The directors submit their annual report and the financial statements of 2 DA STAGE PERFORMING ARTS & CLUB for the year ended 31 March 2015. This report confirm the financial statements comply with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005) – Accounting and Reporting by Charities as revised in 2005, the Company's governing document and the Charities Act (1993). It reflects the adoption of the new Statement of Recommended Practice Accounting and Reporting by Charities 2005.

Mission/vision

Our mission is to provide a good quality service, ensuring safe and stimulating play opportunities and childcare for working or studying parents/carers, during out of school hours.

Our fun and exciting new combination of performing arts workshops, which gives children & young people a safe place to reatively express themselves, develop skills in theatre, dance, singing and music. 2 Da Stage aims to install self-esteem and confidence in all its members.

The club offers an after school service between 4pm-6pm as well as a holiday playscheme provision during school holidays between 8am-6pm based at Ark Academy in Wembley. Our performing arts classes take place on Saturday afternoons and are based at Bridge Park Complex.

The after school club and holiday playscheme offers a safe and stimulating environment for children to learn through play outside of school hours. Interactive focused activities are planned to strategically develop children's social, physical, emotional, language, intellectual and creative skills. This is achieved through structured and free play, cooking, arts & crafts, sports, music, drama, dance, reading, storytelling, imaginative play and offsite trips.

REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS, ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

2 Da Stage continues to provide a childcare service during term time and school holidays for families in the Brent area primarily, however parents from outside the borough too use the service we run. The organisation continues to provide voluntary training experience for young people who are able to use us as a reference for their CV and to also gain experience of the workplace. Our dance classes are for children and young people aged 7-19 years old. Approximately 150 children are registered with the after school club and holiday playscheme and 50 registered with the performing arts club

After school club/ playscheme

2 Da Stage Performing Arts & Childcare service has a focus of ensuring children gain the necessary development skills needed to become well rounded citizens. These skills are passed over to the children through planned activities and play. All children in our care must take part in activities that develop their social, physical, linguistics, Intellectual, creative and emotional skills. Although children may float from activity to activity, there is a specific learning outcome that playworks strive to achieve in their activities and games with the children.

The service is accessible Monday- Friday until 6pm and during all school holidays excluding Christmas, 8am-6pm. Children regularly go on trips which include cinema, bowling, theme parks, sea side, museums, park, library, zoos, safari parks and more.

Performing Arts

2 Da Stage is our performing arts club. We plan on developing the service by providing singing and drama classes but right now has a strong focus on street dance. It has two main groups, Distractionz (12-19 years old) and Adrenatin (7-11 years old). Both groups train once a week with our experienced dance teachers who have had a successful career in dance.

Our latest partnership is with Roundwood Youth Club who now host our street dance classes. The Community Development Foundation support 2 Da Stage and approved our application for funding in January 2015. This will provide new opportunities for those interested in dance classes to be a part of our company. A new dance teacher has also been appointed as the dance company is growing

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

We will be Launching our new project in the future called Young Ravers UK. Young Ravers UK aims to provide a safe place for young people under the age of 18 to party and socialize and also give back at the same time. A percentage of our proceeds from our parties will be given to charity. Parties will take place in a number of venues across the capital.

We will also be working with a number of local schools this year and form a partnership to ensure more parents and carers have direct access to our services especially during school holidays. A company website will be developed to widen the access to all of our services.

2 Da Stage will work with the Brent Voluntary Sector and approach funders such Edward Harvist Trust and also the Brent Working Ward. Brent Councillors representatives will visit our organisation and provide support for our application to fund our after school club service.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies have been used consistently in dealing with items, which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of recommended practice" published in March 2005 and applicable accounting standards. Where appropriate comparative figures have been restated.

Tangible Fixed Assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost. Depreciation of tangible fixed assets is provided on a straight line basis applied to original cost at rates estimated to write the assets off over their expected useful lives.

Incoming Resources

Donations and grants receivable are recognised in the period in which they become available to the charity. Other income is included in the financial statements on an accruals basis.

Allocation of Expenditure

Expenditure has been classified as direct charitable expenditure where substantially all the costs incurred relate to the direct charitable activities of the company.

Support costs have been apportioned between direct charitable expenditure and other expenditure on the basis of the amount of staff time estimated to be spent on each activity.

Expenditure has been classified as governance costs where the costs incurred relate to direct board costs, consultancy fees, professional fees, Independent review costs and senior management staff costs allocated on estimated time spent on the statutory accounts
