halesowen and in Dursley

In Donnington this enabled providers of children's early years services to come together to identify how they could work together across organisations and the community to stop the revolving door of children entering social care support or requiring repeat service interventions. In Halesowen we worked on behalf of the Centre for Equality and Diversity to bring together various community groups in building community cohesion and improving the environment of the Highfields estate. In Dursley we worked with young people and with youth service providers to identify how they could encourage young people leading and designing their own youth service to meet the needs of the most excluded.

As a social enterprise we continued to capacity build and support the Gower Heritage and Enterprise group and we obtained a Heritage Start Up Grant on their behalf to deliver training and write their business plan. We enabled them to establish a Charitable Incorporated Organisation and we carried out Community Organising in Priorslee and St Georges for the Parish Council there.

In Brookside Telford we continued to support Telfordbikes for one day per week

We re-joined Social Enterprise West Midlands and received mentoring support from PwC

We continued the Appreciative Self course for the April Zaroorat Community Network and supported the Ekta group to deliver Wellbeing activities in Dudley

We secured an Innovation grant to enable us to continue community development activities in St Georges as part of the Gower project and continued to coordinate the project there as part of our social investment activities

We remain a member of Shropshire Providers consortium

Locality - we progressed 3 community organisers in accordance with their requirements DCLG - we continued the Our Place programme in accordance with their requirements Telford & Wrekin Council who were stakeholders in the Our Place programme in Donnington and the Gower Heritage project - we consulted with them through the Gower Forum which has enabled the project to progress albeit it slowly Young Advisors who worked with us to deliver the Our Place in Dursley and to carry out some of the listenings we did in Calais at the refugee camp

St Georges and Priorslee Parish Council who were involved in consultation about the Gower Hentage Project and community organising – the consultation with tem extended the CO programme into Priorslee and as a result diluted the impact of the programme Ekta and Apri Zaroorat Community Network – were fully consulted on developing the current Listening Circles programme in conjunction with the People's Health Trust

We partnered with **Appreciating People** in Liverpool to develop our Appreciative Inquiry skills in communities and business development

The other stakeholders are the staff and directors and they are fully involved in developing strategy going forward
