1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The company's balance sheet at the year end shows net liabilities. This position is due to amounts owed to its parent company (£556K). The parent company has agreed not to seek repayment of the amounts they are owed unless the company has sufficient funds to do so. The company will meet its liabilities as they fall due with the support of its parent company. On this basis the directors have prepared the financial statements on the going concern basis.

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

Related party exemption

The company has taken advantage of exemption, under the terms of Financial Reporting Standard 8 Related Party Disclosures, not to disclose related party transactions with wholly owned subsidiaries within the group.

Turnover

Turnover represents net invoiced sales of goods, excluding value added tax.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Stock is valued on a first in first out basis.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.
