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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2020

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2020. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives

The object of the charity as stated in its Articles of Association, is to promote the relief of elderly people in and around North Craven ("the area of benefit") in any manner which now is or hereafter may be deemed to be charitable in law.

Activities and performance

The Charity raises income through trading from its two shops and ancillary trading, through fundraising and donations, it has contracts to deliver services and it achieves grants to deliver projects.

These monies enable Age UK North Craven to deliver a range of services, which are undertaken to deliver the charity's mission to make later life in North Craven a fulfilling and enjoyable experience, reducing isolation and loneliness and enabling the right support at the right time.

The services include:

Information and Advice

Providing confidential advice on a range of areas and providing help to access support.

Independence Support, supporting people through significant changes, supporting lonely people through befriending and offering personalised support to overcome or cope with major issues.

Day Activities

A network of clubs and groups in community settings, providing food, comfort and an opportunity for social interaction and to have fun.

Transport support

Minibuses providing access to shopping, community opportunities and an extensive programme of amenity trips. It also provides two distinct volunteer car schemes that enable older people to access health and well-being appointments.

The charity relies on the support of a local volunteer force of over two hundred people, the charity has a volunteer co-ordinator who supports recruitment, training and well-being of our volunteers.

The charity publishes a separate annual report which gives more details of all the areas of operation.

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2020

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Achievements

The charity opened its new furniture and home wears shop in Settle in October, this compliments the existing retail operation, and is a key component of the charity, moving its income profile, so that more of the charities income is fully in its control, rather than relying on grants or contracts.

The support to all of our clients has increased this year with more club opportunities, increased fitness classes and a new telephone befriending service now in operation.

We were successful in getting investment to set up a new community allotment service in Settle, this is now being developed.

The charity ensures that it has high quality standards by achieving and observing different quality frameworks.

The charities financial strategy includes developing an income plan that puts the charity in control of its own finances and reduces the needs for grants and contracts. The charity does have a contract with North Yorkshire County Council and does apply for grants for specific areas of work, usually new areas. We have been successful in developing a balanced income mix and are more self sufficient.

The charity is reliant on volunteers and has been successful in retaining existing volunteers, recruiting new ones and supporting people who volunteer whilst living with long term conditions, In this year, for the first time the charity has moved to having over two hundred active volunteers..

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Investment policy and objectives

The Board of Trustees has the power to invest in such assets as they see fit, with appropriate professional advice.

Reserves policy

The results of the charity for the year are set out in the accompanying statement of financial activities and the notes to the accounts. During the year the charity had an overall income of £358,208 of which £294,693 was attributable to unrestricted funds and £63,515 to restricted funds.

The Board of Trustees have agreed a new Reserves Policy that has assessed risks and allocated potential costs to those risks. The policy considered potential new developments requiring investment as well as risks of losing income and facing significant increased costs.

The Trustees decided to go through a process of starting from a blank canvas and to review our position and rebuild a Reserves Policy from scratch, using the current best practice and getting external support to facilitate and challenge the process.

The Trustees have gone through a thorough process of reviewing known risks and reviewing areas of operation that were of most significance financially, for the charity itself, our clients and for our reputation.

The review considered the income streams for the charity and evaluated the risks associated with the security of each stream. The policy allocated amounts to cover the risks associated.

The Reserves Policy is reviewed each year by the Board of Trustees,

The Trustees have agree a total figure of £234,000 in reserves, this includes both restricted and unrestricted reserves.

At the end of the year, the free reserves of the charity were £307,701, which is considered to be acceptable in the circumstances.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures and fittings

- 25% on reducing balance

Motor vehicles

- 25% on reducing balance

Computer equipment

- 25% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

The charity ensures it works within a framework of good practice and in close partnership with other Age UKs and the Age Concerns across North Yorkshire.

The general fund represents the accumulated funds of the charity which have not been designated for a specific purpose and which are therefore expendable in the furtherance of the objects of the charity.

Information and Advice includes funding from NYCC to provide one to one support for income maximisation, care choices and housing options. It also includes Age UK funding to provide a welfare benefits uptake campaign.

Care and Prevention Services include Independence Support providing navigation and befriending services, and is supported by North Yorkshire County Council as well as funds from national Age UK.

Day Activities includes support from NYCC for a network of social opportunities thought North Craven.

Transport includes support from Bentham Medical Practice for volunteer drivers who provide lifts for patients to appointments in the Bentham and Ingleton area. NYCC Community Transport Fund represents funding to support voluntary care scheme based in Bentham and Settle.

A grant towards the purchase of a new mini bus was received in the year, with further contributions to be received next year.

13. RELATED PARTY DISCLOSURES

There were no related party transactions for the year ended 31 March 2020.

14. POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

The charity's operations have been severely affected by Covid 19. In line with government guidance the shops have been closed and transport and other activities have ceased.

The trustees have taken steps to mitigate the effect including furloughing of staff, reducing other costs and taking advantage of government grants totalling £35,000.

The trustees are confident that the charity will have enough resources to continue as a going concern.
