STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The company was incorporated on 25th April 2012 and given charitable status on 27th December 2012. Both entities are governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association.

STATUS

The charity is a Company Limited by Guarantee and does not have share capital. The liability of members is limited. Every member of the company undertakes to contribute to the assets of the company if it is wound up whilst they are members, or within one year of ceasing to be a member, such amounts are limited to £1.00.

ORGANISATION OF THE CHARITY

All the directors of the Company are also Trustees of the charity. The day to day management is carried out by the Managing Director. The trustees provide regular support for the managing director.

DIRECTORS/TRUSTEES

There were no changes to the constitution of the board of trustees (or directors) during the year. The trustees are aware of their responsibilities and their responsibilities to any new trustee.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The main objective of Disability Sports Coach is to:

- · maximise access and provision of disabled sports across the UK
- · raise awareness of the sporting opportunities for people with disabilities
- raise awareness of the sporting possibilities for the disabled amongst the able bodied community.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Disability Sports Coach worked with over 12,000 disabled people and 100 organisations during the year, providing, support, coaching and training for a wide variety of disabilities. Activities and Sports include Adapted and Paralympic Sports.

Through the investment from Sport England we have established 11 Community Clubs in 11 London boroughs to provide access to structured sports and physical activity sessions. Each club operates for two hours for each of 36 weeks enabling people with disabilities, their family and friends to participate in and learn more about Paralympic and adapted sport.

In the Community Club program we have engaged over 4,500 disabled people across the 11 Community Clubs boroughs, both within our clubs and our outreach program and have provided 20 competitions for the clubs participants and new participants to attend and enjoy over 20 different sports, to which they would not normally have access. We have worked with over 50 different partners over the past year including National Governing Bodies (NGB's), Disabled People's Organisations (DPOs), Local Authorities, schools and local clubs to allow the club participants to have more access to mainstream activities within their local area.

One of the major achievements within this program is that 83% of the regular participants at the clubs did not take part in any form of sport or physical activity before joining the program. We have also trained up over 60 coaches (20% of whom have an impairment) through the program, who are now coaching in the clubs. Alongside the coaches, we have a

volunteer workforce of over 30, and they have been trained and are now supporting the program with the coaches to deliver a high quality experience for all.

One of our volunteers, Graham Dobson, started as a participant over a year ago. He is now volunteering in 7 of our Community Clubs and is about to take his Football Level 1 coaching award, with this he will be able to receive paid work. He is also staring in our promotional video for the Community Club program, which you can find through Disability Sports Coach website — www.disabilitysportscoach.co.uk.

Disability Sports Coach runs specific schools programs throughout the year to link in with the curriculum.

Disability Sports Coach runs Accredited Leaders courses across the country:

The Adapted Sports Course provides practical experience in a wide range of sports specifically designed for disabled people, giving tips and drills for including disabled people in all activities, during the 2014-15 year, we ran 17 courses, up skilling 340 delegates.

The Disability Awareness Course has an immediate practical application in schools and clubs with delegates being introduced to all the disability groups, learning how to integrate each group member into mainstream sport and physical activity. Through the last year we have delivered 30 block-booking courses and 10 public course to over 1,000 teachers, coaches and leaders, helping them to support disabled people wanting to make their sessions more inclusive.

2014 – 2015 was the second full year of operation for Disability Sports Coach, and the Trustees were pleased with the achievements with aim to increase the number of participants in all programs in the coming year and years.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

General

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2011 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005).

Funds

Unrestricted funds are available to use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance if the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The nature and purpose of each restricted fund is set out in the notes.

Incoming Resources

Incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income.

Grants and income restricted by the terms of the grantor are shown under restricted funds.

Other receipts, donations and event income are included on an accruals basis. Income received for the general purposes of the charity are included as unrestricted funds.

No amounts are included in the financial statements for services donated by volunteers.

Resources Expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services, including those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Allocation of Resources Used

Resources used are allocated to direct expenditure and management and administration on a specific basis.
