#### 2. STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### **Governing Document**

Ash Citizens Advice Bureau is a registered charity and a company limited by guarantee. The maximum liability of each member is limited to £1. At 31 March 2019 the company had 9 members (2018 = 9). Ash Citizens Advice Bureau Limited is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association as amended on 31 August 2013

Ash Citizens Advice Bureau Limited was incorporated as a company limited by guarantee on 31 August 2013. The charity commenced operations on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2013 at which date the assets and liabilities of the unincorporated Ash Citizens Advice Bureau were acquired.

#### **Recruitment, Appointment of Trustees**

Trustees, who are also Directors of the Company, are elected from the local community. A Committee, made up of Trustees, the Company Secretary and chaired by the Chair is established to oversee the process for Board appointments.

#### Induction of Trustees

Newly appointed Trustees are provided with a comprehensive induction to Ash Citizens Advice through the provision of training courses and mentoring by established trustees and the Chief Officer.

#### **Organisational Structure**

Ash Citizens Advice Bureau is governed by its Trustee Board which is responsible for setting the strategic direction of the organisation and the policy of the charity. The Trustees carry the ultimate responsibility for the conduct of Ash Citizens Advice and for ensuring that the charity satisfies its legal and contractual obligations. Trustees meet as a minimum quarterly and delegate the day-to-day operation of the organisation to senior Ash Citizens Advice Bureau management. The Trustee Board is independent from management. A register of members' interests is maintained at the registered office, and is available to the public.

#### **Related Parties**

Ash Citizens Advice Bureau is a member of Citizens Advice, the operating name of the National Association of Citizens Advice Bureaux, which provides a framework for standards of advice and casework management as well as monitoring progress against these standards. Operating policies are independently determined by the Trustee Board of Ash Citizens Advice in order to fulfil its charitable objects and comply with the national membership requirements.

The charity also co-operates and liaises with a number of other advisory services, local charities and social services departments on behalf of clients. Where one of the trustees holds the position of trustee/director of another charity they may be involved in discussions regarding that other charity but not in the ultimate decision-making process.

#### Major risks

Ash Citizens Advice Bureau has worked on a Corporate Risk Management exercise. A risk management strategy and risk register were agreed by the Trustee Board. The Trustees recognise that any major risks to which to which the charity is exposed need to be reviewed and systems put in place to mitigate those risks. To that end Citizens Advice Ash is continually monitoring and managing its risk, reviewing the corporate risk register and ensuring action plans are in place to mitigate its key risks.

Included in external risks is that of the loss of funding. The effects of this have been minimised by the procedures in place. The charity continues to seek to diversify its funding sources. Internal risks are minimised by the implementation of procedures for authorisation of all transactions and projects and to ensure consistent quality of delivery for all operational aspects of the charitable company. These procedures are periodically reviewed to ensure that they still meet the needs of the charity.

#### 3. OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

#### **Objects**

The charity's objects are to promote any charitable purpose for the benefit of the community in Ash, Ash Vale, Tongham, Normandy and surrounding villages by the advancement of education, the protection and preservation of health and the relief of poverty, sickness and distress.

#### Objectives, Strategies and Activities for the Year

Ash Citizens Advice Bureau aims to provide free, confidential, impartial and independent advice and information for the benefit of the local community, to exercise a responsible influence on the development of social policies and services and to ensure individuals do not suffer through a lack of knowledge or an inability to express their needs effectively. Independent and impartial advice, information and counsel for members of the public is provided at premises at the Ash Centre, Ash. Advisory services were provided through face-to-face consultations, telephone advice lines, home visits and via email. The Charity has a Web site <a href="www.ashcab.org.uk">www.ashcab.org.uk</a>. This is intended to increase awareness in the local community of the advice services available to local residents and has a pro forma for clients to access email advice.

Grants were received from Guildford Borough Council and from the Guildford Voluntary Grants Panel (supported by Guildford Borough Council and Surrey County Council) to fund employment of an Independent Living Adviser. This aimed to provide a home visiting service and to work with elderly and disabled members of the local community to support them in their own home and to help them access services that would help them maintain their independence and improve their quality of life.

#### **Contribution of Volunteers**

The Charity is largely comprised of volunteers, with paid staff mainly for management and supervision. Volunteers who receive stringent and detailed training over a 12-month period provide most of the advice and help given to clients. The volunteers come from within the community, which then benefits from the significant experience and skills of the volunteers, gained from different life experiences. The benefits to the volunteers can be that they are able to continue to share their considerable experience and skills beyond retirement or that they gain new skills which enable them to find paid employment at a later date

#### **Public Benefit Required**

The trustees have paid due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit in deciding the activities undertaken by the local Citizens Advice during the year. The trustees are satisfied that the information provided in the report and accounts meets the public benefit reporting requirements.

The principal activity of Ash Citizens Advice Bureau Limited remained the provision of free, confidential, independent and impartial advice, information and counsel for members of the public. In addition to generalist advice the following specialist advisory services were provided:

- i) Money Adviser
- ii) Money Adviser for Homeless Prevention
- iii) Independent Living Adviser / Specialist Welfare Benefit and Debt provision
- iv) Help to Claim

#### 4. ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

#### Charitable Activities

Ash Citizens Advice Bureau saw a total of 7,018 client contacts dealing with 7,308 issues. The local Citizens Advice assisted in the financial gain for clients (including benefit take up and debt write off of £864,478.

