1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Citizen Engagement CIC is a private company, limited by guarantee, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" including the provisions of Section 1A "Small Entities" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures and fittings

- 25% on cost

Taxation

Taxation for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in the Income Statement, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity.

Current or deferred taxation assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Current tax is recognised at the amount of tax payable using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Timing differences arise from the inclusion of income and expenses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in financial statements. Deferred tax is measured using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the year end and that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits.

PART 1 - GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE COMPANY'S ACTIVITIES AND IMPACT In the space provided below, please insert a general account of the company's activities in the financial year to which the report relates, including a description of how they have benefited

the community.

The company worked with 5 Big Local areas throughout the period Stoke North, Welsh House Farm and Birchfield in Birmingham, Uttoxeter Heath and 3 Parishes of Gobowen, St Martins and Weston Rhyn.

It was a difficult year because of Covid 19 impacting on these communities which are some of the communities with the least available resources and disposable income to be able to deal with it. They have little access to WiFi which again was problematic as many vital services including GPs moved online. These communities coped with illness, death, furlough, redundancy, being laid off, managing children at home, fear and isolation and lack of available services.

Surprisingly work increased during this period as online meetings were more frequent, people working in the areas required more emotional support and we were preparing for picking up the pieces coming out of lockdown.C19 impacted on behaviours of communities and individuals leading to disputes, resignations, collapses in some relationships. During this period we supported the changeover to new Locally Trusted Organisations in 2 areas, new plans in 3 areas, the development of new CIOs in 2 areas, the development of a health and Wellbeing partnership in one area and a Creative Civic Change programme between two areas. We supported partnerships through staff changes and restructuring, resignations, bereavement and illness.

The impact of this work was to see those partnerships through enabling them to provide vital support for their communities such as food deliveries, information, welfare advice, and electronic engagement.

In addition, we provided some pro-bono support to Telford Steam Railway around Governance and fundraising. This enabled the organisations fundraiser to continue unsupported with the task in hand.

And we were contracted to work with Kingsbrook and Cauldwell to train Community Researchers, carry out a consultation, work with the partnership there to develop a plan. The impact of this has been to make significant community and organisational connections for the partnership there and to leave a legacy of trained community members.

It was also a very sad year for Citizen Engagement CIC, our director Carol Edmonds died after a long illness. She provided invaluable counsel and support to the business, and we have and will continue to miss her beyond measure. 2 new directors have come on board this year and we continue to employ a financial officer.
