Started in 2012, A Good Place 2 Start (AGP2S) C.I.C.'s Vision is to see all people experiencing their basic human right to a positive and fulfilling life whilst being safeguarded from abuse. AGP2S achieves this by making it our Mission to provide as much direction, research and sharing of information and best practice around abuse support, resources, training, prevention, protection and prosecution. In the financial year 2014 – 2015 our activities have benefited the community in the following ways:

- The number of people jointly accessing daily support and relevant information has significantly increased.
 - Facebook followers are now a total of 4085.
 - Pinterest followers are now a total of 303.
- AGP2S are now a resident writer in the magazine Feminarum.
- In addition to using the website services, people are independently seeking help via the Facebook private inbox and by email.
- AGP2S are now starting to partner with other organisations and services supporting survivors of abuse, their families, friends and supporters.

The company's stakeholders are mainly Adult Survivors of abuse (male and female) Other stakeholders include family, friends, professionals and general people showing and interest in the area of abuse

For the first time and due to the increased interested people we have had good interaction with individuals and positive responses to posts and information shared

A questionnaire was devised using Survey Monkey to establish how many hidden Adult Survivors there are in the UK. This wasn't very successful and only received 12 responses

AGP2S decided that this was mainly due to the difficulty in sharing information with strangers, the anxiety recalling terrible experiences can cause and building trust and reputation

As a result, AGP2S agreed that whilst the company strongly maintains the non financial elements of the business very well i.e. social media and the website, the company needs to come out of dormancy and identify funds to support better marketing and communication. This in turn will help to build reputation within the safeguarding community amongst the survivors themselves.

The name and logo of 'A Good Place 2 Start '(AGP2S) is starting to become known and now needs to reach a larger audience. A new action plan including a business plan, marketing and communication strategy needs to be devised quickly. The website and social media also requires further development.