#### **Investment Activities**

The charity does not currently hold material investments.

#### **Factors Affecting the Achievement of Objectives**

There are no factors that are affecting the achievement of these objectives.

#### 5. FINANCIAL REVIEW

#### **Financial Position**

Incoming resources in the year were £ 167,692 (2017/2018 £142,303). Of this £76,945 (2016/2018 £60,981) related to project restricted activities.

A surplus of £1,924 was made in the year (2016/2018, deficit of £1,747. At 31 March 2019 total reserves were £ 112,442 all of which represented unrestricted funds.

#### **Reserves Policy**

Ash Citizens Advice Bureau is required to ensure that free monies are available in each financial year to meet any reasonable foreseeable contingency.

In reviewing the potential costs that could arise should a significant reduction in income be incurred the Trustees have determined that 'free' reserves should be maintained to be at least equal 6 months normal operating expenditure, at the end of each financial year.

#### Principal Funding Sources

The Directors extend their gratitude to Guildford Borough Council who continued to support the core operating capacity of the charity. Additionally project-specific funding was received from the Guildford Voluntary Grants Panel which includes funding from Surrey County Council.

The charity did not have any borrowings from either providers of funding or other sources at the balance sheet date.

#### **Funds in Deficit**

No funds were in deficit at the balance sheet date.

#### 6. FUTURE PLANS

Ash Citizens Advice aims to continually improve access to its service, and intends to extend its service to an even wider number of the community through increased provision of telephone advice and additional outreach locations.

- 7. DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITES Company Law and Charity Law require the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of Ash Citizens Advice and of the surplus or deficit for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the directors are required to:
  - (a) select appropriate accounting policies and then apply them consistently
  - (b) make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
  - (c) state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, and explain where they haven't been followed, and
  - (d) prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The directors are also responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of Citizens Advice Ash and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Acts 1985 to 2006.

The directors are responsible for ensuring that the company maintains an adequate system of internal control designed to provide reasonable assurance that assets are safeguarded against material loss or unauthorised use and to prevent and detect fraud and other irregularities.

In accordance with company law, as the company's directors, we certify that:

- so far as we are aware, there is no relevant audit information of which the company's auditors are unaware; and
- as the directors of the company we have taken all the steps that we ought to have taken in order to make ourselves aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the charity's auditors are aware of that information.

I report on the accounts of the company for the year ended 31 March 2019, which are set out on pages 11 to 20

#### Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The trustees (who are also the directors of the company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The trustees consider that an audit is not required for the year under section 43(2) of the Charities Act 1993 (the 1993 Act) and that an independent examination is needed. The charity's gross income exceeded £250,000 and I am qualified to undertake the examination by being a qualified member of Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales.

Having satisfied myself that the charity is not subject to audit under company law and is eligible for independent examination, is it my responsibility to:

#### Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2019

#### 1. Accounting policies

#### a) Accounting basis

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and are in accordance with the Companies Acts 1985 to 2006, applicable accounting standards and the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice (FRSSE) 2015.

#### b) Incoming resources

#### i) Grants receivable

Grants made to finance the activities of the local Citizens Advice are credited to the income and expenditure account in the period to which they relate.

#### ii) Bank interest

Bank interest is included in the income and expenditure account on receipt.

#### iii) Other income

Sales of services are included in the income and expenditure account in the period to which they relate. Other income, including donations, gifts and covenants are included as they were received.

#### iv) Gifts and Intangible income

In addition to the above, the charity also receives help and support in the form of voluntary assistance in advising the public. This help and support is not included in the financial statements. However, its value to the Charity has been estimated and disclosed in the directors' report.

#### v) Deferred income

Grants received in advance of the period in which the funder requires the expenditure to be applied will be reflected in deferred income within the balance sheet.

### Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2019

#### 1. Accounting policies (continued)

#### c) Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. All expenditure directly related to the provision of advice services is included within charitable expenditure. Other costs incurred have been allocated between fundraising and publicity and management and administration as appropriate. Where such costs relate to more than one functional cost category they have been split on an estimate of time or floor space basis, as appropriate.

#### d) Fixed assets and depreciation

Fixed assets are included at cost. Items are capitalised if it their value is over £500. Depreciation is charged on a straight line basis on the costs of the assets over their estimated useful lives as follows:

Fixtures, fittings and equipment - 3 years
Computers - 3 years

The depreciation policy has been reviewed in accordance with FRS 15 and no change has been made from the previous year.

#### e) Restricted funds

Income received for the restricted purposes is included in a separate restricted fund against which appropriate expenditure is allocated.

#### f) Designated funds

Designated funds are allocated out of unrestricted funds by the trustees for specific purposes. The use of such funds is at the trustees' discretion.

#### g) Pension

The charity did not operate any group personal pension plan for its employees but this changed with the requirements of auto-enrolment – implementation date for Ash CAB November 2016.

#### h) Leases

Rental costs under operating leases are charged to the statement of financial activities in equal amounts over the period of the leases.

### i) Irrecoverable VAT

The local Citizens Advice is unable to recover VAT.

# j) Cash Flow

The local Citizens Advice has taken advantage of the exemptions in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a small company.
