DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 30 JUNE 2012

The directors present their report and the financial statements for the period ended 30 June 2012

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the group is that of building and construction. Throughout the year, trading has been conducted in Uplands Retail Limited. The principal activity of Uplands Retail Holdings Limited (previously Acraman (485) Limited) is that of a holding company.

BUSINESS REVIEW

Acraman (485) Limited was incorporated on 1 June 2011

On 6 July 2011, the group completed a major reconstruction of its affairs

Acraman (485) Limited acquired the entire share capital of Uplands Retail Holdings Limited All assets and liabilities in Uplands Retail Holdings Limited were subsequently transferred to Acraman (485) Limited On 1 August 2011, Acraman (485) Limited changed its name to Uplands Retail Holdings Limited The old holding company, previously Uplands Retail Holdings Limited, became Acraman (485) Limited

These financial statements present the consolidated results of the new group formed on 6 July 2011 for the period to 30 June 2012. There are no prior year comparative consolidated figures on the basis that the group was newly formed during the year.

The majority of our business is derived from the retail sector which is currently experiencing restrictions placed on volumes of expenditure. The group is seeking to expand its customer base within the retailing sector.

The development of the business is dependent upon the group continuing to attract and retain key personnel and subsequently providing them with appropriate training and resources. This safeguards the provision of the very high quality of service required by our customers.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The consolidated profit for the period, after taxation, amounted to £1,733,180. No dividend has been paid or proposed during the period.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The group financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

1.2 Basis of consolidation

The group financial statements consolidate the financial statements of Uplands Retail Holdings Limited (previously Acraman (485) Limited) and its subsidiaries, Uplands Retail Limited, Acraman (485) Limited (previously Uplands Retail Holdings Limited) and Acraman (470) Limited for the period to 30 June 2012

The subsidiary companies have been included in the group financial statements using the acquisition method of accounting. Profits and losses of companies entering or leaving the group are included until the date control passes. The net assets of the subsidiaries acquired are included on the basis of their fair value at the date of acquisition.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption contained within section 408 of the Companies Act 2006 not to present its own profit and loss account

The results of subsidiaries sold are included up to the effective date of disposal

13 Turnover

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the group in respect of goods and services supplied, exclusive of Value Added Tax and trade discounts

1.4 Intangible fixed assets and amortisation

Goodwill arising on the acquisition of subsidiary undertakings representing any excess of the fair value of the consideration given over the fair value of the identifiable assets and liabilities acquired, is capitalised and written off on a straight line basis over its useful economic life. Provision is made for any impairment. It is reviewed for impairment at the end of the first full financial year following the acquisition and at other times if events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable.

Amortisation is provided at the following rates

Goodwill - 5% straight line

1.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Investments in subsidiaries are valued at cost less provision for impairment

17 Amounts recoverable on contracts

Contracts are assessed on an individual basis and reflected in the profit and loss account by recording turnover and related costs as contract activity progresses. Turnover is ascertained in a manner appropriate to the stage of completion of the contract, and credit taken for profit earned to date when the outcome of the contract can be assessed with reasonable certainty. The amount by which turnover exceeds payments on account is classified as "amounts recoverable on contracts" and included in debtors, to the extent that payments on account exceed relevant turnover, the excess is included as a creditor. Full provision is made for all losses on contracts in the period in which they are first foreseen.

18 Hire purchase agreements

Assets held under hire purchase agreements are capitalised and disclosed under tangible fixed assets at their fair value. The capital element of future payments is treated as a liability and the interest is charged to the profit and loss account in proportion to the remaining balance outstanding.

19 Financial instruments

Financial assets, financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the asset of the entity after deducting all of its financial liabilities.

1.10 Operating leases

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term

1 11 Deferred taxation

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation

A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated at the tax rates expected to be effective at the time the timing differences are expected to reverse

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted

1 12 Pensions

The group operates a defined contribution pension scheme for employees. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the group. The annual contributions payable are charged to the profit and loss account when incurred

2. TURNOVER

The turnover and profit before tax are attributable to the one principal activity of the group, which arose wholly within the United Kingdom

The Finance Act 2011 included legislation to reduce the main rate of corporation tax from 28% to 26% from 1 April 2011 and to 25% from April 2012, and its impact is reflected above

The Finance Act 2012 reduces the rate of tax to 24% from 1 April 2012 with further annual reductions proposed of 1% culminating in a rate of 22% on 1 April 2014. The full anticipated effect of these further changes combined with the reductions in the rates of capital allowances is not considered material.
