#### 1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Citizen Engagement CIC is a private company, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

#### 2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Section 1A "Small Entities" of Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures and fittings

25% on cost

#### **Taxation**

Taxation for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in the Income Statement, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity.

Current or deferred taxation assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Current tax is recognised at the amount of tax payable using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

#### Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Timing differences arise from the inclusion of income and expenses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in financial statements. Deferred tax is measured using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the year end and that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits.

PART 1 - GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE COMPANY'S ACTIVITIES AND IMPACT In the space provided below, please insert a general account of the company's activities in the financial year to which the report relates, including a description of how they have benefited the community.

During the year we have worked on projects local to Telford and regionally across the West Midlands.

We worked with the Apni Zaroorat Community Network and Ekta group in Dudley on the second part of the Listening Circles project which is a project to bring Muslim and Hindu women together to share experiences and break down cultural barriers- we have addressed raising awareness of domestic abuse, volunteer training and health and wellbeing. With the help of Claire Cotterill Mosaics we designed and created small mosaics with affirmations of self-worth, these were photoshopped onto fabric and used as the base for a wall-hanging. The making of the wall hanging served as an opportunity for facilitated conversations among the women and the creation itself a centre piece for conversations.

We have guided the Big Local partnerships in Stoke north, Uttoxeter Heath and Welsh House Farm, Birmingham to implement and deliver their Big Local plans and meet their Big Lottery obligations.

Stoke North has involved working with Barnardos on the Together for Families programme aimed at preventing CSE and CSA – the area was chosen because of it strong partnership across the residents involved. The partnership has reviewed their plan in depth and are taking project forward to implement the Skate \park development, the Growing field and to address local food poverty.

Heath Big Local have focussed on refurbishing the Heath Community centre which will link with the Holly Road Care Centre and the professional and voluntary group networking.

In Welsh House Farm the first carnival with creative workshop took place. The community garden project was extended to take on an allotment. Social Enterprise training for the women's group enabled and afternoon tea room bringing local residents together to enjoy cupcakes and a variety of teas.

We have continued to work with the Gower Heritage & Enterprise Foundation to coordinate their activities and plans to restore the Gower Street School – we have secured an Architectural Heritage Fund gran on their behalf to assist with the costs of financial and business planning. We manage a part time volunteer and activities worker for them. We have contributed 5 days per month pro-bono time to the Gower project.

This year we undertook consultancy on the Wake green Road Grade 2 listed prefabs, in Mosely for Birmingham Conservation Trust with the outcome that Birmingham City Council agreed to refurbish the prefabs as social housing while opening an option for BCT to retain at least one prefab as a museum.

We trained 2 young advisor teams in Par Bay and Whitleigh in the SE of England and undertook work to assist with the development of a charity for people with profound disabilities ( Special Needs Action Centre Telford ).

We remain a member of Shropshire Providers consortium
