The company provides gymnastics facilities and coaching to children and adults in the surrounding location and has over 1800 members. The facilities are available for use by local schools, universities and by other clubs and are used on a regular basis, almost to capacity.

The club has an active pre-school and parent toddler section serving the needs of the local community, and a very successful recreational program which is so popular that it is now over subscribed. The Board has found additional facilities locally which will enable the club to service the very high level of demand for participation in gymnastics locally. Freestyle classes continue to be popular with the over 12s and young adults and are key to engaging young people in sport. Our adult classes have grown in popularity providing the opportunity to participate for fitness and recreation. Our recreational programme continues to expand and allow opportunities for all to take part in the sport at every level. Through our varied and exciting programme some of our members have had opportunities to represent Great Britain at international events as part of our display team.

All our recreational classes continue to run alongside and in addition to the club's elite gymnastics programme which enables members to compete regionally, nationally and internationally according to their ability and progression.

Many of our older gymnasts are now benefitting from our Young Leader programme which is operated in conjunction with our sport's governing body and encourages members to remain in the sport in another capacity longer term once their gymnastics career is at an end. Our Young Leaders are able to organise events for fund raising and socialising and in doing so acquire a range of skills which will help them in their future life and careers.

Many of our gymnasts also turn to coaching once they are old enough. The club is very happy to support them in their training and development in this area, providing them with bursaries to cover training costs to0gether with mentoring and support with practical coaching skills within the gym. Employment opportunities are also available to these young people both in a coaching and also administrative capacity within the club.

Discounts on membership and training fees are available for families on low incomes. The club employs 11 permanent full time employees and 50 part time employees.

The club carries out a full membership and employee survey each year in advance of its annual general meeting (AGM). The last AGM took place in September 2015 and the next AGM is scheduled for 2 October 2016.

Regular meetings are held with gymnast/parents to discuss development plans, progress and welfare of the gymnasts.

Employees are given the opportunity on a regular basis to contribute to the discussions at Board meetings and are actively encouraged to approach Board members with any concerns or any ideas for development they may have. Senior member of the coaching team attend and play an active role at regular Board meetings.

A monthly newsletter is produced for members.

All members are encouraged to contact the Board regarding concerns in the event that these cannot be dealt with by coaches/employees. A dedicated e-mail address is provided for this purpose. All e-mails received are dealt with promptly by a Board member, after discussion with the full Board if appropriate.

As part of the funding received from Leeds City Council and British Gymnastics it has been a requirement to develop certain areas of the club's provision and to provide feedback to those bodies on progress against set objectives and targets for participation in the sport. Meetings have been held with representatives from these bodies and will continue to be held on a regular basis.
