REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2014

This is the annual report for the charity called 'New Forest Community Church', an incorporated company which is limited by Guarantee. This report covers the period 1st April 2013 to 31st March 2014.

The objectives of the Trust are the advancement of the Christian Faith including worship, preaching of the Christian Gospel, the pastoral care of Christian people and providing relief to persons who are in need.

The New Forest Community Church (NFCC) has fulfilled its objectives through a range of activities. These include weekly public meetings, small group gatherings for teaching and training, and supporting people with specific interests to pursue opportunities for ministry at home and abroad. The charity also runs a coffee shop called The Sweet Soul Café in the Marchwood village. This provides a useful resource for the village community and a physical presence for the Church.

Those on the payroll are Tom & Nikki Wileman and Tony Rozée. Tom & Nikki Wileman and Tony Hodder form the leadership team, while Tony Rozée is responsible for missions work. Nikki Wileman is responsible for administration. David Yapp is treasurer and has sound financial spreadsheet models in place including forecast and actual income and expenditure. An annual budget is considered at the beginning of each financial year and discussed at regular intervals by the trustees.

NFCC is involved in supporting local and other communities. Mission work in Kenya including the Salem orphanage (an orphanage for about 100 children in Kenya), has continued throughout this year and continues to be strengthened by encouraging 'self help' projects such as vegetable gardens water purification etc. We are also involved in local activities and ministries such as SCRATCH, which provides services to relieve the effects of hardship. Members contribute food to a local Food Bank. NFCC maintains a Building Fund to provide resources once suitable buildings become available.

NFCC continues to use Marchwood village hall for weekly public meetings on Sundays where creative and dynamic worship is led by a team of musicians. Membership during the year averaged 71 adults with an active attendance at Sunday worship of nearly 80, including children.

The Trustees' policy for financial reserves is to maintain sufficient funds to meet contractual obligations to employees and others and to ensure that there is an adequate level of working capital to cover fluctuations in income levels.

The Trustees are convinced that the Charity will continue to be able to fulfil its objectives and advance the Christian faith and practical support in the local and overseas communities.

REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS (Continued) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2014

Statement of Directors' Responsibilities

The Charities Act and the Companies Act require the Board of Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity as at the end of the financial year and of the surplus or deficit of the charity. In preparing those financial statements the Board is required to:

- a) select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- b) make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business;
- d) state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements.

The Directors are also responsible for maintaining adequate accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and which are sufficient to show and explain the charity's transactions and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006 and comply with regulations made under the Charities Act. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The Directors are also responsible for the contents of the Directors' report, and the responsibility of the independent examiner in relation to the Directors' report is limited to examining the report and ensuring that on the face of the report there are no inconsistencies with the figures disclosed in the financial statements.

These accounts have been prepared in accordance with the provisions applicable to companies subject to the small companies regime.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2014

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with all applicable accounting standards, as modified by the SORP The accounts have been drawn up in accordance with the provisions of the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the Companies Acts, and include the results of the charity's operations which are described in the Trustees' Report, all of which are continuing.

Advantage has been taken of Section 396(5) of The Companies Act 2006 to allow the format of the financial statements to be adapted to reflect the special nature of the charity's operation and in order to comply with the requirements of the SORP.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement.

The particular accounting policies adopted are set out below.

Incoming Resources

Recognition of Incoming Resources

These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when:

- · the charity becomes entitled to the resources:
- the trustees are virtually certain they will receive the resources; and
- the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability

Incoming Resources with Related Expenditure

Where incoming resources have related expenditure (as with fundraising or contract income) the incoming resource and related expenditure are reported gross in the SOFA.

Grants and Donations

Grants and Donations are only included in the SOFA when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the resources.

Tax Reclaims on Donations and Gifts

Incoming resources from tax reclaims are included in the SOFA at the same time as the gift to which they relate.

Contractual Income and Performance Related Grants

This is only included in the SOFA once the related goods or services has been delivered.

Gifts in Kind

Gifts in kind are accounted for at a reasonable estimate of their value to the charity or the amount actually realised. Gifts in kind for sale or distribution are included in the accounts as gifts only when sold or distributed by the charity. Gifts in kind for use by the charity are included in the SOFA as incoming resources when receivable.

Donated Services and Facilities

These are only included in incoming resources (with an equivalent amount in resources expended) where the benefit to the charity is reasonably quantifiable, measurable and material. The value placed on these resources is the estimated value to the charity of the service or facility received.

Volunteer Help

The value of any voluntary help received is not included in the accounts but is described in the trustees' annual report.

Investment Income

This is included in the accounts when receivable.

Investment Gains and Losses

This included any gain or loss on the sale of investments and any gain or loss resulting from revaluing investments to market value at the end of the year.

Expenditure and Liabilities

Liability Recognition

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (Continued) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2014

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Governance Costs

Include costs of the preparation and examination of statutory accounts, the costs of the trustees' meetings and cost of any legal advice to trustees on governance or constitutional matters.

Grants with Performance Conditions
Where the charity gives a grant with conditions for its payment being a specific level of service or output to be provided, such grants are only recognised in the SOFA once the recipient of the grant has provided the specified service or output

Grants Payable without Performance Conditions

These are only recognised in the accounts when a commitment has been made and there are no conditions to be met relating to a grant which remain in control of the charity.

Support Costs

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of the resources, eg allocating property costs by floor areas, or per capital, staff costs by the time spent and other costs by their usage.

Fixed Assets

Tangible fixed assets for use by the charity, these are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year, and cost at least £100. They are valued at cost or, if gifted, at the value to the charity on receipt.

Investments

Investments quoted on a recognised stock exchange are valued at market value at the year end. Other investment assets are included at trustees' best estimate of market value.

There has been no change to the accounting policies (Valuation rules and methods of accounting) since last year.

Depreciation Expense

Depreciation has been calculated on a reducing balance basis. The rates applied per annum are as follows:

11. PAYMENTS TO DIRECTORS & RELATED PARTIES

No payments were made to Directors or any persons connected with them during this financial period. No material transaction took place between the charity and the Directors or any person connected with them.

12. RISK ASSESSMENT

The Directors actively review the major risks which the charity faces on a regular basis and believe that maintaining the free reserves stated combined with the annual review of the controls over key financial systems carried out on an annual basis will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The Directors have also examined other operational and business risks which they face and confirm that they have established systems to mitigate the significant risks.

13. RESERVES POLICY

The Trust recognises the propriety of not building up funds for which there is no clear expenditure plans. The Trust's policy is to allow reserves to accrue to a level of three months' average expenditure, plus funds which may be earmarked for specific projects in the future. As the Trust is still growing, reserves may only exceed this policy level in order to be able to respond positively to new opportunities. This situation is actively monitored to ensure that reserves do not build up unnecessarily.

14. PUBLIC BENEFIT

The charity acknowledges its requirement to demonstrate clearly that it must have charitable purposes or 'aims' that are for the public benefit. Details of how the charity has achieved this are provided in the Trustees report. The Trustees confirm that they have paid due regard to the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit before deciding what activities the charity should undertake.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT ON THE ACCOUNTS

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The Charity's trustees (who are also the directors of the company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit , and information supplied by the trustees in the course of the examination is not subjected to audit tests or enquiries, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the financial statements, and in particular, I express no opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view of the affairs of the charity, and my report is limited to the matters set out in the statement below.
