INTRODUCTION

I write further to my appointment as Liquidator of the Company on 18 October 2018. The purpose of this report is to detail my progress in dealing with the liquidation during the period since that meeting.

The main causes of failure cited by the Company director were insufficient income to cover the overheads together with a change in the director's personal circumstances which caused stress and anxiety and affected his ability to work.

LIQUIDATOR'S ACTIONS SINCE APPOINTMENT

There is certain work that I am required by the insolvency legislation to undertake in connection with the liquidation that provides no financial benefit for the creditors. A description of the routine work undertaken since my appointment as Liquidator is contained in Appendix 1.

This is in addition to the case-specific work carried out with regard to asset realisations, creditor claims and investigations, details of which are given below.

RECEIPTS AND PAYMENTS ACCOUNT

My Receipts & Payments Account for the period from 18 October 2018 to 17 October 2019 is attached to this report in Appendix 2.

The balance of funds are held in an interest bearing estate bank account.

ASSET REALISATIONS

Director's Loan Account

The director was found to have an outstanding loan account at the date of liquidation. Following investigations into his personal financial circumstances, a settlement of £4,000.00 was agreed in this regard. Payment was received in monthly instalments of £500 per month for 8 months from February to September 2019 and has now been received in full by the Liquidator.

Deposit for Costs

The sum of £2,500.00 was received from the director as a contribution to the Liquidator's costs in this matter.

Bank Interest

An amount of bank interest was also received on funds deposited.

There are no other assets to be realised by the Liquidator.

LIABILITIES

Secured Creditors

An examination of the Company's mortgage register held by the Registrar of Companies showed that the Company has no current charges over its assets.

The legislation requires that if the Company has created a floating charge after 15 September 2003, a prescribed part of the Company's net property (i.e. the money that would otherwise be available to the charge holder) should be ring-fenced for distribution to unsecured creditors. In this case there were no creditors secured by a floating charge such that the prescribed part provisions do not apply.

Preferential Creditors

The statement of affairs anticipated £nil in preferential creditors. No preferential creditor claims have been received by the Liquidator for accrued employee holiday pay or arrears of wages.

Crown Creditors

The statement of affairs included £14,255.00 owed to HMRC. HMRC's final claim of £17,889.60 has been received.

Non-Preferential Unsecured Creditors

The statement of affairs included 3 non-preferential unsecured creditors with an estimated total liability of £9,050.00. I have received claims from 2 creditors at a total of £2,745.92. I have not received claims from 2 creditors with original estimated claims in the statement of affairs of £6,550.00.

DIVIDEND PROSPECTS

A dividend will not be declared to non-preferential unsecured creditors as the funds realised have been used to make payments to meet the expenses of the Liquidation.

INVESTIGATION INTO THE AFFAIRS OF THE COMPANY

I undertook an initial investigation into the Company's affairs to establish whether there were any potential asset recoveries or conduct matters that justified further investigation, taking account of the public interest, potential recoveries, the funds likely to be available to fund an investigation and the costs involved. Specifically, I recovered, listed and reviewed the Company's accounting records, obtained and reviewed copy bank statements for the six months prior to the Company ceasing to trade and compared the information in the Company's last set of accounts with that contained in the Statement of Affairs lodged in the liquidation and made enquiries about the reasons for the changes.

Within three months of my appointment as Liquidator, I am required to submit a confidential report to the Secretary of State to include any matters which have come to my attention during the course of my work which may indicate that the conduct of any past or present Director would make them unfit to be concerned with the management of the Company. I would confirm that my report has been submitted.

LIQUIDATOR'S REMUNERATION

At the meeting of creditors' held on 18 October 2018, the creditors agreed that my remuneration would be fixed by reference to the time properly spent by myself acting as Liquidator of the Company and my staff in attending to matters arising in the Liquidation, and that I may withdraw my fees as and when funds were available.

My time costs for the period covered by this report total £7,512.20, which represents 31.17 hours at an average hourly rate of £241.04. To date remuneration of £188.84 has been drawn against these time costs.

My time costs are further analysed at Appendix 3 by reference to the grade of staff involved with the case and the tasks in which they have been involved. I have drawn £5,000.00 in respect of Findlay James fees for assisting the directors with the formalities associated with placing the Company into Creditors' Voluntary Liquidation, including the convening of the meetings of members and creditors.

LIQUIDATOR'S EXPENSES

I have incurred total expenses in the Liquidation of £229.52. I have drawn £229.52 to date.

FURTHER INFORMATION

An unsecured creditor may, with the permission of the Court or with the concurrence of 5% in value of the unsecured creditors (including the creditor in question) request further details of the Liquidator's remuneration and expenses, within 21 days of receipt of this final account. Any secured creditor may request the same details in the same time limit.

An unsecured creditor may, with the permission of the Court or with the concurrence of 10% in value of the unsecured creditors (including the creditor in question) apply to Court to challenge the amount and / or basis of the Liquidator's fees and / or the amount of the expenses incurred, within 8 weeks of receipt of this final account. Any secured creditor may make a similar application to Court within the same time limit.

SUMMARY

The winding up of the Company is now for all practical purposes complete. The case will be passed to closing within the next few months.
