Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 May 2020

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Curiosity Creative CIC is a private company, limited by guarantee, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" including the provisions of Section 1A "Small Entities" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes.

Income from fees is recognised in the accounts when invoiced unless it relates to future accounting periods, in which case it is deferred and included in creditors.

Grants receivable are credited to incoming resources on the earlier date of when they are received or when they are receivable, unless they relate specifically to a future accounting period, in which case they are deferred.

Where a grant is received relating to a future accounting period, the profit and loss account shows the gross amount together with the changes in the amount deferred to future accounting periods. Deferred grant income at the year end is included in creditors.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Computer equipment - 25% on cost

Taxation

Taxation for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in the Income Statement, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity.

Current or deferred taxation assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Current tax is recognised at the amount of tax payable using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to surplus or deficit on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the company's pension scheme are charged to profit or loss in the period to which they relate.

Between May and July 2019 we completed delivery of our Heritage Funded project *Meet me at the Oxford* which focused on capturing stories of a former dancehall site in Newcastle city centre. The project directly engaged over 75 people in memory workshops, training and research sessions and one to one interviews and collected over 50 memories and stories about the former Oxford Galleries site. As part of a workshop programme with our groups we had the support from Newcastle City Libraries Local Studies collection who facilitated a visit to Local Studies for a group of participants from SEARCH and Manisty House based in Benwell as part of the research stage of our project. We also worked with Chain Reaction as part of the project. Chain Reaction provides support for older people to live independently in the community and to lead happier, healthier lives. Through the delivery of different services and groups it supports and sustains friendships in order to combat social isolation and to increase a sense of good emotional health and wellbeing. We also engaged with eight care homes across Newcastle and North Tyneside as part of this project.

Our commissioned work this year included working with the charity The Churches Conservation Trust to engage local communities in Sunderland to tell the story of Old Sunderland and Holy Trinity Church in the East End of Sunderland through their restoration project of this 300 year old church. This work was ongoing throughout 2019 and 2020.

We were also commissioned by Newcastle University to work with groups of older people on a project on the theme of "Joy". The aim of the project was explore and celebrate the role of older women in society who are often less visible in popular culture and public spaces than men. We supported the project by facilitating workshops to enable women to talk openly in a safe and supportive environment which then led to the production of a photography and film exhibition in the new National Innovation Centre for Ageing at Newcastle University.

In April 2020 we were awarded a grant from the Newcastle Cultural Investment Fund at the Community Foundation to deliver a new community project called The Geordie Guide to Happiness. The aim of the project is to focus on happiness, encouraging participants to reflect and think about what brings them joy, to encourage positive wellbeing and mental health. The project will include the delivery of community happiness workshops and a weekly podcast. More details of this project will be provided in the next CIC 34 as project delivery will commence in our next financial year.

We worked in partnership with a number of third sector and cultural/heritage organisations this year to deliver projects with our participants. This included Newcastle University, Sunderland City Council, SEARCH, Chain Reaction, Manisty House, Newcastle City Library, Remembering the Past, Bridging the Gap, and the Churches Conservation Trust. We consult with these groups at the planning stage and throughout the project to ensure activities are delivered in the right way with participants.

Funders included the National Lottery Heritage Fund and the Newcastle Cultural Investment Fund at The Community Foundation. Our funders were consulted through regular funders reports on how their funding had been spent.

The Digital Storytelling process itself is a participant led process where participants have complete control over the content of their digital story. Therefore all our participants are consulted throughout workshops to ensure they are enabled to create digital stories they are happy with and proud of.
