Our summer holiday playscheme children last year took part in the Olympic Torch Relay and celebrated of the torch being in Brent Our dancers also performed at this event in King Edwards Park in Wembley

Dancers have performed at The Olympic Torch Relay event in King Edwards Park, Brent Youth Services BSU showcase 2 Da Stage were guest performers at the celebrating Brent Foster Carers ceremony

Our newest venture is working with a local singer Adora Passos and helping to develop her craft. Through 2 Da Stage management Adora had the opportunity to perform at the Olympic Relay event which celebrated the Olympic Torch being in Brent

Adora also performed for the Mayor and other Brent employees at the Annual Brent Staff awards. Brent Musical Bandstand was a country wide event that celebrated the end of the London 2012 olympics. 2 Da Stage was able to schedule a performance for Adora who was requested to do a second performance on the main stage.

Our senior dance group were crowned UK Unsigned Street Dance Champions and our youth group were finalist in this national competition that has previously been won by major dance groups including Flawless and Diversity

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies have been used consistently in dealing with items, which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), "Accounting and Reporting by Chanties Statement of recommended protice" published in March 2005 and applicable accounting standards. Where appropriate comparative figures have been restated

Tangible Fixed Assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost. Depreciation of tangible fixed assets is provided on a straight line basis applied to original cost at rates estimated to write the assets off over their expected useful lives.

Incoming Resources

Donations and grants receivable are recognised in the period in which they become available to the charity Other income is included in the financial statements on an accruals basis

Allocation of Expenditure

Expenditure has been classified as direct chantable expenditure where substantially all the costs incurred relate to the direct chantable activities of the company

Support costs have been apportioned between direct chantable expenditure and other expenditure on the basis of the amount of staff time estimated to be spent on each activity

Expenditure has been classified as governance costs where the costs incurred relate to direct board costs, consultancy fees, professional fees, Independent review costs and senior management staff costs allocated on estimated time spent on the statutory accounts
